### **Green Street Projects**

# Low Impact Development (LID) Projects

Distributed, smaller scale interventions that infiltrate, harvest and use, or treat runoff on a parcel level such as rainwater cisterns, rain gardens, permeable pavement, and infiltration BMPs like dry wells.




