EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION FOR OUTSTANDING JOB PERFORMANCE**

SUBJECT: Employee Recognition for Outstanding Job Performance - **Katlyn Stulp**

BACKGROUND

From June 1, 2025 – June 22, 2026, Katlyn has been assigned 260 criminal investigations. She was recently selected as the Investigations Section Senior Lead Detective and has been the backbone of the Investigations Section. She constantly takes time out of her day to help her peers, while remaining diligent with her own investigations.

Please see several noteworthy cases handled by Detective Stulp listed below:

- On June 24, 2025, CCPD officers responded to a radio call of shots fired in the residential area adjacent to Culver City High School. Det. Stulp was assigned the case, and quickly identified the sole shooter as a male Adult who was arrested the day after the shooting. Criminal charges of Attempted Murder (PC 664/187) were filed on the suspect by the DA's office (25-3223).
- On July 2, 2025, CCPD officers responded to a gang related robbery that just occurred outside the Westfield Mall, where the victim had a necklace stolen. Det. Stulp was assigned the case and gathered crucial evidence, which lead to the identification and apprehension of the involved suspect just six days following the robbery. Criminal charges of Robbery (PC 211) were filed on the suspect by the DA's office (25-3880).
- On August 4, 2025, CCPD officers responded to a radio call of shots fired, where a woman was shot in the area of Washington Blvd and Sepulveda Blvd. Det. Stulp identified the driver of the suspect vehicle, who was arrested less than 48 hours following the shooting. A week later, after days of surveillance, Investigators arrested the shooter. Criminal charges (PC 664/187, PC 245, and PC 662/211) were filed on both suspects by the DA's office (25-3498).
- On October 4, 2025, CCPD officers responded to a carjacking in the 4000 block of Centinela Ave. The victim was approached by two suspects, and struck in the stomach with a tire iron, before having his vehicle stolen by the involved suspects. Det. Stulp identified the involved suspect, who was arrested by another police agency just four days following the carjacking. The second suspect was identified and arrested a few weeks later, and criminal charges (PC 215) were filed on both involved suspects by the DA's office (25-5076).
- On December 3, 2025, a first degree robbery occurred at a motel in the 13400 block of Washington Blvd, which involved two suspect vehicles, and six total suspects, two armed with handguns. Det. Stulp identified an involved suspect vehicle, and a week after the robbery, a suspect was arrested. Det. Stulp was able to gather valuable evidence, which lead to criminal charges (PC 211) being filed on the suspect by the DA's office (25-6111).

- On February 13, 2026, CCPD officers responded to multiple radio calls of shots fired at the Westfield Mall. Officers discovered one male Adult who was deceased, with multiple shell casings in the mall parking lot, indicating multiple shooters were involved in the incident. Det. Stulp was assigned the case, and spent dozens of hours recovering video evidence, gathering witness statements, and examining digital evidence. Two suspects were quickly identified and arrested. Criminal charges were filed on the suspects involved for Homicide (PC 187) and Conspiracy to Commit Robbery (PC 182/PC 211) (26-0763).
- On April 18, 2026, a male suspect threatened to shoot up the Westfield Mall, in response to his friend's death which occurred in February 2026. Det. Stulp was assigned the case and quickly identified the involved suspect, a documented criminal street gang member with violent arrest history. Det. Stulp obtained an arrest warrant for Flowers, and with the assistance of LASD personnel, the suspect was arrested less than two weeks after the initial crime. Criminal charges were filed on the suspect for PC 422 (Criminal Threats) by the DA's office (26-1969).
- On June 17, 2026, CCPD Officers responded to several radio calls of a suspect striking multiple pedestrians at various locations in Culver City. CCPD Patrol officers were able to locate the involved suspect and suspect vehicle, which was involved in a lengthy vehicle pursuit where the driver collided into or attempted to collide into multiple pedestrians. The driver was apprehended following the pursuit, and Det. Stulp was assigned this complex investigation. Det. Stulp conducted multiple witness interviews, secured several search warrants, and was able to file multiple criminal charges (ten counts of attempted murder) on the involved suspect (26-3066).

AUTHORITY

According to Civil Service Rule 15.2 and 15.3, employees exemplifying outstanding job performance criteria may be recognized for their performance through the Outstanding Job Performance Recognition program. The program allows for single awards or a combination of any of the outlined recognition awards.

RECOMMENDATION TO APPROVE

That the City Manager approve the Outstanding Job Performance Recognition award pursuant to Civil Service Rule 15.4 for Katlyn Stulp, Police Detective, to receive an award of three (3) working days off with pay and a cash award of \$500.00.
