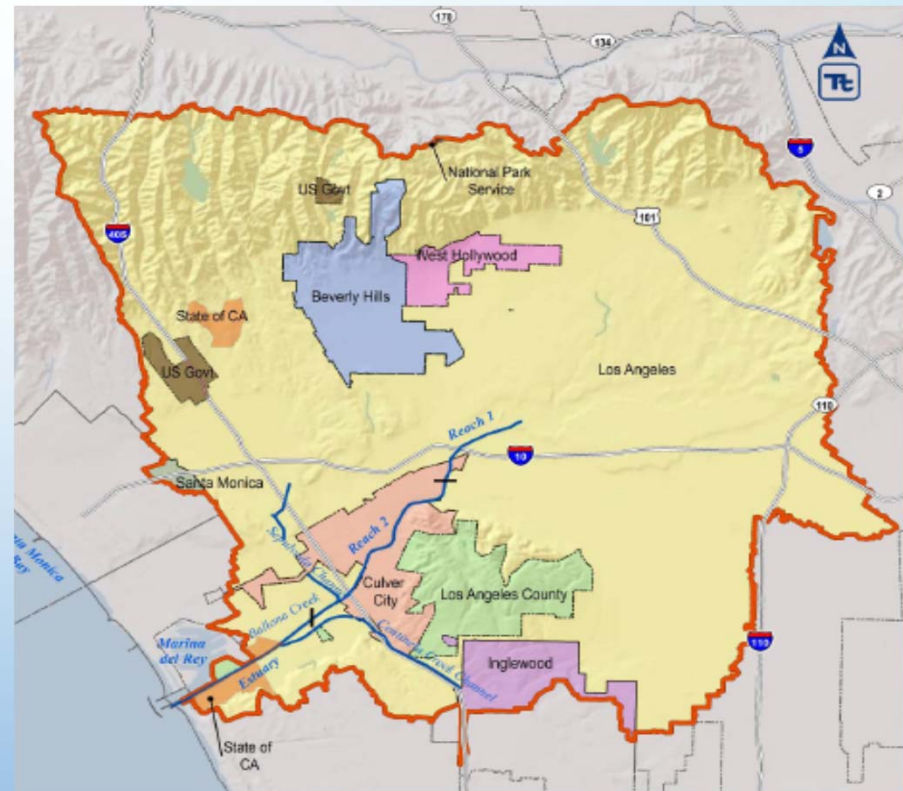
BACKGROUND

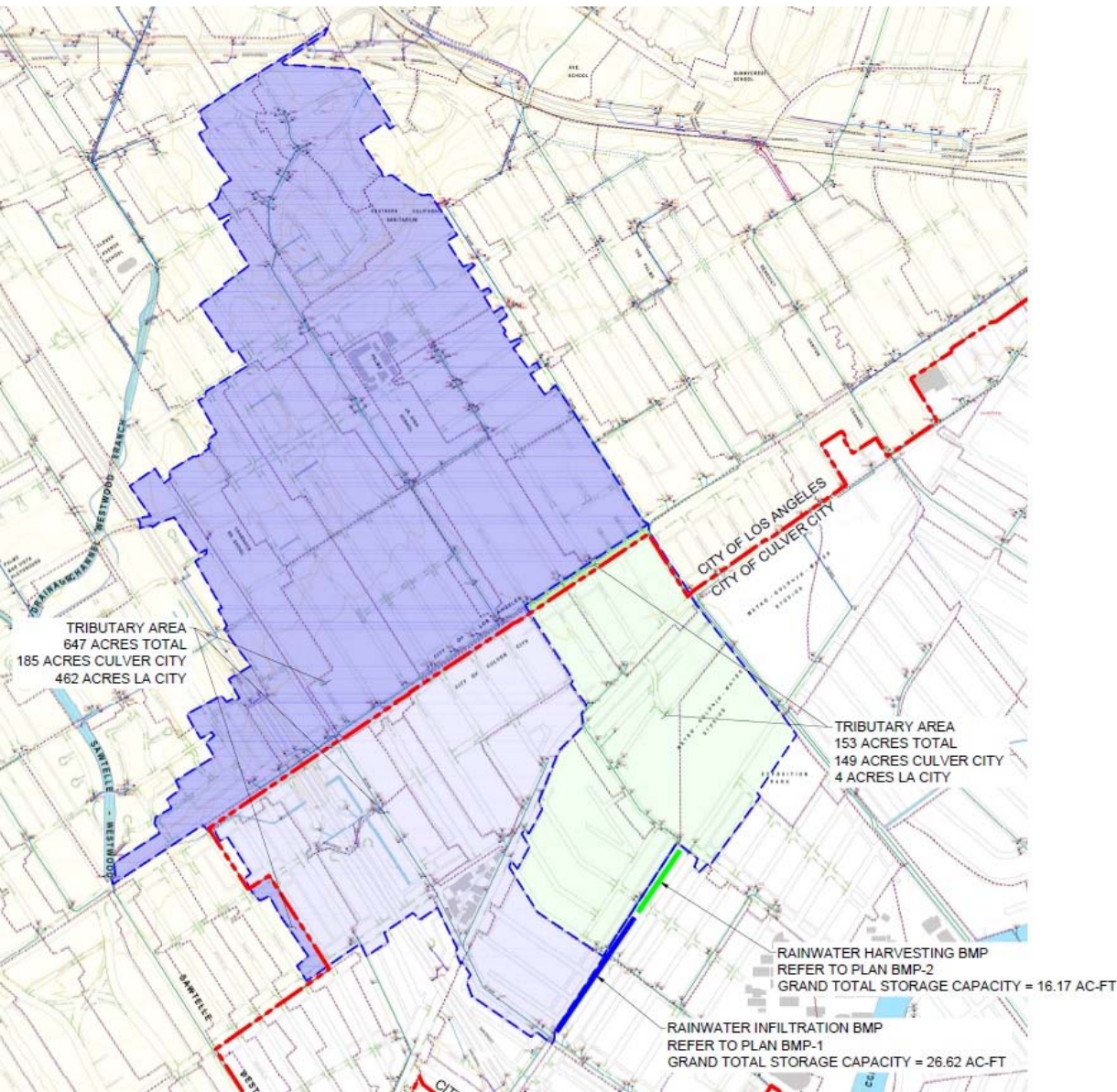
- NOVEMBER, 2012
 - NPDES PERMIT ORDER R4-2012-0175 (MS4 PERMIT) WAS ADOPTED BY THE L.A. REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD
 - TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOAD (TMDL) COMPLIANCE
 - COMPLIANCE OPTIONS: MINIMUM CONTROL MEASURES, WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (WMP), OR **ENHANCED WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (EWMP)**
- APRIL, 2016
 - BALLONA CREEK ENHANCED WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PLAN
 - APPROVED BY REGIONAL BOARD

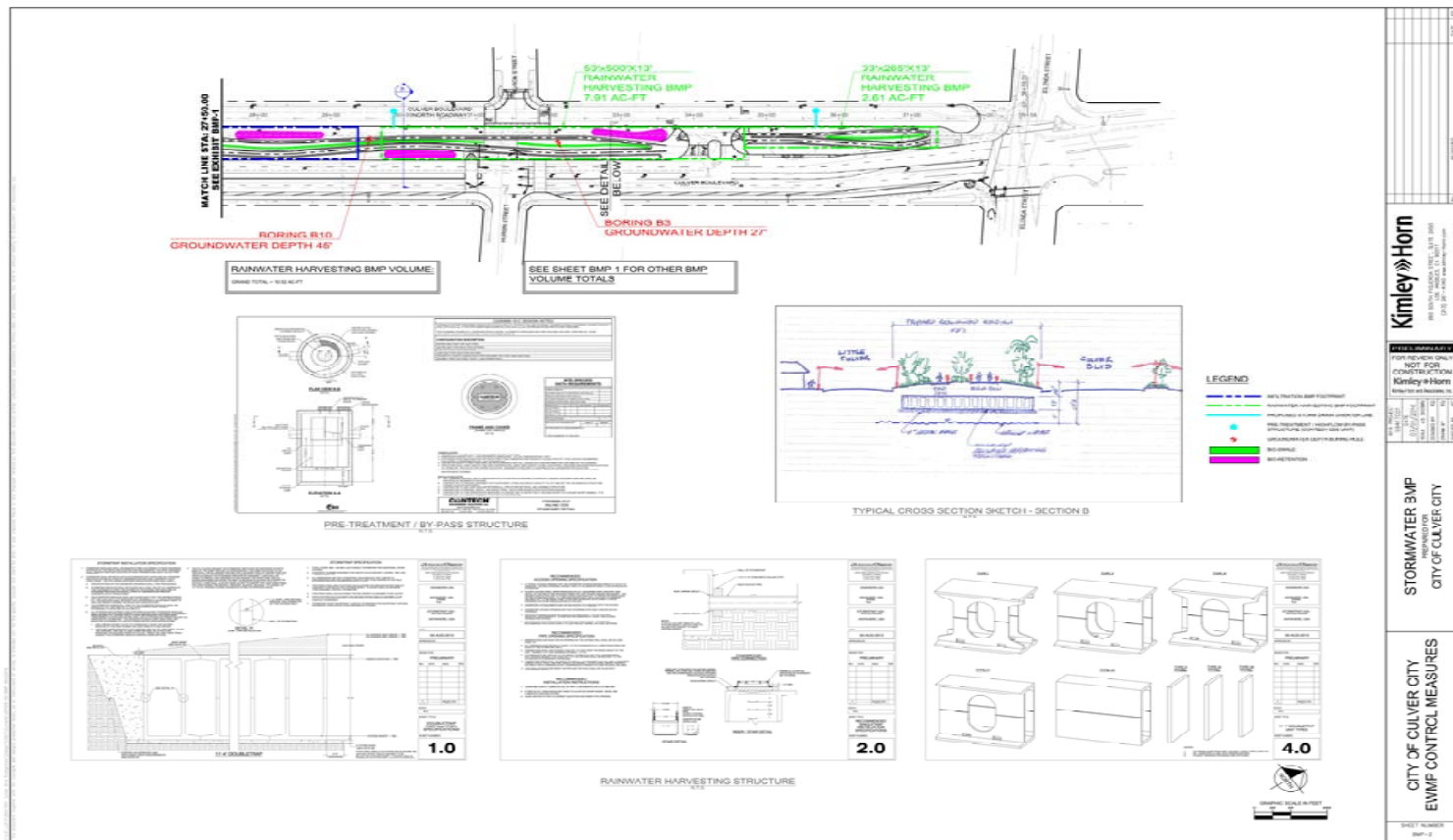

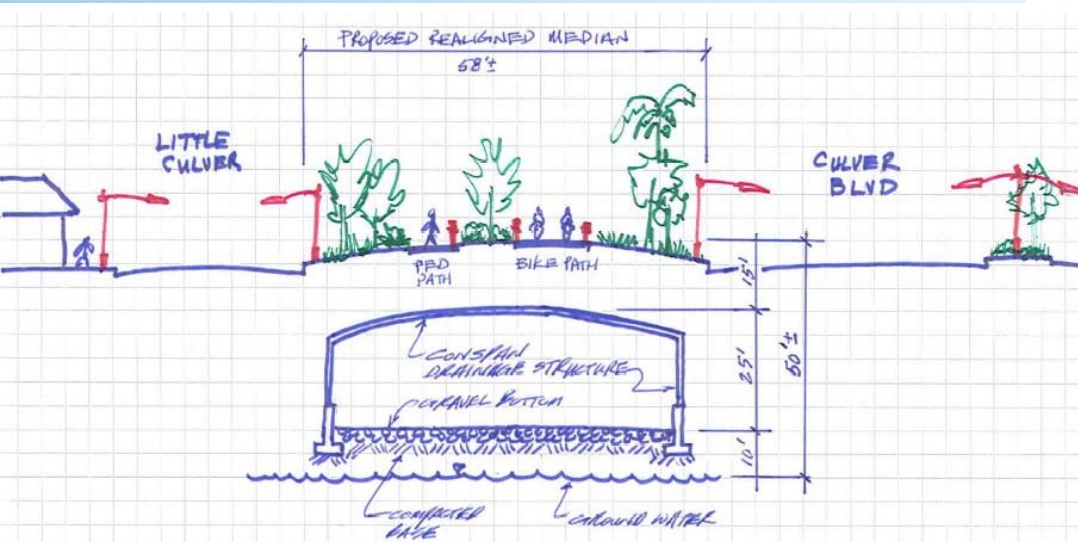
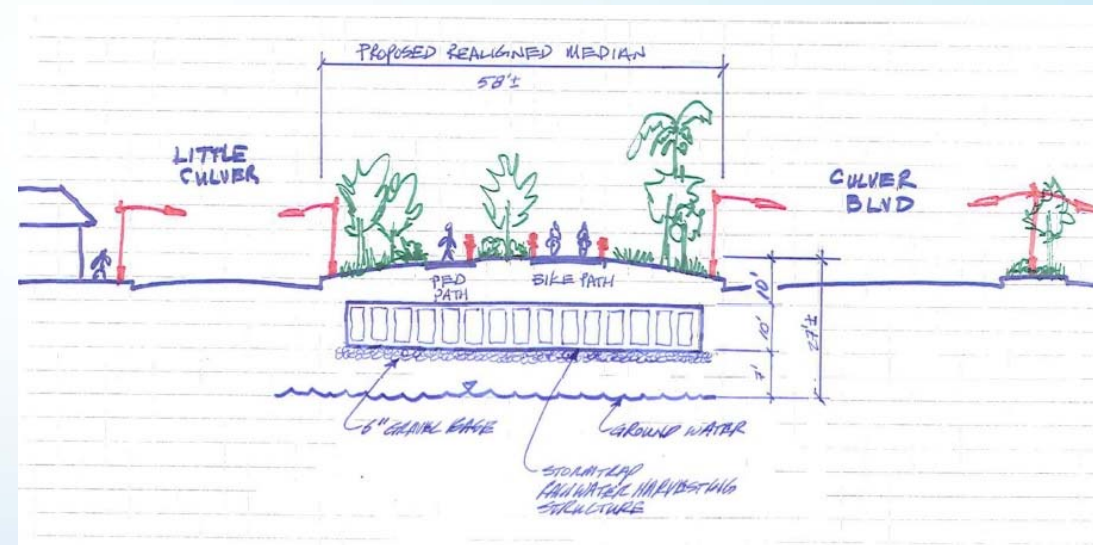
