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## RESOLUTION NO. 2023-R

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY, CALIFORNIA, **INCORPORATING** SEPULVEDA BOULEVARD FROM VENICE BOULEVARD TO THE SOUTHERLY CITY BOUNDARY NEAR FRANKLIN AVENUE PROJECT INTO THE LIST OF CITY PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 TO BE FUNDED BY SB 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 in order to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of the City of Culver City are aware of the projects proposed for funding in the Culver City community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City Council must approve by resolution a list of all projects proposed to receive funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, the City will receive an estimated \$999,958 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2023-2024 from SB 1; and

WHEREAS, the City used a Pavement Management System or Los Angeles County Bridge Inspection report to develop the SB 1 project list; and

WHEREAS, the funding from SB 1 will help the City maintain and rehabilitate 111 centerline miles of streets, seven bridges, and add active transportation infrastructure throughout the City; and

1	WHEREAS, the 2021 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs
2	Assessment found that the City's streets and roads are in an "at risk" condition and this
3	revenue will help the City increase the overall quality of its road system and over the next
4	decade will bring City streets and roads into a "good" condition; and
5	WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in the City's local
6	streets and roads infrastructure, with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in
7	complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices,
8	will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.
10	NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City, California,
11	DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, as follows:
12	The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
13	2. The City Council hereby approves the following list of projects planned
14	to be funded with Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:
15	Sepulveda Boulevard from Venice Boulevard to the Southerly City
16	<b>Boundary Near Franklin Avenue, Project</b> : This project involves the replacement of 2 – 3 inches of asphalt and reconstruction of areas of
17	failed asphalt, and related traffic and mobility improvements. The proposed schedule for construction is 2024 to 2025 and the estimated
18	useful life of the improvement will be 20 years. This Fiscal Year 2023-2024 allocation of SB1 funds is in addition to the previous Fiscal Year
19	2022-2023 allocation of \$881,447 SB1 funds for Sepulveda Boulevard.
