Discussion ensued between staff and Commissioners regarding appreciation for the presentation; different support groups available; support groups for seniors

taking highly addictive pain medication; weekly case management meetings for seniors; formation of support groups; tracking grants awarded by the county; scope of work and agreements; outreach for Disability Awareness Month activities; serving people from other areas; partnerships; the Special Olympics; funding; sponsorships; coordination with the School District; Therapeutic Recreation Specialists; training; and Mr. Adams agreed to email flyers to Commissioners for the Abilities Carnival and Resource Fair.

Corey Lakin, Parks, Recreation and Community Services Director, provided a report on the 2018 Fiesta La Ballona; discussed the Fiesta La Ballona Committee; planning; City departments involved in the event; entertainment; sponsorship; vendors; attractions; estimated attendance; partnerships; the goal for a zero waste event; volunteers; and he presented photos from the event.

Discussion ensued between staff and Commissioners regarding Fiesta La Ballona as an opportunity to find out about community organizations; the expense involved for local city stores to participate; the Health Department; the need to expand the Beer and Wine Garden; altering the layout; feedback from attendees on resource tables; space limitations; resource tables on a first come, first served basis; allowing equal representation; new rides; and agreement by staff to provide financial information on the event when it becomes available.

Commissioner Rickards discussed information provided by Carolyn Wilkins regarding the Culver City Interfaith Alliance; reduced activities due to not receiving a grant; activities taking place on November 13 in the Rotunda Room; organizations working with the Alliance; presentations; format of the Conversation; the facilitator; intervention; connecting youth to resources in the community; and he indicated that he would have a flyer with updated information available.

Discussion ensued between staff and Commissioners regarding the title of the event; the flyer to be distributed; inclusion of parents in the event; outreach; the Senior Center; coordination with the School District; the PTA; ensuring that flyers are in English and Spanish; whether to record the event; breakout sessions; and copyright issues associated with private speakers.
