- Analyze how these policies have shaped the City's current landscape and the experience of its residents








What topics will it include?

- Inform next steps to address equity in the City through policymaking and local land use practices







 - Culver City During and After World War II (1940-1980)
 - Confronting the Past: Culver City in the Modern Era (1981-present)
- Documented examples of both public- and private-sector discrimination associated with each period

Next Steps

- Continue to receive and review public input (through September)
- Continue to conduct stakeholder outreach as needed (ongoing)
- Revise the draft to incorporate feedback and information gleaned from ongoing research and outreach
