- 1 WHICH WAS HELD FOR DISCUSSION AND ITEM 7, COUNTY CODE CHARTER
- 2 AMENDMENT WHICH WAS HELD BY SUPERVISOR MITCHELL. FOR MEMBERS
- 3 OF THE PUBLIC ON THE TELEPHONE, PLEASE PRESS 1 THEN 0 NOW TO
- 4 COMMENT ON THESE ITEMS. I'LL FIRST TURN IT TO SUPERVISOR
- 5 MITCHELL.

- 7 SUP. HOLLY J. MITCHELL: THANK YOU VERY MUCH, MADAM CHAIR. YOU
- 8 HELD 6 AND 7 TOGETHER. OKAY, SO 7, I UNDERSTAND, JUST IS
- 9 PROCEDURE. IT IS WHAT WE HAD TO DO, WHAT YOU HAD TO DO. THANK
- 10 YOU VERY MUCH. I JUST WANTED TO JUST MAKE A FEW ADDITIONAL
- 11 COMMENTS. WE'VE HAD LOTS OF CONVERSATION ON THE ISSUE OF THE
- 12 ORDINANCE, AS YOU SAID EARLIER TODAY, WE JUST HAVE TO AGREE TO
- 13 DISAGREE ON THE CONTENTS. BUT I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT, AGAIN,
- 14 FOR ME TO ELEVATE CONCERNS FROM COMMUNITY GROUPS. THERE WAS A,
- 15 WHAT DO THEY CALL IT, IN SACRAMENTO WE WOULD CALL IT A NASCAR
- 16 LETTER WHERE ALL THE DIFFERENT ORGANIZATIONS' LOGOS ARE ON THE
- 17 LETTER, A NUMBER OF COMMUNITY GROUPS, AND THEIR CONCERNS
- 18 CENTER ON PROCESS, THAT THERE'S NOT BEEN A CO-CREATED SOLUTION
- 19 IN MEANINGFUL COLLABORATION WITH COMMUNITY, AND 2, THE ELECTED
- 20 CEO, THERE'S CONCERN THAT THIS ACTUALLY CONSOLIDATES POWER AND
- 21 DIMINISHES THE VOICES OF THE ELECTED SUPERVISORS TO SERVE
- 22 MARGINALIZED COMMUNITIES MOST EFFECTIVELY. I JUST WANTED TO
- 23 MAKE SURE THAT ALL THE MEMBERS GOT THIS LETTER, I THINK IT
- 24 CAME IN RATHER LATE, AND I KNOW THERE'S BEEN LOTS OF
- 25 CONVERSATION AND ASSUMPTIONS, AND LET ME SAY FOR THE RECORD



- 1 PUBLICLY, I DID NOT SOLICIT THESE ORGANIZATIONS. THESE ARE
- 2 ORGANIZATIONS WHO WORK IN THIS AREA AND HAVE THE CAPACITY TO
- 3 READ LANGUAGE AND FORM THEIR OWN OPINION, AND THEY DID SO AND
- 4 WROTE THE LETTER DATED JULY 30TH, AND I JUST THOUGHT IT WAS
- 5 IMPORTANT TO ELEVATE IT AND BRING THEIR CONCERNS TO EVERYONE'S
- 6 ATTENTION. AGAIN, FROM MY PERSPECTIVE, AS I WILL RESTATE, YOU
- 7 KNOW, IT WAS MY CONCERNS WERE FIRST ELEVATED AS QUESTIONS, AND
- 8 IN THE ABSENT OF SOME CLEAR CONCRETE ANSWERS, MY CONCERN
- 9 REMAINS, AND IT ALSO GOES BACK TO PROCESS. I AM CLEAR THAT
- 10 UNLIKE THE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MODEL THAT THIS BOARD AND
- 11 PREVIOUS BOARDS HAVE USED IN THE PAST TO DO MEANINGFUL POLICY
- 12 CHANGE, THAT WAS NOT USED IN THIS CASE. AND I THINK ALMOST
- 13 SIMILAR TO THE CONVERSATION WE HAD EARLIER TODAY ABOUT SB43 IN
- 14 TERMS OF THE NOTE OF GOING FAST, NOT BEING REAL CLEAR, AT
- 15 LEAST PUBLICLY IN TERMS OF RESOURCES IT WILL TAKE TO DO THIS
- 16 REALLY COMPREHENSIVE WORK. I APPRECIATE THE FACT THAT THE
- 17 ORDINANCE SAYS THAT THERE WILL BE NO ADDITIONAL TAXES, BUT I
- 18 CONTINUE TO STRUGGLE WITH THIS NOTION THAT IT WON'T RESULT IN
- 19 COSTS, EVEN INDIRECTLY, TO OUR CONSTITUENTS. IF WE'RE NOT
- 20 RAISING NEW REVENUES TO FUND THE INCREASED BOARD FRAMEWORK AND
- 21 INTEND TO ABSORB THE COSTS WITHIN EXISTING RESOURCES, I DON'T
- 22 SEE HOW WE DO THAT, GIVEN THE BREADTH AND SPAN OF THE REFORMS
- 23 PROPOSED AND NOT HAVE IT HIT OUR NET COUNTY COSTS AND PERHAPS
- 24 SHIFT EXISTING PRIORITIES TO FUND THIS WORK. THAT IS IN AND OF
- 25 ITSELF A COST. AND IT'S LIKELY TO REDUCE THE LEVEL OF SERVICES



- 1 WE PROVIDE SOMEWHERE ACROSS THE SPAN OF WHAT NCC ACTUALLY
- 2 FUNDS BECAUSE WE'LL BE REDIRECTING REALLY PRECIOUS DOLLARS. I
- 3 THINK THAT'S IMPORTANT. THE TAKEAWAY FROM THIS PROCESS, I
- 4 THINK, AND IT'S IMPORTANT, AND I'M GOING TO LOOK TOO, I THINK
- 5 GOING THROUGH THIS PROCESS, WE WERE ABLE TO CLARIFY BROWN ACT
- 6 FOR ALL OF US. WHEN AND HOW STAFF CAN ENGAGE ON A STAFF TO
- 7 STAFF LEVEL, I THINK THAT WAS IMPORTANT TO CLARIFY. I THINK
- 8 THAT IT WAS CLARIFIED FOR SOME THAT WE CAN UNDER BROWN ACT
- 9 HAVE A COMMITTEE STRUCTURE AND POLICY CAN BE VETTED THERE. AND
- 10 I THINK AGAIN BASED ON OUR CONVERSATION EARLIER TODAY, THAT
- 11 MIGHT BE SOMETHING WE WANNA CONSIDER AS A BOARD BECAUSE WE CAN
- 12 DO THAT WITHIN OUR EXISTING AUTHORITY, BECAUSE THERE ARE SOME
- 13 MEANINGFUL POLICY ISSUES THAT CAN'T AFFORD TO WAIT FOR IF THIS
- 14 WERE TO PASS BASED ON NOVEMBER BY THE VOTERS. THERE ARE SOME
- 15 ISSUES THAT WE CAN TACKLE NOW, SOME PROCESSES THAT WE CAN
- 16 TACKLE NOW BECAUSE THEY ARE ISSUES THAT REALLY SHOULD NOT HAVE
- 17 TO WAIT. I WANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE AND THANK ALL OF THOSE,
- 18 PARTICULARLY THOSE ORGANIZATIONS LIKE CONTRACT CITIES WHO WERE
- 19 HERE EARLIER, WHO ENGAGED WITH US OVER A YEAR AGO ON THIS
- 20 ISSUE. EVEN WHEN IT WASN'T A PARTICULAR POPULAR ISSUE FOR SOME
- 21 ON THE BOARD TO DO SO. I WANNA THANK THOSE ORGANIZATIONS THAT
- 22 PAID ATTENTION. GOVERNANCE ISN'T A PARTICULAR SEXY ISSUE, BUT
- 23 THERE WERE ORGANIZATIONS WHO STEPPED UP, UNDERSTOOD THE
- 24 MEANINGFUL RAMIFICATIONS OF IMPROVING OUR PROCESSES AS A BODY,
- 25 AND I WANNA THANK THEM. I'D LIKE TO REITERATE, WE'VE TALKED



- 1 ABOUT REPORT BACKS AND MOTIONS EARLIER TODAY, THAT I'M NOT
- 2 BRINGING FORWARD A MOTION, BUT I AM ASKING THAT THE EXECUTIVE
- 3 OFFICE GIVE US A COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW OF WHAT HAPPENED WITH
- 4 REGARD TO THE CONSULTANT PROCESS. IT'S MY EXPECTATION THAT
- 5 THAT WORK CONTINUES BECAUSE THERE ARE OTHER GOVERNANCE IDEAS
- 6 THAT THAT RESEARCH CAN ELEVATE. BUT BECAUSE IT BECAME SUCH AN
- 7 ISSUE IN TERMS OF THE DELAY, I THINK THE ENTIRE BOARD IS OWED
- 8 A REAL CLEAR EXPLANATION ABOUT HOW WE GOT TO WHERE WE WERE IN
- 9 TERMS OF NO REPORT. AND SO, WE CAN MAKE SURE THAT WE'RE NEVER
- 10 IN THAT POSITION AGAIN. IF THERE ARE BOARD MEMBERS WHO HAVE
- 11 EXPECTATIONS AROUND TIMING OF ACTIONS, WE WANNA MAKE SURE THAT
- 12 WE UNDERSTAND HOW TO IMPROVE. I WOULD ALSO ASK, BECAUSE THIS
- 13 HAS COME UP, WHEN COMMENTS WERE MADE IN THE CONTEXT OF THE
- 14 DISCUSSION THE ORDINANCE AROUND CORRUPTION WHICH TRIGGERED FOR
- 15 ME THE MEMORY ABOUT THE WORK BEING DONE IN RESEARCHING THE
- 16 COUNTY'S CONTRACTING PROCESS AND SO I'M GOING TO ASK THE
- 17 COUNTY COUNSEL COMMUNICATE TO THE BOARD AN EXPECTATION OF
- 18 TIMING OF WHEN THAT REPORT WILL BE DUE. THAT WAS AN ISSUE THAT
- 19 THIS BOARD MADE CLEAR WAS A PRIORITY THAT WE WERE DEEPLY
- 20 CONCERNED ABOUT AND SO IT REMAINS CONCERNING THAT 3½ YEARS
- 21 LATER WE STILL DON'T HAVE A FULL UNDERSTANDING OF AREAS OF
- 22 WHERE WE CAN IMPROVE AND STREAMLINE AND CLOSE GAPS IN TERMS OF
- 23 THE COUNTY CONTRACTING PROCESS. SO, I HOPE THE COUNTY COUNSEL
- 24 WILL, IN SHORT ORDER, GIVE US AN IDEA ABOUT WHEN THAT REPORT
- 25 WILL BE AVAILABLE TO THE BOARD AS A WHOLE. SO, I WANTED TO



- 1 MAKE SURE THAT I REITERATED THOSE 2 EXPECTATIONS. AGAIN,
- 2 CONTINUE TO EXPRESS MY CONCERN FOR BOTH THE PROCESS AND AS I
- 3 WON'T REPEAT ALL THE ISSUES I'VE RAISED IN THE PAST WITH
- 4 REGARD TO THE CONTENT I JUST THINK IT COULD HAVE BEEN DONE
- 5 DIFFERENTLY IT COULD HAVE BEEN A DIFFERENT APPROACH THAT COULD
- 6 HAVE BEEN MORE INCLUSIVE BECAUSE I WOULD HAVE LIKED NOTHING
- 7 MORE TO BE ABLE TO BE IN A POSITION TO HAVE BEEN A
- 8 COLLABORATOR AND BE ABLE TO COME TO A YES ON TALKING ABOUT OUR
- 9 PRIORITIES AROUND GOVERNANCE GOING FORWARD, BUT BASED ON THE
- 10 EXPERIENCE THE LAST 3 WEEKS, I'M NOT ABLE TO DO SO. THANK YOU,
- 11 MADAM CHAIR. SUPERVISOR HAHN.

- 13 SUP. JANICE HAHN: THANK YOU, AND I APPRECIATE YOUR COMMENTS,
- 14 SUPERVISOR MITCHELL, AND I APPRECIATE, YOU KNOW, SUPERVISOR
- 15 BARGER, WHAT WE DID LAST TIME, SAYING THERE ARE CERTAIN THINGS
- 16 WE CAN DO NOW, WE DON'T HAVE TO WAIT. AND AN ETHICS COMMISSION
- 17 WAS ONE OF THOSE. BUT JUST TO REMIND EVERYBODY WHO'S MAYBE
- 18 LISTENING, THIS IS THE THIRD TIME THAT THIS REFORM PACKAGE HAS
- 19 BEEN IN FRONT OF OUR BOARD. AND I THINK THE DEBATE THAT WE'VE
- 20 BEEN HAVING, YOU KNOW, IS IMPORTANT. AND I KNOW THERE'S BEEN
- 21 SOME CONCERNS ABOUT HOW DECIDING THE FRAMEWORK OF THESE
- 22 REFORMS DIDN'T INCLUDE A PARTICULAR PUBLIC PROCESS. WE DIDN'T
- 23 REALLY HAVE, YOU KNOW, A TOWN HALL OR A FORUM TO GET THERE,
- 24 BUT THERE WERE CLOSE TO ALMOST 900 RESIDENTS THAT WERE TALKED
- 25 TO ACROSS L.A. COUNTY, AND THEY WERE ASKED WHAT THEY THOUGHT



- 1 OF L.A. COUNTY GOVERNMENT. AND AN OVERWHELMING 88% SAID THAT
- 2 L.A. COUNTY GOVERNMENT IS IN NEED OF REFORM. AND WHEN THEY
- 3 WERE ASKED IF THEY WANT AN INDEPENDENT ETHICS COMMISSION TO
- 4 KEEP L.A. COUNTY OFFICIALS IN LINE AND ELECTED COUNTY
- 5 EXECUTIVE AND EXPANDED BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF 9 MEMBERS, 74%
- 6 OF THEM SAID YES. SO, I THINK OUR RESIDENTS WANT SMALLER, MORE
- 7 REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICTS. I THINK THEY WANT CHECKS AND
- 8 BALANCES IN THEIR LOCAL GOVERNMENT. AND I THINK THEY WANT
- 9 COMMON SENSE ETHICS REFORM THAT HOLD OFFICIALS ACCOUNTABLE.
- 10 AND THE REFORMS IN THIS CHARTER AMENDMENT ARE WHAT I BELIEVE
- 11 ARE IN LINE WITH WHAT THE PUBLIC WANTS. WE COULD BE WRONG. I
- 12 KNOW THERE'S DISAGREEMENT ON THIS BOARD ABOUT THAT. BUT I
- 13 THINK WE SHOULD LET THE VOTERS DECIDE. AND APPROVING THIS
- 14 SECOND READING TODAY DOESN'T END THE DEBATE. IT JUST MOVES THE
- 15 DEBATE FROM INSIDE THIS BOARD ROOM TO THE PUBLIC SQUARE. THERE
- 16 WILL BE PLENTY OF DISCUSSION ABOUT THESE ISSUES BETWEEN NOW
- 17 AND NOVEMBER. AND AT THE END OF THE DAY, THIS ISN'T OUR
- 18 GOVERNMENT, THIS IS THE PEOPLE'S GOVERNMENT. AND I THINK WE
- 19 SHOULD LET THEM DECIDE HOW THEY WANT IT TO WORK. THANK YOU,
- 20 MADAM CHAIR.

- 24 SUP. HILDA SOLIS: YES, THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR. AND I ALSO
- 25 WANNA THANK YOU AND SUPERVISOR HAHN FOR BRINGING THIS ITEM



- 1 BEFORE US AGAIN. I THINK IT'S VERY IMPORTANT. IF WE'RE GONNA
- 2 REALLY LOOK AT DEMOCRATIC VALUES AND TRYING TO SET FORTH A
- 3 ROAD AHEAD FOR THE COUNTY. I THINK THAT THIS IS SOMETHING THAT
- 4 WE ALL HAVE BEEN THINKING ABOUT FOR THE LAST, I KNOW FOR ME AT
- 5 LEAST A DECADE. AND BEFORE THAT I KNOW THERE HAVE BEEN SEVERAL
- 6 ATTEMPTS TO TRY TO EXPAND THE BOARD AND REFORM THE COUNTY. SO
- 7 I KNOW THAT THIS IS A TOUGH, TOUGH THING FOR SOME OF US, BUT I
- 8 KNOW THAT IN THE END, IF WE DO OUR JOB AND EDUCATE THE PUBLIC
- 9 AND MAKE CLEAR THAT WHAT WE'RE DOING IS, WE HOPE IN THE BEST
- 10 INTEREST OF 10,000,000 PEOPLE, THAT THEY'LL HAVE A BROADER
- 11 ACCESS TO MORE LOCAL VOICES, INCREASING THE BOARD FROM 5 TO 9,
- 12 AND ALSO CREATING A PATH FOR STRONG ETHICS REFORM, AS WELL AS
- 13 MAKING SURE THAT WE HAVE ACCOUNTABILITY, SOMETHING THAT HAS
- 14 BEEN TALKED ABOUT HERE FOR A LONG TIME. I DON'T HAVE ANY
- 15 DISAGREEMENT WITH THAT. I DO WANNA SAY THAT WE WERE ABLE TO
- 16 OBTAIN A PETITION OF 150 SIGNATURES JUST FROM ONE
- 17 UNINCORPORATED AREA OF MY DISTRICT. SO, PEOPLE TOOK IT UPON
- 18 THEMSELVES TO SAY, WE SUPPORT THE EXPANSION, WE SUPPORT THIS
- 19 ORDINANCE. SO, I WANNA PUT THAT FORWARD FOR THE RECORD AND
- 20 JUST SAY THAT EVERY TIME WE HAVE AN INITIATIVE HERE IN THE
- 21 COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, WE ALWAYS COME UP AGAINST, YOU KNOW,
- 22 FOLKS THAT ARE OPPOSED TO THINGS THAT WE WANT TO DO. AND I'LL
- 23 NEVER FORGET WHEN I FIRST ARRIVED HERE AFTER A COUPLE YEARS,
- 24 WE WORKED ON TRYING TO GET AN INITIATIVE PASSED TO INCREASE
- 25 FUNDING FOR OUR PARKS. THERE ARE A LOT OF PEOPLE WHO LOVE



- 1 PARKS, BUT THERE ARE A LOT OF PEOPLE WHO DON'T LIKE PARKS AND
- 2 DON'T LIKE BEING CHARGED A FEE. BUT NONETHELESS, IT WAS VERY
- 3 POPULAR, WE FOUND OUT AFTER TALKING TO PEOPLE. AND ALL I HAVE
- 4 TO SAY IS SOMETIMES A DEMOCRACY IS HARD, BUT IN THESE CASES, I
- 5 THINK GOING TO THE VOTERS, WHETHER THEY SUPPORT IT OR NOT, LET
- 6 THEM DECIDE. AND I THINK THAT'S THE BEST WAY TO GO. SO, THANK
- 7 YOU, MADAM CHAIR, AND APPRECIATE THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK.

- 9 SUP. LINDSEY HORVATH, CHAIR: THANK YOU. SUPERVISOR BARGER.
- 10 THANK YOU. AND I WANNA THANK YOU, SUPERVISOR MITCHELL, NOT
- 11 ONLY FOR CONTINUING TO RAISE IMPORTANT AND PRESSING UNANSWERED
- 12 OUESTIONS, BUT ALSO FOR HAVING THE VISION ORIGINALLY TO BRING
- 13 THIS FORWARD. AND AS I RECALL, WHEN YOU BROUGHT IT FORWARD,
- 14 THIS BOARD WANTED TO STUDY IT. AND SO I DON'T KNOW WHAT
- 15 CHANGED BETWEEN WHEN YOU BROUGHT IT FORWARD AND WHEN OTHERS
- 16 WANTED IT STUDIED TO NOW, WE DON'T NEED TO STUDY IT ANYMORE.
- 17 WE NEED TO MAKE IT MOVE FORWARD AND OH, BY THE WAY, WE'RE
- 18 GOING TO ADD ELECTED GOVERNMENT, ELECTED TO CEO. SO I JUST
- 19 FEEL I JUST AM TRYING TO, I'M TRYING TO PUT THAT TOGETHER,
- 20 SUPERVISOR HAHN, BECAUSE I THINK YOU ACTUALLY ORIGINALLY DID
- 21 WANT IT STUDIED. AND YOU MADE COMPELLING ARGUMENTS AS TO WHY,
- 22 WHEN IT WAS BROUGHT FORWARD BY SUPERVISOR MITCHELL, THAT IT
- 23 SHOULD BE STUDIED. AT ANOTHER TIME, NOW IS NOT BECAUSE IT'S
- 24 GOING TO BE VOTED ON TODAY, THE VOTES ARE THERE. BUT I JUST
- 25 CAN'T RECONCILE WHAT CHANGED BETWEEN THEN AND NOW. I MEAN, I



- 1 KNOW THAT YOU ARE DOING THIS, AND I REMEMBER WHEN SUPERVISOR
- 2 HAHN, YOUR FATHER, BROUGHT THIS FORWARD. AND, YOU KNOW, FOR
- 3 ME, THE QUESTION HAS ALWAYS BEEN 7, 9, 15. I DON'T KNOW WHAT
- 4 THE NUMBER IS. THAT WAS WHAT I THOUGHT WE WERE HOPING TO GET
- 5 OUT OF THE STUDY. SO, YOU KNOW, I BELIEVE THAT THE
- 6 UNINCORPORATED AREAS, IF YOU WERE TO POLL THEM AND IT WAS
- 7 CONFIRMED, I THINK I'M GONNA GET FROM FERNANDO THE STATS, THE
- 8 UNINCORPORATED FEEL DISENFRANCHISED FROM THIS COUNTY. THEY
- 9 FEEL LIKE THEY ARE THE STEPCHILD OF L.A. COUNTY. AND YET WE
- 10 ARE, THAT IS OUR ROLE AS SUPERVISORS IS TO BE THE ELECTED
- 11 OFFICIAL OVER THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS. AND SO, I TAKE THAT TO
- 12 HEART. AND THAT'S WHY IN MY UNINCORPORATED AREAS, THEY DO
- 13 SUPPORT EXPANDING THE BOARD BECAUSE THEY FEEL THAT THE
- 14 REPRESENTATION WILL GET BETTER. NOT UNDERSTANDING HOW IT'S
- 15 GONNA BE BROKEN UP. I THINK THAT THE FUNDAMENTAL CHANGES TO
- 16 THE COUNTY GOVERNMENT THROUGH AN ELECTED EXECUTIVE AND
- 17 EXPANDED BOARD WILL NOT AFFECT, GO INTO EFFECT UNTIL 4 TO 8
- 18 YEARS RESPECTIVELY. SO, I DON'T HAVE A CLEAR ANSWER AS TO WHY
- 19 WE WOULD RUSH FORWARD THIS PROPOSAL AT THE 11TH HOUR WITHOUT
- 20 CONDUCTING THE THOROUGH STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT THAT A REFORM
- 21 INITIATIVE OF THIS MAGNITUDE SHOULD ENTAIL. SO, WHEN I HEAR
- 22 900 PEOPLE WERE ENGAGED, 900 OUT OF 10,000,000, AND YOU'RE NOT

- 2 SO I STILL, I'M NOT HEARING IN MY DISTRICT OVERWHELMING
- 3 SUPPORT FOR THE ELECTED. I AM FOR THE EXPANDED BOARD. SO, I
- 4 WILL MAKE SURE I PUSH OUT TO MY CONSTITUENCY THAT, THAT, THAT
- 5 THIS WAS NOT SOMETHING THAT WAS ORIGINALLY ANTICIPATED WHEN

- 3 TO WHEN IT'S GONNA BE TORN DOWN. I REALLY WANT TO EMPHASIZE
- 4 PROCESS. I AGREE WITH SUPERVISOR MITCHELL THAT THE PROCESS AND

- 22 WANT TO ASK, YOU RAISED THE QUESTION OF DEALS CUT AND PROMISES
- 23 MADE. AND I JUST WANT TO KNOW WHAT YOU MEAN BY THAT.

- 1 HEARD OR SUPERVISOR HORVATH, I HEARD THAT YOU AND SUPERVISOR
- 2 SOLIS WERE WORKING ON THIS AND THAT SUPERVISOR SOLIS DECIDED
- 3 SHE DIDN'T WANT HER NAME ON IT. I'M JUST TELLING YOU WHAT I'VE
- 4 HEARD AND THAT IN RETURN YOU WENT TO SUPERVISOR HAHN AND ASKED
- 5 SUPERVISOR HAN TO CO-AUTHOR IT NOW WHETHER IT'S TRUE OR NOT
- 6 I'M JUST I'M HONEST I'M TELLING YOU WHAT I'VE HEARD AND IF
- 7 I'VE HEARD IT I WILL GUARANTEE YOU THAT IT'S BEEN TALKED ABOUT

- 12 KNOW THAT WHEN I FIRST CAME ONTO THE BOARD, YOU ALSO SHARED
- 13 WITH ME THINGS THAT YOU HEARD THROUGH THE GRAPEVINE ABOUT ME
- 14 AS A CANDIDATE AND AS A POTENTIAL COLLEAGUE THAT WERE NOT
- 15 TRUE. SO, I JUST WANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE WHAT YOUR, I, IT'S

- 1 THE SIGNIFICANCE WHEN I SAID NASCAR. THAT'S JUST KIND OF A WAY
- 2 IN WHICH WE'VE TALKED ABOUT. LETTERHEAD, I DIDN'T WANT TO, SO
- 3 LET ME JUST ACKNOWLEDGE SINCE WE'VE TALKED ABOUT A PETITION OF
- 4 150 AND 900 PEOPLE, THE ORGANIZATIONS REPRESENTED HERE ON THE
- 5 LETTER TODAY REPRESENT 5,000. IT'S NOT MY IMPRESSION THAT OF
- 6 THE 900 FOLKS WERE TAPPED IN THE SECOND DISTRICT. THAT'S JUST
- 7 NOT MY IMPRESSION. WHILE, AGAIN, THERE'S BEEN LOTS OF
- 8 CONVERSATION ABOUT EXPANDING THE BOARD. THE PARTICULARS IN
- 9 THIS PROPOSAL, I DON'T KNOW, ELEVATE TO THE TOP OF THE NEEDS
- 10 IN MY DISTRICT. WE TALKED ABOUT THE NEEDS IN MY DISTRICT
- 11 TODAY. STREET RACING, THE UNHOUSED, CRITICAL ISSUES THAT
- 12 PEOPLE LOOK TO THE COUNTY TO SOLVE FOR THEM. AND SO, WHILE I
- 13 KNOW THAT GOVERNANCE WILL IMPROVE OUR ABILITY TO BE RESPONSIVE
- 14 TO THOSE NEEDS, I CAN'T IN GOOD CONSCIENCE ACKNOWLEDGE THAT
- 15 THIS PROCESS, THAT THE CONTENTS OF THIS ORDINANCE WILL GET US
- 16 ANY CLOSER THERE. PEOPLE HAVE GREAT NEED IN THE SECOND
- 17 SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICT AND I BELIEVE COUNTYWIDE. AND IT REALLY

- 4 ACKNOWLEDGE THE 5,000 PEOPLE THOSE ORGANIZATIONS REPRESENT.
- 5 THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR.

- 7 SUP. LINDSEY HORVATH, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH AND I WANT TO
- 8 THANK MY COLLEAGUES FOR THE ONGOING DISCUSSION ABOUT
- 9 GOVERNANCE REFORM. AND I WANT TO THANK EVERYONE WHO'S WEIGHED
- 10 IN SO FAR ON THIS IMPORTANT GOING FORWARD PROCESS. WE ALL, WE
- 11 NEED ALL OF OUR VOICES TO BE PART OF THIS NOW AND IN THE YEARS
- 12 TO COME IF THE VOTERS CHOOSE TO PASS THIS IN NOVEMBER. DEBATE
- 13 AND DISCOURSE ARE WHAT MAKE A HEALTHY DEMOCRACY AND SINCE I
- 14 JOINED THE BOARD I HAVE HEARD A RESOUNDING CALL FOR CHANGE.
- 15 CHANGE FOR A FUTURE WHERE LOS ANGELES COUNTY MORE URGENTLY AND
- 16 EFFECTIVELY MEETS THE NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITIES, ESPECIALLY OUR
- 17 MOST VULNERABLE RESIDENTS WHO DEPEND ON COUNTY SERVICES AND
- 18 CARE. AFTER MORE THAN 100 YEARS OF THE STATUS QUO, THIS IS A
- 19 PROPOSAL THAT GIVES ANGELENOS THE OPPORTUNITY TO SHAPE A
- 20 COUNTY GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE FIT FOR THE 21ST CENTURY. TODAY,
- 21 AS WE CONSIDER WHETHER TO PLACE THE AMENDMENT ON THE COUNTY
- 22 CHARTER TO THE COUNTY CHARTER ON THE BALLOT, I WANT TO GET
- 23 BACK TO WHY THIS PROPOSAL SOLVES FOR THE PROBLEMS WE'RE
- 24 FACING. WHY DO WE NEED AN ELECTED COUNTY EXECUTIVE?
- 25 ACCOUNTABILITY. HAVING AN ELECTED EXECUTIVE ACCOUNTABLE TO THE



- 1 PEOPLE IS NOT A FOREIGN CONCEPT. THE SEPARATION OF POWERS,
- 2 CREATING A DISTINCT EXECUTIVE BRANCH SEPARATE FROM THE
- 3 LEGISLATIVE BRANCH BUT EQUALLY EMPOWERED, LEADS TO A SYSTEM OF
- 4 CHECKS AND BALANCES TO ENSURE THAT NO ONE BRANCH OF GOVERNMENT
- 5 WOULD BECOME TOO POWERFUL, AND THAT POWER DOESN'T GO
- 6 UNCHECKED. THIS IS FOUNDATIONAL TO OUR DEMOCRATIC GOVERNMENT,
- 7 AND BECAUSE L.A. COUNTY HAS AN IMPLEMENTATION PROBLEM, TODAY'S
- 8 JAIL DISCUSSION COULD NOT MORE PERFECTLY EMBODY EXACTLY WHAT I

- 11 BUT WHAT COMES NEXT IS OFTEN TOO SLOW AND ACCOUNTABILITY IS
- 12 DIFFUSE. WE NEED SOMEONE WHO IS EMPOWERED TO TAKE ACTION AND
- 13 IS ACCOUNTABLE FOR IMPLEMENTING THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF
- 14 THIS BOARD. ACCOUNTABILITY TO CLOSE MEN'S CENTRAL JAIL, TO
- 15 ACTUALIZE YOUTH JUSTICE REIMAGINED, TO MOVE WITH GREATER
- 16 URGENCY ON OUR HOMELESSNESS CRISIS AND IMPLEMENTING CARE
- 17 COURT, SB43 AND OTHER STATE DIRECTIVES WHICH WE'VE DISCUSSED
- 18 TODAY, AND CLARITY AND AUTHORITY FOR OUR 38 DEPARTMENTS. THIS
- 19 IS THE CHANGE WE NEED FOR THE NATION'S LARGEST AND MOST
- 20 COMPLEX COUNTY. CREATING AN ELECTED COUNTY EXECUTIVE
- 21 ACCOUNTABLE TO THE PEOPLE OFFERS THE CHECKS AND BALANCES
- 22 NECESSARY AS WE ALSO EXPAND THE BOARD FROM 5 TO 9, WHICH IS
- 23 ABSOLUTELY ESSENTIAL TO ENSURE THIS BOARD REFLECTS THE
- 24 DIVERSITY THAT IS LOS ANGELES COUNTY. EXPANDING REPRESENTATION
- 25 IS LONG OVERDUE, AND IT'S THE RIGHT THING TO DO. 9 IS



- 1 MEASURED, 9 IS NOT NEW. L.A. COUNTY DESERVES THE OPPORTUNITY
- 2 TO SEE THEMSELVES REFLECTED IN THEIR BOARD OF SUPERVISORS,
- 3 WHETHER THAT'S GEOGRAPHY, RACE, GENDER, OR ORIENTATION. WE'VE
- 4 SEEN LOTS OF EXCITEMENT ON THE EXPANSION PROPOSAL FROM
- 5 COMMUNITIES WHO WOULD LIKE A SEAT AT THE TABLE, AND I DON'T
- 6 BUY INTO A SCARCITY MINDSET. I BELIEVE THAT INSTEAD OF
- 7 FIGHTING FOR SEATS AT THE TABLE, WE SHOULD BUILD A BIGGER
- 8 TABLE AND PULL UP MORE SEATS. THIRDLY, WE NEED AN INDEPENDENT
- 9 ETHICS COMMISSION BECAUSE IT'S A BASIC PRINCIPLE OF GOOD
- 10 GOVERNANCE. IT'S ALSO OUR RESPONSIBILITY TO ENGENDER THE TRUST
- 11 OF L.A. COUNTY RESIDENTS. THIS BODY WOULD HOLD ELECTED LEADERS
- 12 ACCOUNTABLE AND THE COMMISSION WOULD ALSO BE A SPACE TO
- 13 CENTRALIZE WHAT IS NOW SILOED PUBLIC INFORMATION AND EDUCATION
- 14 ON IMPORTANT CHANGES TO LAW. THERE ARE SOME DETAILS ON THE HOW
- 15 TO BE WORKED OUT, AND THAT IS INTENTIONAL. IT IS NOT THE
- 16 ABSENCE OF STRATEGY OR THOUGHT. IT IS TO CREATE ROOM FOR YOUR
- 17 INPUT, THE PUBLIC AT LARGE, WHO WE SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF.
- 18 OUR BOARD DISCUSSED GOVERNANCE AND UNANIMOUSLY GAVE DIRECTION
- 19 OVER A 1½ AGO, WITH NO PATH OR TIMELINE ESTABLISHED TO DATE
- 20 FOR THAT PROCESS. SUCH A PACE DOES NOT MEET THE MOMENT. THIS
- 21 ORDINANCE IS A STARTING POINT, WHICH IS WHY INTENTIONAL SPACES
- 22 FOR DIVERSE VOICES WERE CREATED IN THE HOW. TO THAT END,
- 23 THERE'S A STAKEHOLDER PROCESS FOR IMPLEMENTATION THROUGH THE
- 24 GOVERNANCE REFORM TASK FORCE. IF APPROVED TODAY, VOTERS WILL
- 25 DETERMINE IF IT'S TIME FOR CHANGE. I FEEL THE URGENCY OF NOW



- 1 BECAUSE THE PUBLIC DEMANDS CHANGE AND BECAUSE I ALSO FEEL A
- 2 DEEP RESPONSIBILITY TO THE PEOPLE THAT I LISTEN TO. YOUNG
- 3 PEOPLE HAVE LOST THEIR FAITH IN GOVERNMENT. THIS IS AN
- 4 INVITATION TO DELIVER A GOVERNMENT THAT IS MORE
- 5 REPRESENTATIVE, TRANSPARENT, AND ACCOUNTABLE, A GOVERNMENT
- 6 BETTER EQUIPPED TO DELIVER ON THE PROMISES WE'VE MADE TO THEM.
- 7 CHANGE IS UNCOMFORTABLE. IT IS HARD, AND IT IS MESSY. BUT THIS
- 8 IS A ONCE IN A GENERATION OPPORTUNITY TO MODERNIZE OUR CHARTER
- 9 IN A WAY THAT HASN'T BEEN SEEN IN MORE THAN 100 YEARS. AN
- 10 OPPORTUNITY TO SHAPE SOMETHING THAT WORKS BETTER AND DELIVERS
- 11 RESULTS WITH MORE DIVERSE VOICES SHAPING THE CHANGE. THIS IS
- 12 THE BEGINNING AND IT OPENS THE DOOR TO ONGOING REFLECTION AND
- 13 RECOMMENDATIONS ON HOW WE GOVERN THROUGH THE CHARTER REVIEW
- 14 COMMISSION. THERE ARE ALSO MANY PEOPLE WHO AREN'T ABLE TO BE
- 15 HERE TODAY TO SHARE THEIR THOUGHTS AND OPINIONS AND THESE ARE
- 16 PEOPLE WHO MAY NOT HAVE THE ABILITY TO TAKE OFF TIME TO
- 17 PETITION THEIR GOVERNMENT BUT INSTEAD ARE BARELY ABLE TO
