### BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE (BPAC)

The BPAC will have up to 9 members, serving a two year term, and consist of residents, homeowners, business owners, a school district representative, a representative of the Senior community, a representative of the disabled community, a high school student and other interested parties. The BPAC will hold open noticed public meetings in accordance with the Brown Act.

#### Membership Criteria

The following is a listing of the criteria that staff recommend that the Council use to eventually guide selection of members to the BPAC. These criteria are categorized into three sets: Logistical, Knowledge-based, and Representative.

### Logistical Criteria

Logistical criteria are related to a BPAC member's ability to make the time commitment to actively participate in meetings. This primarily includes availability. Meetings will may take place after work and school hours during the afternoon, evening and possibly some weekends.

### Knowledge-based Criteria

Knowledge-based criteria are related to a member's relevant experiences and/or knowledge of the general issue, or their willingness to acquire the information required for effective problem solving. Examples of useful knowledge include a vocabulary of bicycle and pedestrian treatments; a knowledge of the City's road and/or flood channel network, location of major destinations and the surrounding area.

### Representative Criteria

Representative criteria are related to a member's relevant support, confidence, and understanding from specific groups with significant input for the development of bicycle and pedestrian facilities. As stated above it is recommended that the BPAC consist of approximately 8 members and that the membership represent at least one individual from each of the following groups. If the applicant pool does not consist of potential candidates to represent all the below groups, the City Council may select candidates from any already represented group. The following are a list of suggested groups for BPAC representation.

### Membership Composition

- <u>City Residents (5)</u> This group is anticipated to provide a broad range of firsthand knowledge to the BPAC. Members will submit an application for consideration of appointment to the ad-hoc committee.
  - 1) Resident: Member at Large (3)
  - 2) Resident: Senior Citizen (1)
  - 3) Resident: Disability Representative (1)
- <u>School Representative</u> (1) Members from this group can be teachers, members of a Parent-Teacher Association, school administrators and familiar with the issues that pertain to accessing schools. Of particular interest is anyone who has participated in a Safe Routes to School program or who has helped coordinate alternative transportation methods to schools. This group provides insight into commuting patterns as they pertain to schools, and can provide much needed expertise when it comes to increasing bicycle and pedestrian access to schools. Representative is not required to be a resident of Culver City.
- <u>High School Student</u> (1) The involvement and participation of a Culver City High School student will benefit the committee by providing a new perspective on issues related to biking and walking to school as well as throughout the City. The student will be nominated by the School District. Student is not required to be a resident of Culver City.
- <u>Chamber of Commerce (1)</u> Representation from the Chamber of Commerce can ensure that bicycle and pedestrian plans support the broader needs of Culver City businesses for providing convenient access for customers and also easy commuting alternatives for employees. Members from this group are required to have a "brick and mortar" (a physical retail, commercial, or industrial business presence – home business owners may apply as a City resident) in the City and have a minimum of 3 employees. <u>Non-City resident business representatives are allowed</u>.
- <u>Culver City Local Business Owner (1)</u> Business Owners in Culver City are intimately aware of factors that improve their business and access issues. Businesses play an integral role in the pedestrian and bicycle environment within Culver City. Members from this group are required to have a "brick and mortar" (a physical retail, commercial, or industrial business presence home business owners may apply as a City resident) in the City and have a minimum of 3 employees. <u>Non-City resident business representatives are allowed</u>.
