**SUBJECT: RANCHO HIGUERA RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD
ADVISORY SURVEY TO EXPRESS YOUR OPINION
DUE TO THE CITY BY OR BEFORE WED., JULY 3RD, 2019, 5 PM**

Dear Rancho Higuera Neighborhood Resident:

BACKGROUND

A little over a year ago, Thursday, April 26, 2018, the City held a neighborhood meeting with you, the residents of Rancho Higuera, to kick-off the Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP). The NTMP is designed to be a collaborative effort between the Rancho Higuera Residents, the NTMP Resident's Committee, and the City. Subsequently, through a door-to-door survey, you, the residents, contributed your traffic experiences on your block and throughout the neighborhood. The information you shared through the survey helped to formulate a neighborhood-wide understanding of traffic issues. Traffic data was then collected across the entire neighborhood. This data was evaluated following the guidelines of the Culver City's NTMP policy. Subsequently, the NTMP committee and the City devised a temporary traffic management plan to address the most pressing issues across the Rancho Higuera neighborhood. This plan was presented to the NTMP Residents Committee, where it received unanimous support. It is this traffic plan, which proposes countermeasures to improve the neighborhood's traffic experience, that was presented to the neighborhood at the meeting of Thursday, May 30th, 2019.

The neighborhood was informed that the next step in the NTMP process requires the written participation of the residents of Rancho Higuera by an Advisory Survey. The survey asks you to express your support or opposition to the proposed traffic plan. Without sufficient support, traffic improvement initiatives will cease in the Rancho Higuera neighborhood.

This letter transmits the Advisory Survey. One Advisory Survey response will be accepted from each household at the addresses of record in the Rancho Higuera Neighborhood.

Also enclosed is the Description of Temporary Proposals document which illustrates the proposals presented at the meeting of May 30th. This document provides you information to help you decide if you support or oppose the traffic calming measures. Please refer to this document prior to filling out the Advisory Survey.

Alternatively, a digital version of the Advisory Survey is available at **<https://forms.gle/ncNZPuMMXcYRS4qs7>** if you prefer. Only one Advisory Survey from each residence will be accepted; you select whichever of the two types (paper or digital) is most convenient for you. The Advisory Survey submitted will be representative of the opinion of the household. If you inadvertently submit both, only the first one submitted will be counted and the second one discarded.

The surveys will be date- and time-stamped when they are received. They are due:

Any Advisory Surveys not received by this date and time, will not be accepted.

ADVISORY SURVEY CRITERIA

The criteria for Advisory Surveys is contained in the City Council-adopted procedures and regulations for the Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP). Support in favor of the Temporary Proposals require meeting two criteria: **1)** a minimum submitted Advisory Surveys shall represent 50% of the residential addresses in the Rancho Higuera Neighborhood, plus one more residence; **and 2)** of all the Advisory Surveys submitted, 60% shall support the proposals. If the tally of the submitted Advisory

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Surveys do not meet both criteria, the neighborhood is deemed to have expressed that it does not support the traffic calming proposals, and the NTMP activities will not proceed further. If the two criteria are met, the results will be presented to the City Council at a future meeting. In this case, the entire neighborhood will be informed of the date of City Council consideration by a mailed courtesy notice.

ADVISORY SURVEY INSTRUCTIONS

When expressing your household's opinion in the Advisory Survey, please **clearly mark one "X" only per question**, for each of the questions, in either the green "YES" column (to indicate your favorable support), or the red "NO" column (to indicate your lack of support). Then, please print your name, home address, email address, and sign it. Please mail it back in the self-addressed and pre-stamped envelope, included for your convenience. You may also drop it off at the Engineering Division public counter in City Hall, 2nd floor, if you prefer. Alternatively, if you received an emailed link to the Advisory Survey, you may submit it online. Please submit only one type of survey, either the paper or digital survey.
