- I. In order to receive CDBG funds, the City submits to the CDBG administration office a City Council resolution declaring the City's intention to carry out specified projects eligible for CDBG funding. Upon CDBG administration's approval of the City's proposed projects, the City enters into a reimbursable contract with the County. The City then completes the approved projects and submits to the County requests for reimbursement of funds in accordance with CDBG rules, requirements and restrictions. It has been the practice of the City Council to forgo allocating CDBG funds to private non-profit organizations in order to prioritize public service projects and capital improvement projects that would otherwise be funded with the City's unrestricted (General Fund) funds.
- II. Project eligibility is restricted to specific uses and specific geographic areas of the city. Projects must have a budget of \$10,000 or more to be eligible for funding.
- III. The Public Works Department has indicated there are sloped and damaged sidewalks in several areas of Culver City in need of repair or reconstruction. The Department of Justice ruled that effective July 1, 2014, existing ADA ramps that are not in compliance with current ADA standards must be reconstructed whenever an agency paves a street. The CDBG Advisory Committee is recommending the City Council allocate all available CDBG funds (all funds remaining after funding the public services program to the maximum permissible amount) to the repair and reconstruct of sidewalks and curb ramps city-wide to current standards to the extent made possible by available CDBG funding for fiscal year 2016/2017. Streets and areas will be included in the proposed project description in the reimbursable contract to be filed with CDBG Administration.
