

1 (3) giving federal immigration authorities access to interview individuals in
2 agency or department custody for immigration enforcement purposes;

3 (4) performing the functions of an immigration officer; and

4 WHEREAS, Senate Bill 54 would repeal Health and Safety Code §11369,
5 which provides that when there is reason to believe a person arrested for specified
6 controlled substance provisions may not be a citizen of the United States, the arresting
7 agency shall notify the appropriate agency of the United States having charge of
8 deportation matters; and

9 WHEREAS, Senate Bill 54 provides that the California Attorney General shall
10 publish model policies for limiting immigration enforcement to the fullest extent possible
11 consistent with state and federal law at public schools, health facilities operated by the
12 state or a political subdivision of the state, courthouses and shelters, to ensure that they
13 remain safe and accessible to all California residents, regardless of immigration status; and

14 WHEREAS, the City of Culver City supports protecting the safety, well-being
15 and constitutional rights of the people of the State of California, and supports directing the
16 state's limited resources to matters of greatest concern to state and local governments.


