

### **CULVER CITY DISTRICT TAXES HIGHLIGHTS**

From January through March, Culver City's Measures C and CC purchases as consumers became more hesitant to make major generated combined cash receipts that were 4.2 percent higher than the same period in 2024. After adjusting for reporting irregularities such as delayed payments and audit corrections, the actual increase in taxable sales was 2.7 percent.

A large portion of this quarter's revenue growth was driven by a significant payment related to the purchase of construction materials for a local development project. Continued strength in ecommerce activity also contributed to the positive results. In addition, the opening of a new restaurant provided a modest lift to local sales.

However, the automotive sector saw a decline in new vehicle

financial commitments amid rising economic uncertainty. Local service stations also reported lower returns, reflecting a drop in fuel prices compared to the same period last year.

When excluding one-time reporting anomalies, taxable sales across Los Angeles County declined by 1.6 percent year over year. This downturn was partly attributed to the impacts of the Palisades, Eaton, and other fires that occurred during the quarter, which significantly affected several County jurisdictions. In contrast, the broader Southern California region remained flat, showing relative stability despite localized disruptions.


