CULTURAL AFFAIRS COMMISSION RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE 2012 CULVER CITY MUSIC FESTIVAL

Summary of Recommendations

- Retain Gary Mandell as the overall Festival Producer for an eight-week series with responsibility for marketing, house management, production and artist relations
- Retain Gary Mandell as the presenter of the first six concerts with responsibility for booking the artists
- Retain the Jazz Bakery as the guest presenter of the last two concerts with responsibility for booking the artists
- Require Gary Mandell to contract directly with Jazz Bakery as the guest presenter
- Require Gary Mandell to engage Cultural Affairs graphic design contractor, Jamie Greenberg, to redesign the Festival marketing materials
- Require Gary Mandell and Jazz Bakery to continue to seek high energy, high profile artists
- Require Gary Mandell and Jazz Bakery to utilize the full allocated budget for musical artists.

Review of Marketing and Programming Recommendations

Marketing / Graphic Design

- Recommendation that Mr. Mandell redesign the graphics and marketing materials for the 18th annual Festival to create a more current look to the design which would better complement the promotional material for other Cultural Affairs events and further brand the City's cultural programming.
- Recommendation to further streamlining the program/flyer by reducing its size and effectively guiding concertgoers to the Festival page on the City's website which would include full artist biographies and general Festival information.
- Recommendation that Mr. Mandell use the Festival marketing budget to engage Ms. Jamie Greenberg, a graphic design contractor for several of the Cultural Affairs work programs, to create a new design concept for the program/flyer and ads. Mr. Mandell and staff would work cooperatively on the graphic redesign during this transition time period. All costs that results from Mr. Mandell's use of Ms. Greenberg would be Mr. Mandell's responsibility.

Musical Artists

- Recommendation that Mr. Mandell and the Jazz Bakery continue to present a varied program of dynamic musical artists. Focusing on audience response, and the success of the new dance area in the Courtyard, it was concluded that concertgoers respond most favorably to the artists who are high energy and to a convivial atmosphere where they may dance and socialize with friends and family throughout the evening.
- Recommendation that the presenters expend the full amount allocated in the budget for musical artists. The recommended expenditure for individual musical groups has been approximately \$2500 which is not a high performance rate for quality performers in the region. The CAC recommends that the presenters spend the full amount that they are allocated for musical artists, allowing for a range of performer fees, so that the Festival's programming may be competitive with other Thursday night summer concert programs on the west side of Los Angeles County.

Incendio plus Los Pinguos

Los Pinguos—Argentinian Rock-Buenos Aires natives performing Latin rhythms, salsa, flamenco, reggae, rumba, and Argentine rock

Incendio—Spanish Flamenco with percussion

The latin guitar, world fusion, group Incendio, with elements of Flamenco, rock, and jazz fused together and done with twin guitars and bass. They subtly bring influences as diverse as Weather Report, Jimi Hendrix, XTC, Paco de Lucia, Buddha Bar and Joni Mitchell to bear on their musical tapestry.



Direct from their native Buenos Aires come **Los Pinguos** (a derivative of "penguins") with a mixture of Latin rhythms, salsa, flamenco, reggae, rumba, Argentine rock, and sambas, performed with Spanish guitars, a Cuban Tres, Peruvian cajon (box-drum) and harmonizing vocals. Dubbed by one of their fans as the "South American Beatles," people have referred to them as a hot Argentine folk groove band. Since winning the "Next Big Star" talent competition

hosted by Ed McMahon they have developed into one of L.A.'s hottest groups with a following that crosses most boundaries.

Rocky Dawuni—Ghanaian Reggae star Rocky Dawuni with 11 piece band Ghana's international music star, Rocky Dawuni, has leveraged his popularity within and without the African continent to champion social causes and inspire a generation of artists and fans alike. Dawuni's eloquence as well as his successful melding of musical celebrity and social action has made him a spokesperson for various causes worldwide. Over the last few years, Rocky's music and electric live performances have attracted thousands to his concerts. In the US, Dawuni's progressive fusion of Reggae, Soul and traditional African sounds, have been making steady inroads in the entertainment industry. He can be seen/heard alongside Bono from U2 in the video and song remake of "War/No more Trouble" for the highly successful "Playing for Change: Songs around the World" album. Dawuni won "Best African Artist" Award at the International Reggae & World Music Awards 2011 where he was also nominated for Best Album for his most recent project "Hymns".

Ricardo Lemvo and Makina Loca—Afro-Cuban/Salsa

A dynamic 10 piece band that can literally burn up the dance floor by capturing all of the elements of African and Cuban music. The World Music ensemble blends African soukous and rumba with Cuban salsa and son. A native of the Democratic Republic of the Congo (formerly Zaire) Ricardo sings some of the material in Spanish and some material in the African tongues of Kikongo and Lingala. Makina Loca features a dazzling array of attacking horns, mesmerizing percussion, and a rolling piano that floats along. Grab a window seat on the rumba route dancing to Afro-Caribbean groove. "These guys play with an intensity that makes it impossible to hold still". —San Francisco Examiner

Albert Lee

Two time Grammy winner Albert Lee is truly a musician's musician playing hot country, rock, and blues guitar as a member of Emilylou Harris' Hot Band and the Crickets. Lee played regularly with The Everly Brothers for over 20 years. Starting in 1978 Lee worked for five years with Eric Clapton, playing and singing for a live concert recording at the Budokan in Japan. In November 2002 Albert was among other world class names appearing at the Royal Albert Hall in the "Concert for George," a tribute to George Harrison. Albert Lee appeared at the "2007 Crossroads Guitar Festival" and continues to work in the studio and tours on a regular basis with Bill Wyman's (Rolling Stones) Rhythm Kings. Voted "Best Country Guitar Picker" by Guitar Player Magazine five times!



The Carl Verheyen Band

Lead guitarist from the band Supertramp (since 1985) and one of L.A.'s top session guitarists (winner of 1996 Guitar Player Magazine's best studio guitarist poll by its readers) and his super band, with Dave Marotta (bass) and Walfredo Reyes, Jr. (percussion). "There's room for a lot of different sounds in our music," he says. "I think people have come to know that that's what Poncho Sanchez is all about. 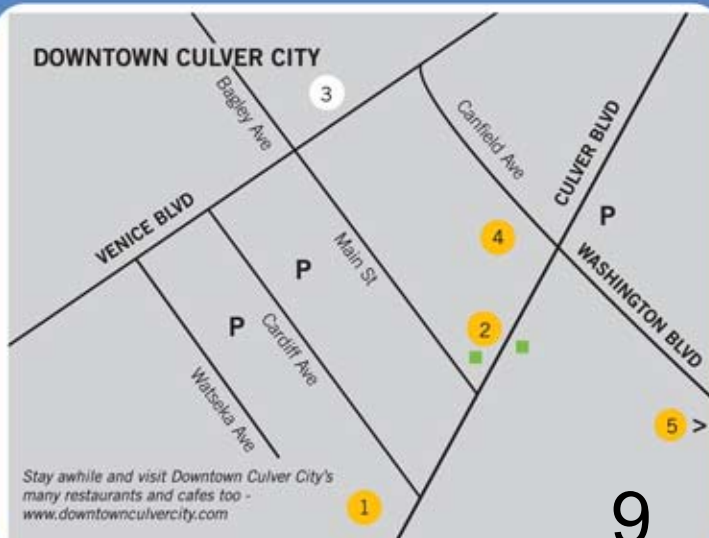

Rachel ROSENTHAL

Rachel Rosenthal, Artistic Director and founder of The Rachel Rosenthal Company, is an interdisciplinary performer who developed a revolutionary performance technique that integrates text, movement, voice, choreography, improvisation, inventive costuming, dramatic lighting and wildly imaginative sets into an unforgettable "total theater" experience. In the last twenty-five years of her performing career she presented over 40 full-scale pieces nationally and internationally. She created the experimental Instant Theatre, performing in and guiding it for ten years. She was a leading figure in the L.A. Women's Art Movement in the 1970s, co-founding WomanSpace, among other projects. In 2000 she was honored by the City of Los Angeles as "a Living Cultural Treasure of Los Angeles". Retired from the stage, Rosenthal resumed a long dormant career in visual art and is currently working in oil and watercolor. In addition to her work in the visual arts, Rosenthal is Artistic Director of a new ensemble of performers called TOHUBOHU! Extreme Theatre Ensemble who present evenings of Total Improvisation regularly in her studio space.

Amy KNOLES

Amy Knoles has spent her career attempting to redefine the crossroads of music composition, multimedia art, and technology. Her solo works draw on a huge variety of source material from throughout history, language and culture as well as from her own personal imagination. Medieval polyphony, modern urban rhythms, atonal deconstructions and classic melodies have all been filtered through the lens of her idiosyncratic voice at one time or another. Knoles's ability to invent both high and low-tech methods of constructing musical and multimedia experiences as well as her virtuosity as a percussionist make for an ideal blend. Amy has been the Executive Director of the California E.A.R. Unit for thirty years, and has recently created the department of Electronic Percussion for CalArts. She has worked with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Kronos Quartet, Pierre Boulez, Rachel Rosenthal, the Los Angeles Master Chorale and many others.

Culver Events Center Culver Events Center has a versatile indoor/outdoor setting which is a favorite for weddings, parties, fundraisers and occasional movie shoots. Its "mission eclectic" ballroom was a speakeasy during prohibition. Hidden away behind Leaf Organics, at Washington and Inglewood Boulevards, the intimate courtyard, gardens, bar and hall are reminiscent of olden days when Culver City gave birth to the movie industry.
