City Council to: (1) Approve three new intersections with six approaches for automated (red light camera) photo enforcement services at Washington Boulevard and Overland Avenue, at Washington Boulevard and National Boulevard, and at Washington Boulevard and Sepulveda Boulevard; (2) Discontinue use of automated (red light camera) photo enforcement services at three intersections with four approaches at Washington Place and Centinela Avenue, Washington Boulevard and Sawtelle Boulevard and at Washington Boulevard and Helms Avenue; and (3) Approve an Amendment to the existing Agreement with Redflex Traffic Systems, Inc., to provide automated (red light camera) services at three new intersections with six approaches and to discontinue use of automated (red light camera) services from three intersections with four approaches.
