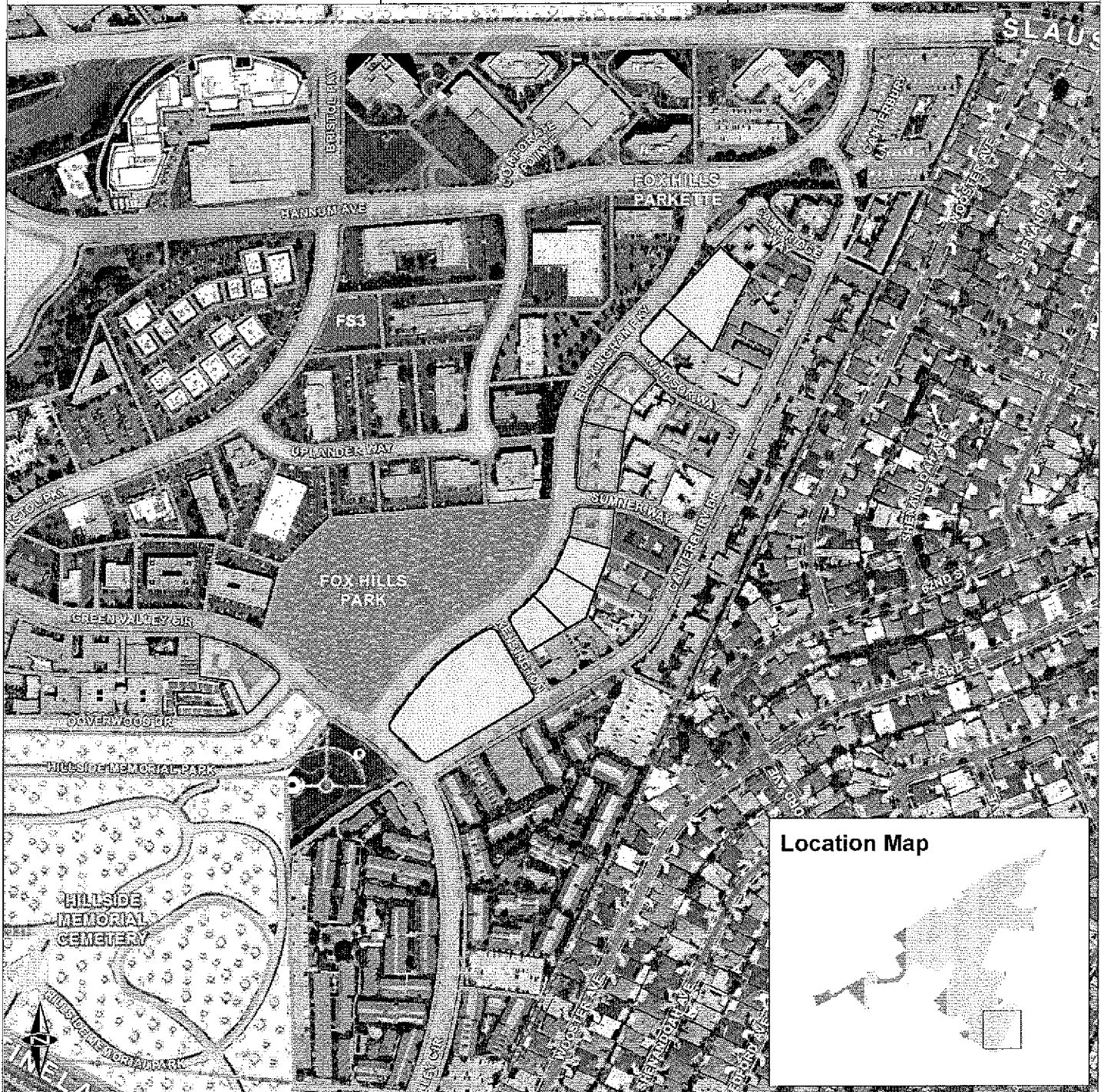

Dear Ms. Mooney:

I live across the street from Fox Hills Park and frequent it practically every day. When I walk around the track I see young kids shooting hoops with friends, and adults who appear to be their Dads, Moms and older siblings. This is nice to see. I am concerned that if the half courts are converted to full courts and allowed to remain open all day that the younger kids will no longer be able to use the courts because bigger kids and adults will monopolize it.

I don't know what the PRCS Commission has in mind for these full courts, but if it is for organized or supervised games, then I am in favor only if one basket from the full court is left open after the games are completed. Perhaps one of the baskets could be locked when not being used for organized games and leave one on the side and at the end open for the kids to practice shooting and blocking. Otherwise these courts will be lost to the children and that would be a shame.

I do not believe this would be an "improved recreational use of the court" as stated in the public notice which I received.
