SUBJECT: **2025 ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND 2026 PROPOSED ACTIVITY/UPCOMING AGENDA ITEMS FOR THE NEXT 6 MONTHS**

At the February 11, 2026 regular meeting of the Finance Advisory Committee (FAC), the FAC discussed and approved a staff report of activity and authorized staff to transmit the final report to City Council for approval. The list below summarizes the CBC's accomplishments during the period of July 2025 through December 2025 and provides a list of anticipated activities/upcoming agenda items for the first half of the 2026 calendar year. The FAC regularly meets on the second Wednesday of the month and met three times between July 2025 and December 2025.

List of Accomplishments

- The FAC received a presentation on the Fraud, Waste, and Abuse hotline from staff.
- The FAC filed ongoing status reports with the City Council on a quarterly basis: Measure CC Sales Tax, Measure C Sales Tax, and Real Property Transfer Tax.
- The Assets Ad Hoc Subcommittee completed its review of the City's real property assets.

Scheduled Activities Plan:

- Continue to provide quarterly reports to the City Council on Measure CC proceeds

Finance Advisory Committee 2025 Accomplishments and 2026 Work Plans

- Continue to provide quarterly reports to the City Council on Measure C proceeds
- Review implementation of Measure RE and the Real Property Transfer Tax as approved in November 2020
- Continue to review proposed tax measures or changes to existing tax measures as has historically been done by City Council
- Continue to participate in the Economic Vitality Task Force
- Continue to monitor the communications strategy of financial information on the City's website
- Continue review of User Fees in consideration of annual Consumer Price Index (CPI) updates
- Review and make recommendations for the annual updates to the long-term financial forecast
- Review and discuss budget expenditure challenges/inefficiencies for the future
- Continue the successful, annual Innovations Awards Program (Government Efficiency Subcommittee) to incentivize/recognize staff for ideas or programs that generate cost-savings, revenue enhancements, or improve municipal efficiency
- Engage in other special projects to review challenges created by budget and revenue impacts resulting from fluctuating economic conditions
- The Structural Revenue Review Ad Hoc Subcommittee (created July 13, 2022) will review current revenue sources in the City, as well as the updated revenue map
- Continue to review assets held by the City to identify and optimize opportunities for revenue generation and provide information to Council if desired
- Review revenue and financing opportunities to fund needed infrastructure issues in the City, such as housing and parks
- Review and discuss the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) after publication
- Review success of City Fraud, Waste, and Abuse of City Resources hotline
- Continue to discuss and improve communication with the City Council
