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RESOLUTION NO. 2024-R___

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE CITY'S CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE PURSUANT TO THE **POLITICAL** REFORM ACT, INCORPORATING REFERENCE. THE TERMS OF THE FAIR POLITICAL PRACTICES COMMISSION'S MODEL CONFLICT INTEREST CODE, AS SET FORTH IN TITLE 2 OF CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS SECTION 18730, AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 2023-R026.

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act (Government Code §§ 81000, et seq.), requires every state and local government agency to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code; and

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act requires every local government agency to review its Conflict of Interest Code biennially to determine if it is accurate or, alternatively, that the Conflict of Interest Code must be amended; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the City's current Conflict of Interest Code, as adopted by Resolution No. 2023-R026, needs to be amended due to positions that have been created, eliminated, or revised as well as significant structural reorganization of City departments; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) has adopted a regulation (Title 2 California Code of Regulations § 18730), which may be incorporated by reference, and which may be amended by the FPPC to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act, after public notice and hearing conducted by the FPPC pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, Government Code §§ 11370, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that Appendix "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein, accurately sets forth a list of disclosure categories of reportable

financial interests along with Appendices "B" and "C", attached hereto, a list of designated officials and employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City, California, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE as follows:

- 1. The terms of Title 2 California Code of Regulations § 18730, and any amendments thereto, which have been duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC), are hereby incorporated by reference and, together with the attached Appendices "A" through "C", which designates City officials and employees and establishes respective financial disclosure categories, shall constitute the City of Culver City Conflict of Interest Code.
- 2. Future amendments to the terms of Title 2 California Code of Regulations § 18730, which are duly adopted by the FPPC, shall become part of the Culver City Conflict of Interest Code upon the expiration of forty-five (45) days after receipt by the City Council, unless the City Council, by Resolution, decides not to adopt such amendments in whole or in part. The City Council hereby reserves the right not to adopt any provisions not within the jurisdiction of the FPPC pursuant to Government Code §§ 81000, et seq.
- 3. Designated employees and elected and appointed officials identified in Appendix "B" shall file Statements of Economic Interests (Form 700 Statements) with the City Clerk, to whom the City Council hereby delegates the authority to carry out the duties of filing officer. The Form 700 Statements of designated employees shall be retained as official records by the City Clerk and shall be made available for public inspection and reproduction, in accordance with Government Code § 81008.
- Pursuant to Government Code §§ 87200 et seq., upon receipt of Form 700
 Statements completed by City Council Members, Planning Commissioners, the City Manager,

1	the City Attorney and the Chief Financial Officer/City Treasurer, the City Clerk shall make and
2	retain a copy and forward the original of these Form 700 Statements to the FPPC.
3	5. Resolution No. 2023-R026 is hereby rescinded.
4	6. This Resolution shall take effect on September 23, 2024.

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CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE **APPENDIX "A"**

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GENERAL PROVISIONS

When a designated employee is required to disclose investments and sources of income, he/she need only disclose investments in business entities and sources of income, which do business in the jurisdiction, plan to do business in the jurisdiction or have done business in the jurisdiction, within the past two (2) years. In addition to other activities, a business entity is doing business within the jurisdiction if it owns real property within the jurisdiction. When a designated employee is required to disclose interest in real property, he/she need only disclose real property, which is located in whole or in part within not more than two (2) miles outside the boundaries of the jurisdiction or within (2) miles of any land owned or used by the local government agency.

Designated employees shall disclose their financial interests pursuant to the appropriate disclosure category designated for each position.

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

Category 1: Persons in this category shall disclose all

interests in real property.

Category 2: Persons in this category shall disclose all

investments.

Category 3: Persons in this category shall disclose all

sources of income.

Category 4: Persons in this category shall disclose all

investments in business entities and sources of income of the type which, within the past two years, have contracted with the designated employee's department to provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment.

Category 5: Persons in this category shall disclose any

> business entity in which the designated employee is a director, officer, partner, trustee,

employee or holds any other position.

Category 6: Persons in this category shall disclose all

investments, interests in real property and sources of income subject to the regulatory, permit or licensing authority of the Board or Commission on which the member serves.
