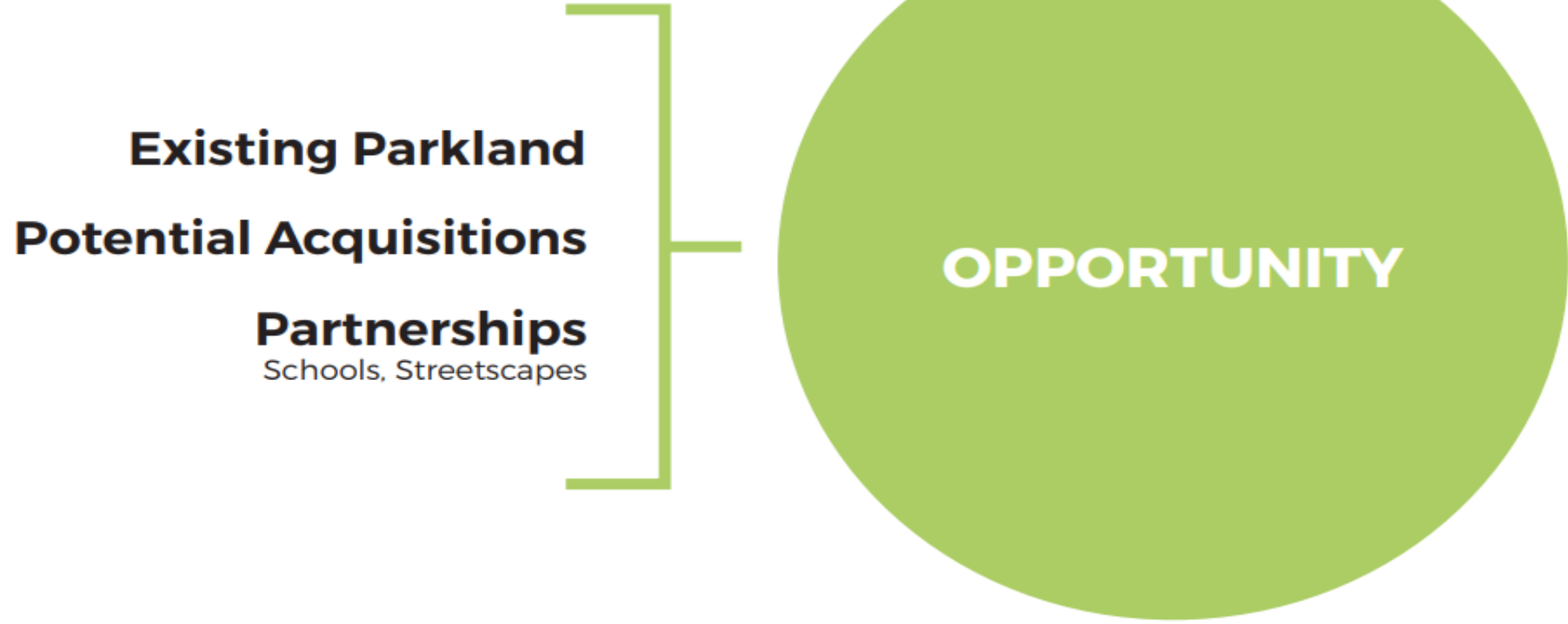

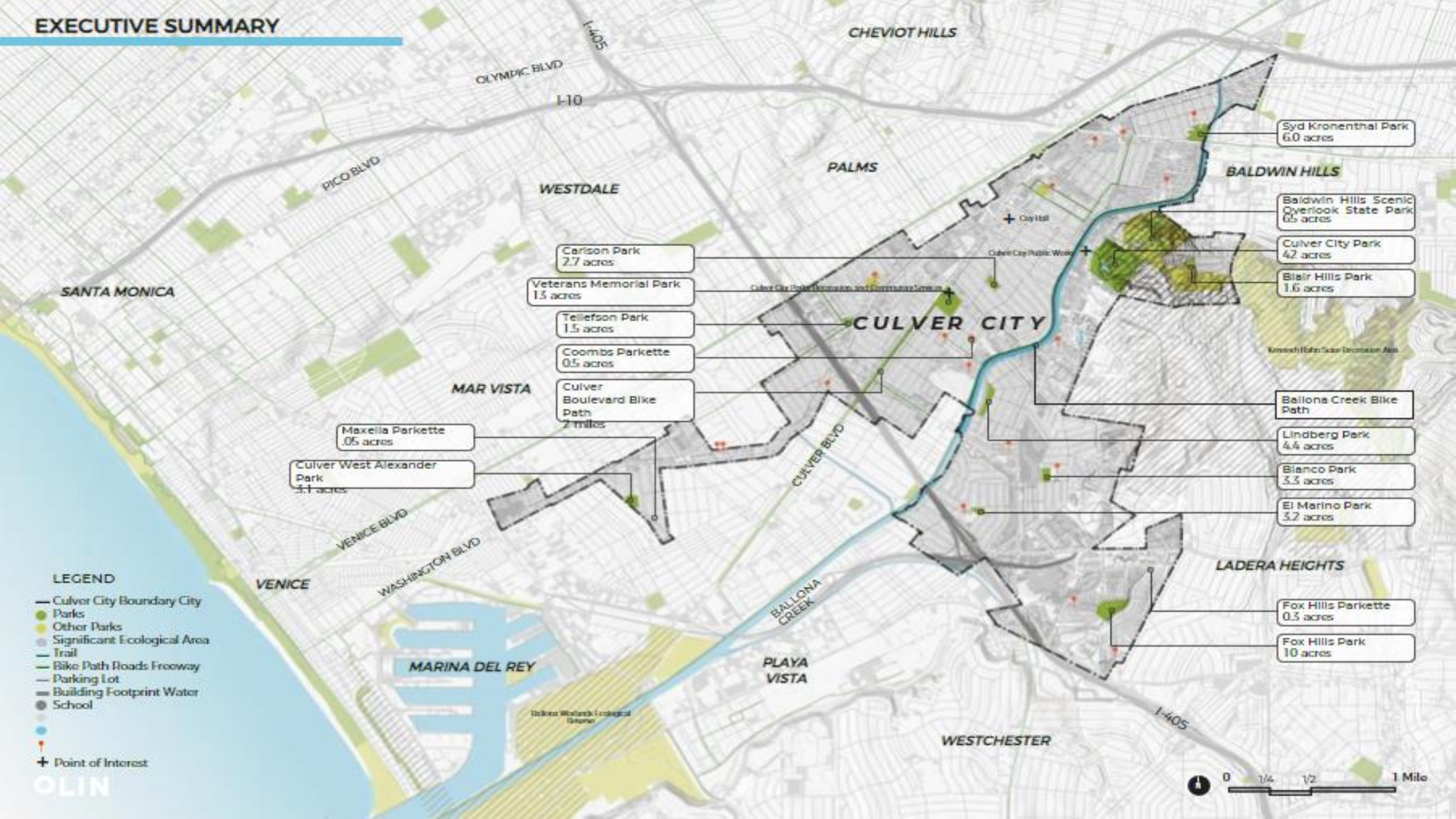

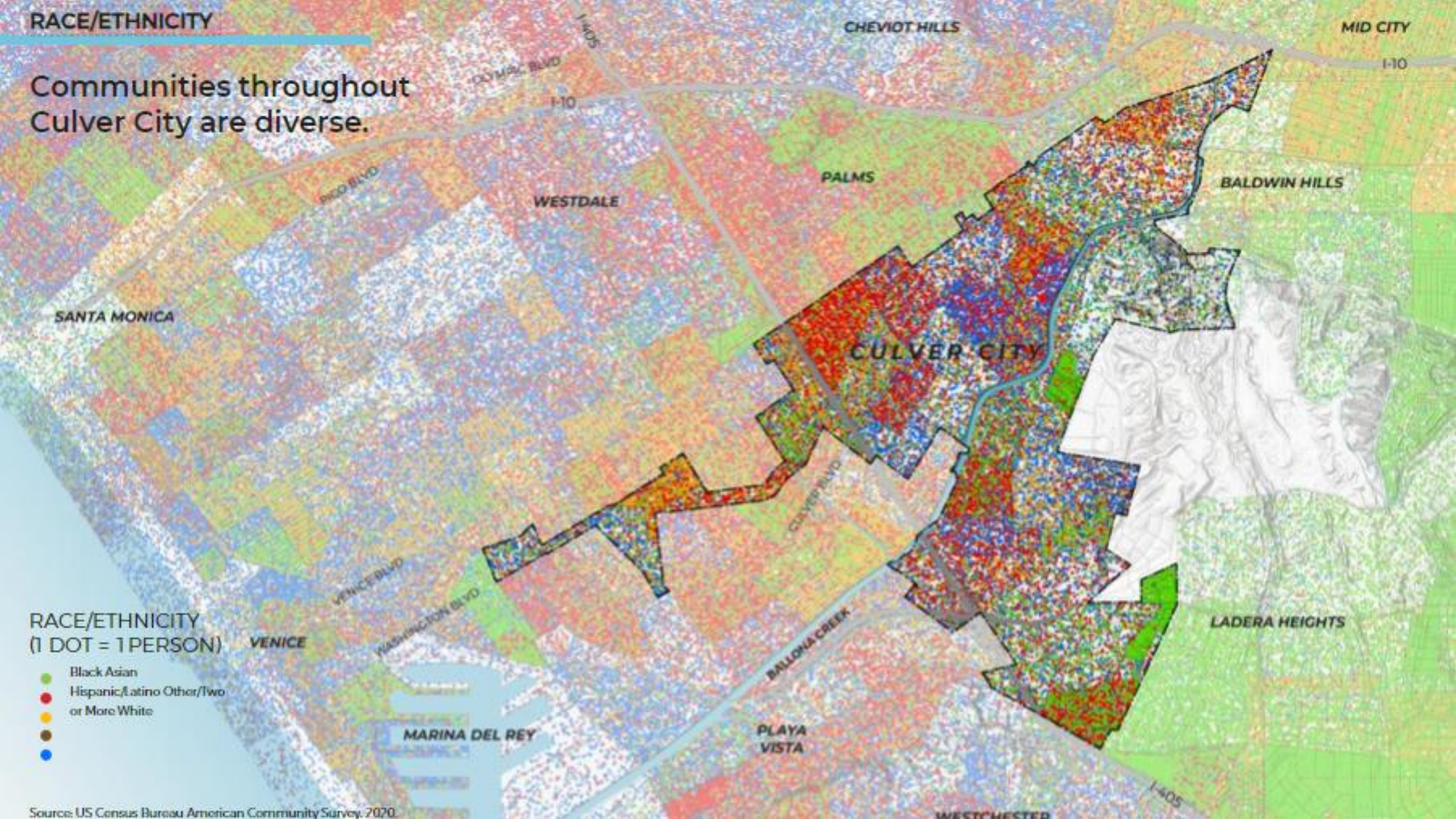

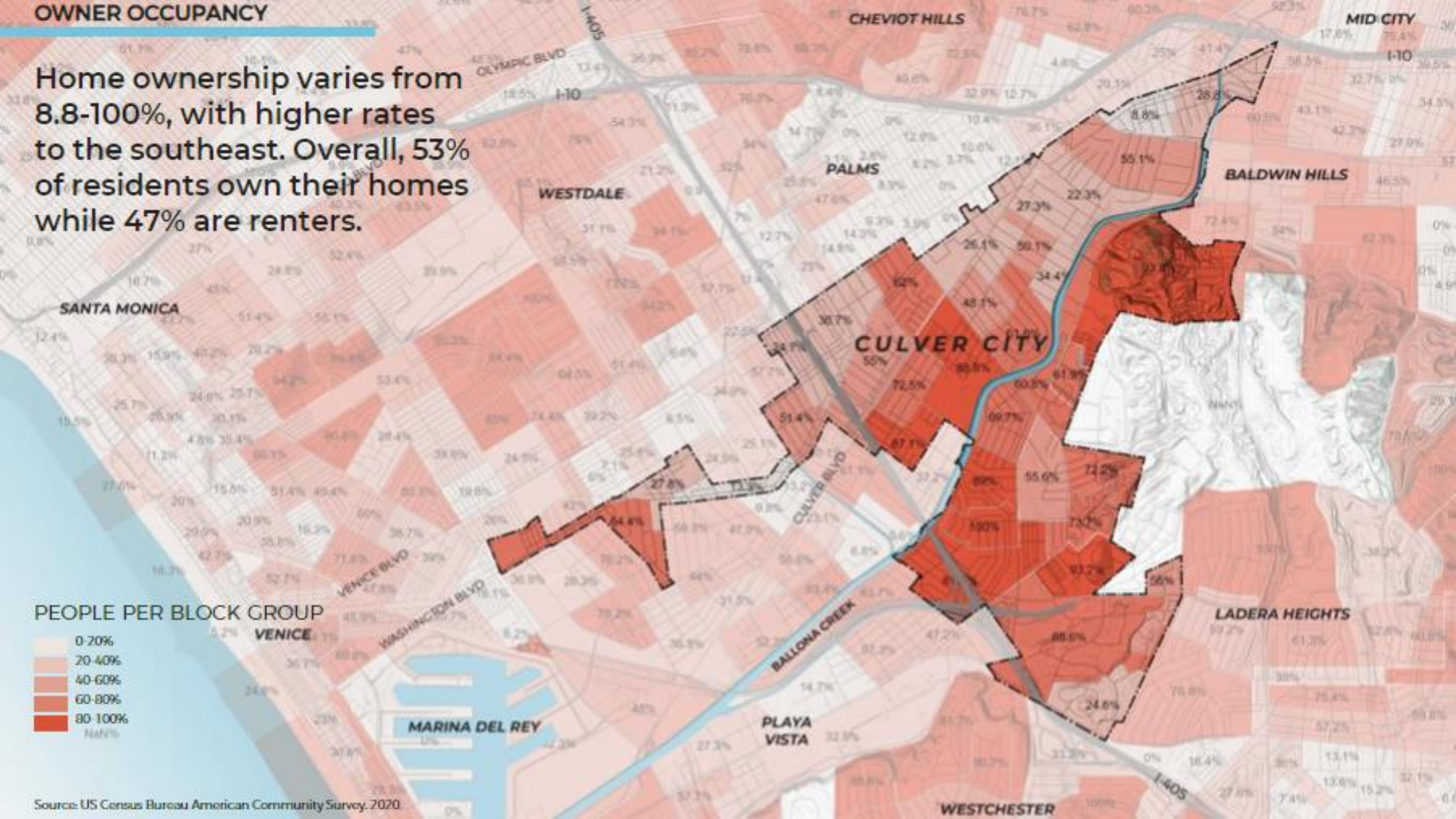
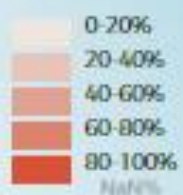

PEOPLE PER BLOCK GROUP



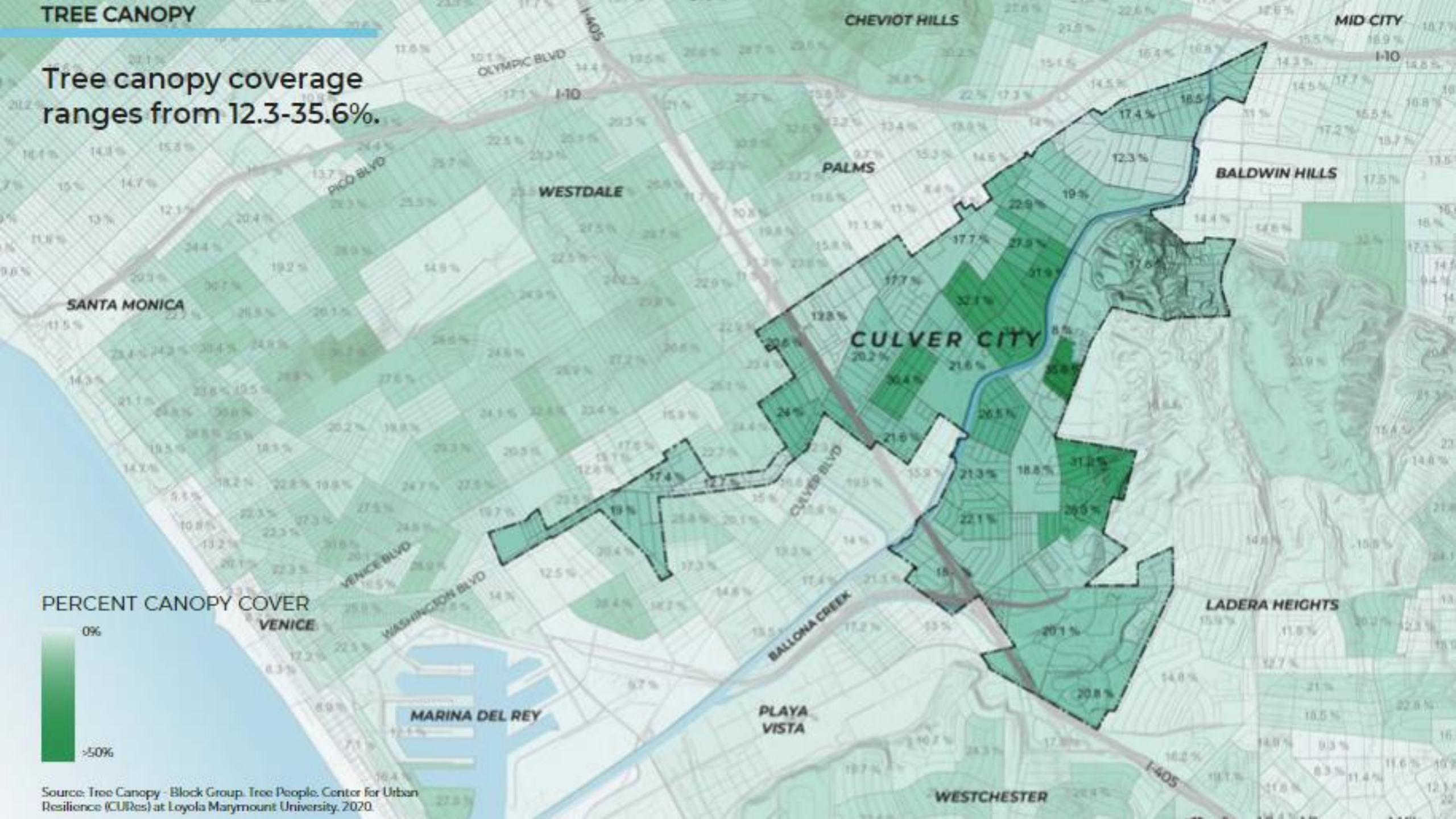
TREE CANOPY

PERCENT CANOPY COVER



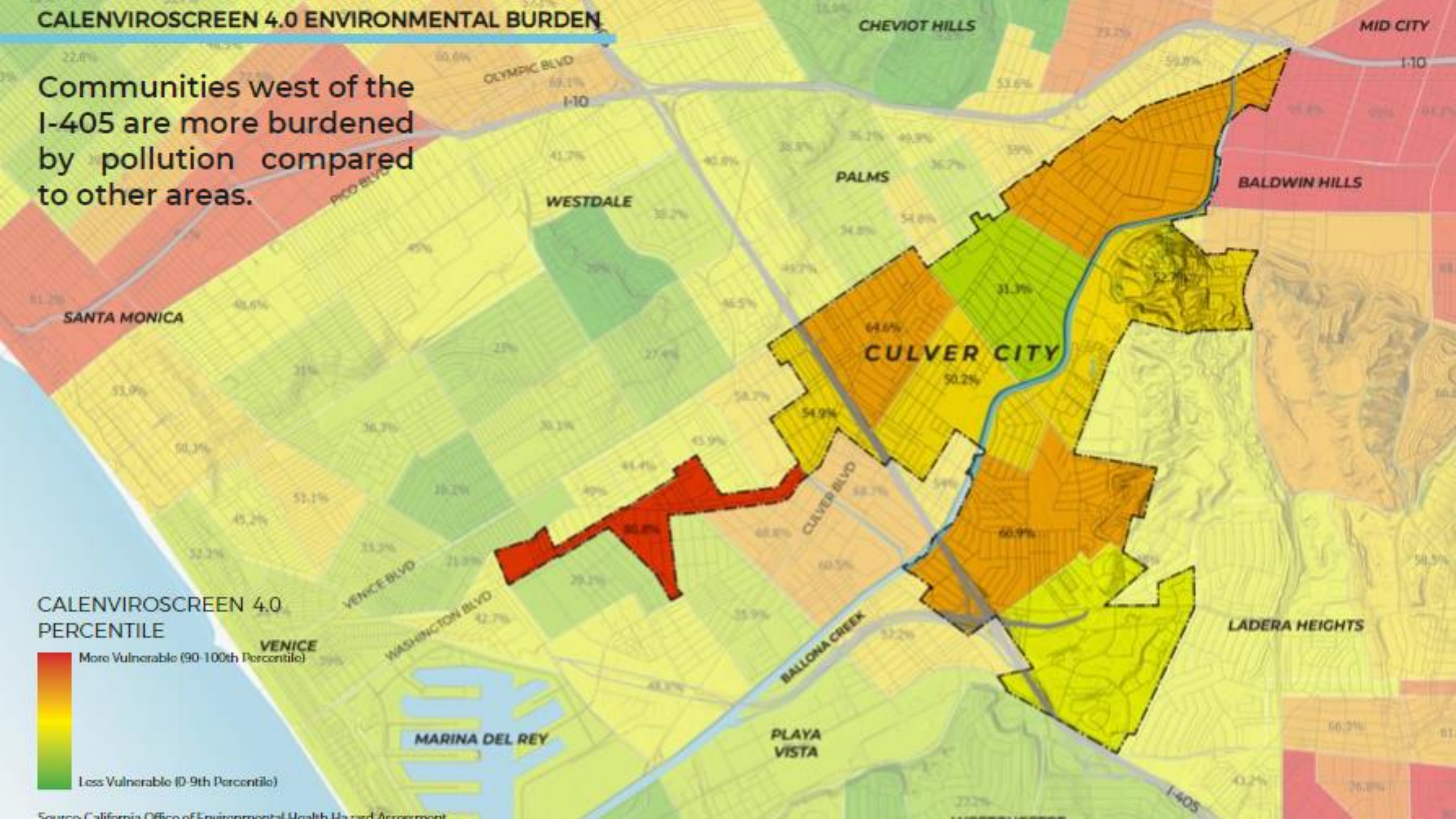

CALENVIROSCREEN 4.0 ENVIRONMENTAL BURDEN

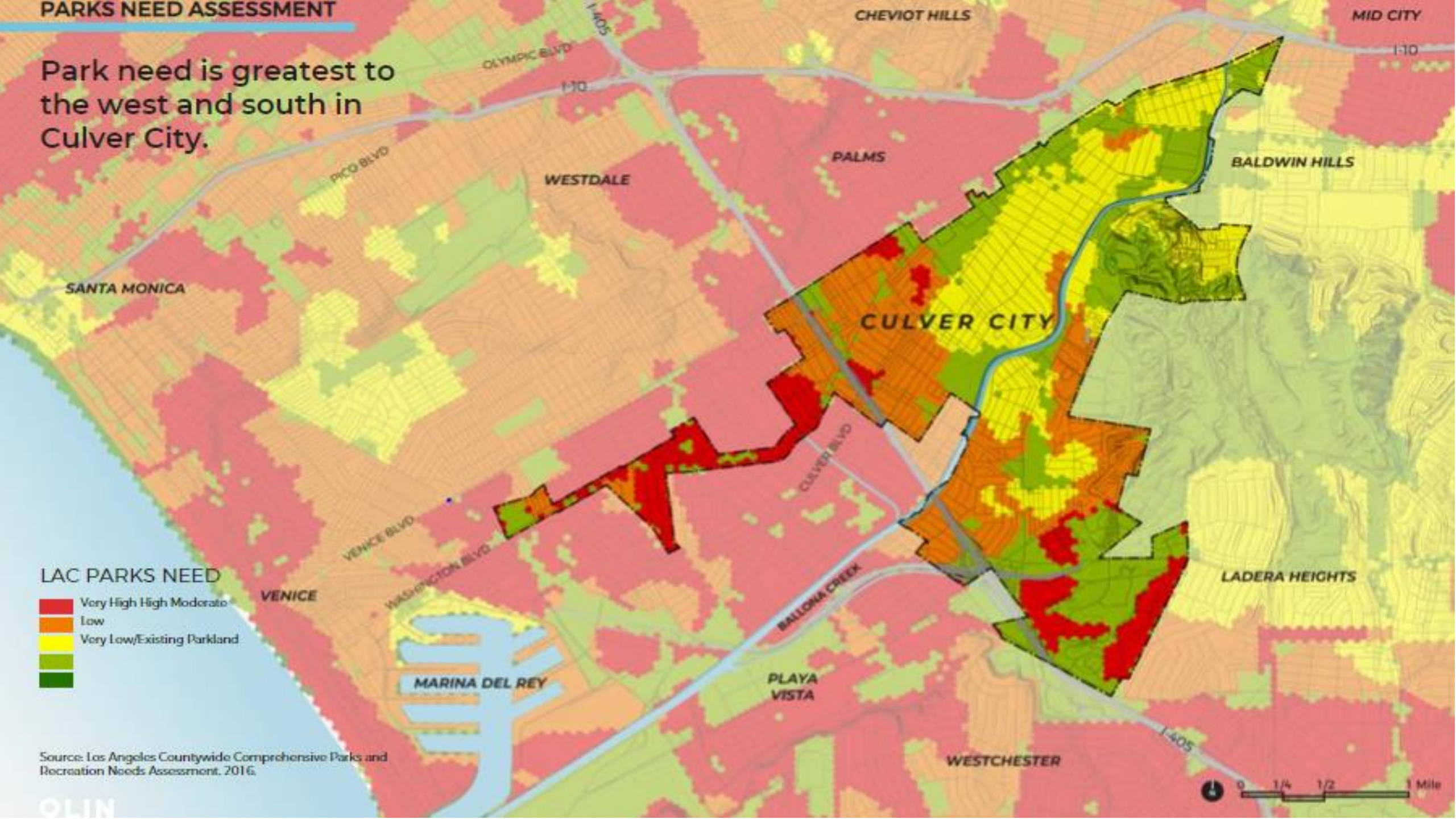
Communities west of the I-405 are more burdened by pollution compared to other areas.

CALENVIROSCREEN 4.0 PERCENTILE



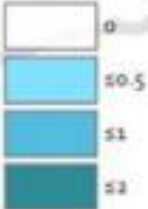
PARKS NEED ASSESSMENT

Park need is greatest to the west and south in Culver City.



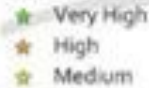
CULVER CITY ENHANCED WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PLANNING

EWMP LID Project Target (ac-ft)



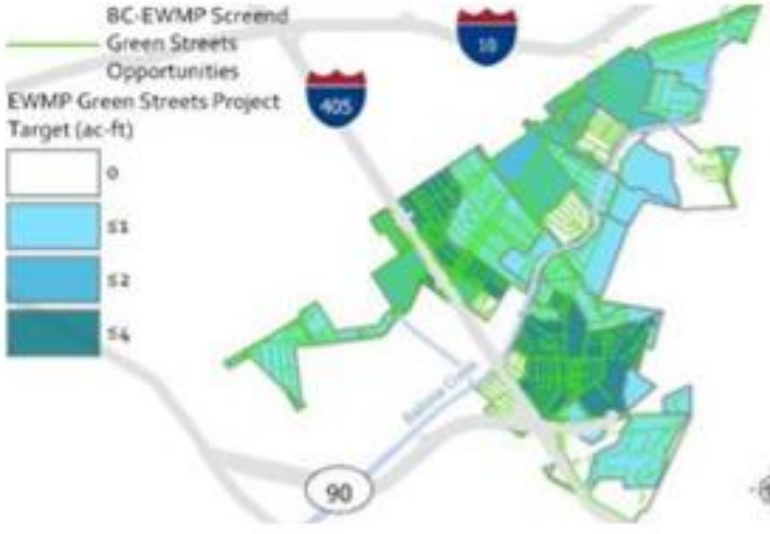

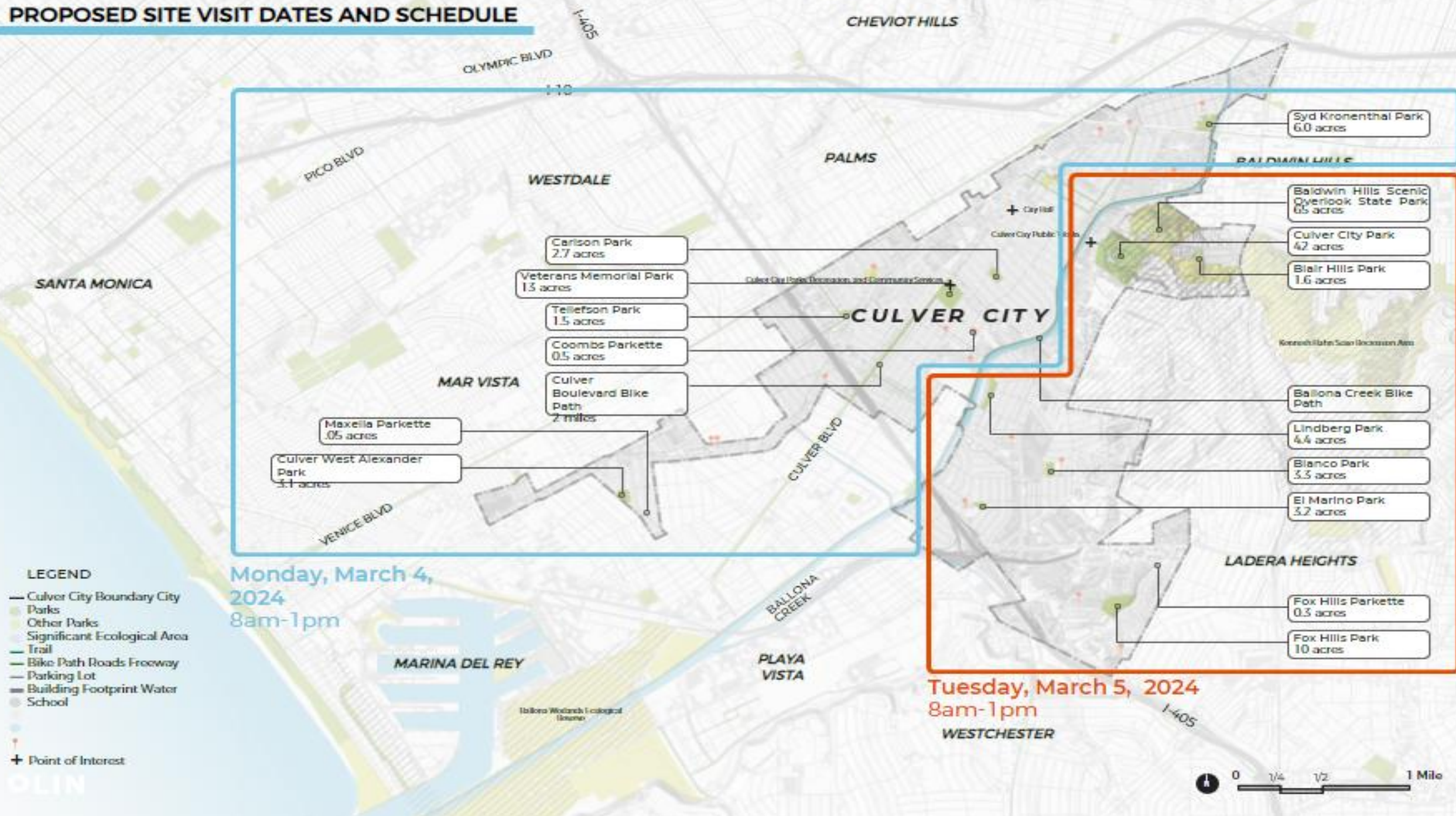
