Description

There are two options to address the shifting land at Bill Botts fields in Culver City Park caused by usage and the eroding landfill beneath the fields, which make the surface unusable for safe play. An option to address the infrastructure deficiencies of Culver City Park fields #2 – 4 is to make temporary improvements including regrading, re-engineering, new irrigation heads, installing new sod, removing backstops and fencing. If this option is chosen, repairs are needed immediately. This option fixes the fields at the surface, without addressing any issues underground and will require repeating every 2-3 years.
