<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> Staff recommends the City Council authorize the Police Department's participation in the California Multi-Jurisdictional Methamphetamine Enforcement Team (Cal-MMET); and approve the Cal-MMET Operational Agreement. <u>BACKGROUND:</u> Cal-MMET was created by the Office of the Governor in 2001 to initiate a regional methamphetamine narcotics investigation and prevention effort focused on combating the growing problem of methamphetamine abuse in the State of California. The program started in Northern California and has, as of 2007, been expanded to include Southern California agencies. Cal-MMET is a grant program managed by the Governor's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP). Regionally, the Cal-MMET grant program is funded through the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. The Cal-MMET Grant Program is fully funded, self-sustaining, and entails multi-agency task forces comprised of police personnel from state, county, and municipal police agencies. The Culver City Police Department has been invited to assign one Police Officer to the Los Angeles County Area Cal-MMET Task Force. This Police Officer position will be fully funded, on a reimbursement basis, by Cal-MMET, via the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department, for all salary, benefits, overtime, and training associated with the task force assignment. <u>ATTACHMENTS:</u> Cal-MMET Operational Agreement.
