

RESOLUTION NO. 2020

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY, CALIFORNIA, CONFIRMING THE MAY 20, 2020 THIRTEENTH SUPPLEMENT TO PUBLIC ORDER (ALLOWING CONDITIONAL PET GROOMING, PET TRAINING, AND CAR WASHES), ISSUED BY THE CITY MANAGER, AS DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES, UNDER CITY OF CULVER CITY EMERGENCY AUTHORITY, DUE TO THE CORONAVIRUS RESPIRATORY DISEASE (COVID-19) PANDEMIC.

WHEREAS, since February 2020, the City of Culver City has been part of a coordinated response involving the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the California Department of Public Health, and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health as a result of the rapidly evolving multinational outbreak of the coronavirus respiratory disease (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted by Culver City Municipal Code (CCMC) Section 3.09.020, on March 14, 2020, the City Manager, as the Director of Emergency Services, issued a Proclamation of Local Emergency due to the outbreak and spread of Coronavirus (COVID-19), which was ratified by the City Council on March 18, 2020 by Resolution No. 2020-R015. Such action followed the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health's and the Chair of the Board of Supervisor's declarations of a local health emergency and the State of California's declaration of a State of Emergency on March 4, 2020, and the President's declaration of a National Emergency on March 13, 2020; and

WHEREAS, as of May 20, 2020, Johns Hopkins University reported 4,995,127 confirmed COVID-19 cases globally and 328,079 deaths; 1,551,102 cases nationally, with 93,416 deaths; and 83,869 cases in California, with 3,485 deaths. Further, as of May 20, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health reported 40,857 cases in Los

Angeles County with 1,970 deaths, which includes 130 cases and 14 deaths in Culver City. As there is a rapid increase in cases and ongoing significant risk of infection throughout the United States and the State of California, the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the California Department of Public Health are recommending that counties and cities throughout the U.S. continue to actively address the COVID-19 pandemic and implement aggressive measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, during this unprecedented time, various orders have been issued by the State of California and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, as well as a number of our neighboring communities, designed to protect both residential and commercial tenants from eviction during the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, under the authority of CCMC Section 3.09.020, the City Manager issued a Public Order enacting new City measures to protect members of the public and City workers from undue risk of COVID-19 (“March 16 Order”). The March 16 Order included, among other things, temporary restrictions on certain establishments throughout Culver City, in which large numbers of people tend to gather and remain in close proximity. Since the issuance of the March 16 Order, various supplemental orders have been issued by the State of California and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, as well as a number of our neighboring communities, including the City of Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, the City Manager issued a First Supplement to Public Order enacting further City measures to protect members of the public and City workers from undue risk of COVID-19 (“March 20 Order”). The March 20 Order was enacted after the City of Los Angeles and Los Angeles County Department of Public Health issued a similar public order. The March 20 Order issued, and incorporated by reference, any and all orders

2 *HOME*, issued by Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti on March 19, 2020; and

3 WHEREAS, since the March 19 *SAFER AT HOME* Order, Los Angeles Mayor
4 Garcetti issued revised *SAFER AT HOME* Orders on April 1, April 10, and April 27, 2020. In
5 step with the City of Los Angeles, on April 7, 2020, April 11, 2020, and May 1, 2020
6 respectively, the City Manager issued a Fourth Supplement to Public Order (incorporating the
7 April 1 *SAFER AT HOME* Order), a Seventh Supplement to Public Order (incorporating the
8 April 10 *SAFER AT HOME* Order), and a Ninth Supplement to Public Order (incorporating the
9 April 27 *SAFER AT HOME* Order); and

10 WHEREAS, on May 7, 2020, the City Manager issued a Tenth Supplement to
11 Public Order consistent with the Los Angeles County Roadmap to Recover (May 7 Order),
12 permitting florists, toy stores, clothing stores, music stores, and sporting goods stores to open
13 for curbside pick-up, and auto dealer showrooms were permitted to open, with strict physical
14 distancing and infection control protocols in place; and

15 WHEREAS, on May 14, 2020 the City Manager issues an Eleventh Supplement
16 to Public Order (May 14 Order), to align with the County of Los Angeles' Health Officer May
17 13th *Safer at Home Order for Control of COVID-19*, and extended all previous orders until
18 further notice, except where noted, and permitting certain limited re-openings with curbside
19 pick-up or walk-up service only; the Order included wearing a cloth face covering whenever
20 there is or can be contact with others who are non-household members, in both public and
21 private places, and the Order additionally extended relaxation of parking restrictions and
22 signage restrictions to facilitate the curbside pickup, and extended the fee waiver for outdoor
23 dining fees and valet parking fees, until June 30, 2020; and

1 WHEREAS, consistent with the County of Los Angeles and City of Los Angeles,
2 on May 20, 2020, the City Manager issued a Thirteen Supplement to Public Order (May 20
3 Order), to address and allow conditional pet grooming, pet training and car washes that were
4 previously prohibited under earlier *SAFER AT HOME* Orders.

5 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City, California,
6 DOES HEREBY RESOLVE as follows:

7 1. Pursuant to CCMC Section 3.09.020.B.1.h(2), the City Council hereby
8 confirms the Thirteenth Supplement to Public Order issued by the Director of
9 Emergency Services on May 20, 2020, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated
10 herein as though fully set forth.

11 2. The City Council finds that this Resolution is not subject to the California
12 Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) pursuant to CEQA guidelines, California Code of
13 Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, §15060(c)(2) [the activity will not result in a direct or
14 reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment] and §15060(c)(3)
15 [the activity is not a project as defined in §15378] because it has no potential for
16 resulting in physical change to the environment, directly or indirectly.



**Thirteenth Supplement to Public Order Under
City of Culver City Emergency Authority**

Issue Date: May 20, 2020

**Subject: City Measures to Address COVID-19 Road to Recovery:
Pet Grooming and Training, and Car Washes**

This May 20, 2020 Thirteenth Supplement to Public Order is to address and allow conditional pet grooming, pet training, and car washes, in the City of Culver City. Effective as of the date of this Order, and by virtue of authority vested in me as the Director of Emergency Services, pursuant to the provisions of CCMC Section 3.09.020.B.1.h(2), to make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of persons, property and the environment as affected by such emergency, I hereby order:

1. Pet grooming and/or training retail stores (stand-alone, non-mobile, not part of a pet food and medication supply store, not inside a mall or shopping center except those with an exterior entrance) are permitted to open for curbside and walk-up drop-off and pick-up only. Before re-opening, the business must complete, post and implement the Protocol for Retail Establishments Opening for Curbside Pickup ([LA County Public Health Appendix B](#)). Businesses are required to adhere to all Culver City and Los Angeles County public health guidelines, including physical distancing and infection control practices to protect employees and customers.
2. Pet food and pet medication supply stores may resume pet grooming and/or training services after completing, posting, and implementing a revised Protocol for Social Distancing ([LA County Public Health Appendix A](#)) that includes the grooming and/or training services. Businesses are required to adhere to all Culver City and Los Angeles County public health guidelines, including physical distancing and infection control practices to protect employees and customers.
3. Mobile grooming and/or mobile pet training businesses are permitted to operate. Before re-opening, the business must complete, post and implement the Protocol for Retail Establishments Opening for Curbside Pickup ([LA County Public Health Appendix B](#)), a copy of which must be carried in each of the business's mobile vehicles at all times. Businesses are required to adhere to all Culver City and Los Angeles County public health guidelines, including physical distancing and infection control practices to protect employees and customers. Customers are not allowed inside the business's mobile vehicle.

4. Car washes are permitted to operate. Before re-opening, the business must complete, post and implement the Protocol for Retail Establishments Opening for Curbside Pickup (LA County Public Health Appendix B). Customers must remain outside at all times. Businesses are required to adhere to all Culver City and Los Angeles County public health guidelines, including physical distancing and infection control practices to protect employees and customers.
5. Except as specifically modified or amended by this Thirteenth Supplement to Public Order, this Order in addition to, and does not supersede nor replace, any previously issued orders, which shall remain in full force and effect. All Stay at Home orders remain in place. Public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring outside of a single household or living unit continue to be prohibited.
6. Additional social distancing, infection control, and health and safety measures and guidelines may be imposed at any time, in my sole discretion, in order to ensure the protection of the public's health and safety, and the intent of each and every Public Order is carried out.

Any violation of this Thirteenth Supplement to Public Order may be enforced under the CCMC, which provides for fines not to exceed \$1,000 or imprisonment not to exceed six months. Each individual officer should use their discretion in enforcing this order and always keep the intent of the order in mind.

This Thirteenth Supplement to Public Order shall be effective immediately and shall remain in effect until superseded, amended, modified or rescinded.
