The monthly salary for **Parking Enforcement Supervisor** is **\$4,980.17 - \$6,078.76**.

HOW TO APPLY

Individuals that submit incomplete application materials may not receive full consideration for the position. E-mailed or faxed application materials will not be accepted.

THE POSITION

The Parking Enforcement Supervisor is a civilian supervisor that is responsible for coordinating the day-to-day work activities associated with parking enforcement and school pedestrian safety. The incumbents of this classification require and receive minimal supervision, and function within general procedural and policy limits.

As the supervisor of Parking Enforcement Officers and Crossing Guards the position is responsible for overseeing work performance and training along with scheduling work assignments of those subordinate employees. Additionally, the position coordinates and schedules parking Citation Hearings; resolves complex technical and procedural issues through their understanding of the laws governing parking enforcement; and coordinates legal and fee updates related to parking meter rates and parking enforcement including local, state and federal regulation mandates. The position also reviews and responds to contested parking citations including courteously and tactfully assisting the public with parking enforcement information of a non-routine nature. The Parking Enforcement Supervisor also supervises parking meter collection by planning, scheduling, and assigning collection routes; monitoring meter collection money counts; and arranging for the deposit of collected monies. Other areas of responsibility include overseeing contract services in relation to the parking enforcement program and acting as a liaison for the Police Department on city-wide and multi-jurisdictional parking related working groups, meetings, and organizations.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Any combination equivalent to training and experience that could likely provide the required knowledge, skills, and abilities would be qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge, skills, and abilities would be: High school graduation or equivalent and three (3) years of responsible work experience in a law enforcement environment issuing parking citations and processing parking regulation issues plus two years experience providing responsible administrative staff assistance. One (1) year supervisory or lead worker experience is desirable. An Associate of Science degree in Criminal Justice, Business or Public Administration, or related field is desirable.

License and Certification: Possession of a California Class C driver license.

Work Schedule/Availability: Must be available and willing to work rotating shifts, nights, weekends and holidays as needed. This position works a 4/10 schedule.

Notes:

1) Applicants may be disqualified for any of the following reasons: a conviction record, and/or negative employment references.

2) A conviction shall include a plea, verdict, or finding of guilt regardless of whether sentence is imposed by the court.

EXAMINATION PROCEDURES

Applicants must receive a passing score on all examination components in order to be placed on the eligible list.

COMPONENT	WEIGHT
• Written Examination: To measure writing ability, customer service, technical and supervisory skills.	30%
• Counseling Exercise: To demonstrate supervisory skill and ability.	40%
• Appraisal Interview: To evaluate training, experience and personal qualifications.	30%
• Background Investigation and Polygraph: To determine suitability for the position of Parking Enforcement Supervisor.	QUALIFYING
• Psychological Screening & Medical Examination: Standard exams to determine suitability for the position of Parking Enforcement Supervisor.	QUALIFYING
