The meeting body will receive comments from the public on any item of interest to the public (not listed on the agenda) that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the specific body. The body cannot legally take action on any item not appearing on the agenda. Such items may be referred for administrative action or scheduled on a future agenda.

WRITTEN COMMENTS: Please provide comments via eComment at www.culvercity.gov/meetings. Locate the appropriate meeting and click on the highlighted eComment link. You may need to register once. Those comments received 4 hours in advance of the start time will be provided to the body members and become part of the official public record through a motion to receive and file correspondence. If you do not want your personal information included in the official record, please do not include your address, phone number or other private information in your comments. Please be advised, written comments WILL NOT be read aloud during the meeting.

ORAL COMMENTS: Speakers must register to speak online at www.culvercity.gov/agendas. Please indicate how you will attend (in-person or virtually) and the agenda item(s) for which you wish to make a comment. Speakers will be called in chronological order, based on when they registered. At the start of each agenda item, staff will read aloud the names of those who have requested to speak on an agenda item. Requests to speak must be received before the start of the public comment period for that agenda item or will not be considered. A QR code will be available for those wishing to sign up once they arrive to the meeting. Requests to speak will no longer be accepted through Zoom chat, only by completing the online form. Those without internet should contact (310) 253-5851 during business hours for help signing up to speak in advance or by speaking to staff upon arrival to the meeting room.

AUTHORITY OF PRESIDING OFFICER:

Section 611 of the City Charter provides that during any public meeting, all persons shall have the right to address the City Council, and any City commission, board or committee, subject to reasonable rules of decorum and time limits established by ordinance or the presiding officer. Therefore, the presiding officer may, from time to time, establish different time limits than those listed in this Agenda in order to effectively conduct City business. The presiding officer may also, from time to time, re-order the items on the agenda in order to effectively conduct the City Council meeting.

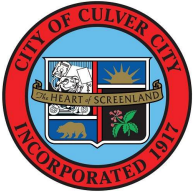

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that City Council (1) approve a general services agreement with G.T. Michelli Co. LLC for Culver City Transfer Station Axle Scale System Replacement in an amount not-to-exceed \$310,000; (2) approve a three-year professional services agreement with G.T. Michelli Co. LLC for Transfer Station Scale Calibration, Maintenance, and On-Call Repair for \$120,000 annually; and (3) authorize the City Manager to approve two additional one-year terms in an amount not-to-exceed \$120,000 annually.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

The City owns and operates a 500 ton per day solid waste and recycling Transfer Station Facility located at 9255 Jefferson Boulevard, operating six (6) days a week. The tipping floor is operational between the hours of 4:30 AM and 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday, and from 5:30 AM to 1:00 PM on Saturday. Solid waste, organics, and recycling collected by the Public Works Environmental Programs and Operations Division (EPO) trucks is transferred to tractor-trailer transfer trucks at the facility for transit to area landfills, composting facilities, or recycling centers. Roll-off service, green

waste processing, recycled material handling, and all other waste management operations are based at this facility.

Collection vehicles are weighed on the upper-level platform scale before they enter the facility for billing purposes and to track waste stream tonnages for reporting to the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services, in order to ensure the facility stays within its 500 ton per day limit and for other reporting and billing purposes. Transfer trucks are weighed on the lower-level tunnel axle scale as they are being loaded to assure they do not exceed legal maximum axle loads per the California Vehicle Code.

The current scale system was installed in 2016 and requires regular maintenance due to the heavy usage, with increased waste volumes, poor drainage, and outdated and undersized equipment causing persistent failures that impact operations.

Staff released RFP #2672 for Transfer Station Axle Scale System Replacement on April 16, 2026 to receive bids to design and install a replacement system to upgrade the current scale system to one with a 110,000 pound load cell capacity, resolve drainage issues in the scale area that cause water and leachate ponding, and new software/hardware to run the system. Two proposals were received on May 21, 2026, and the proposal submitted by G.T. Michelli Co. LLC was the best qualified. G.T. Michelli operates out of Santa Fe Springs and has installed new scale systems for other clients such as Republic Services, San Diego County, and California Highway Patrol (CHP).

Concurrently, the City's current maintenance contract for scale maintenance is expiring on June 30, 2026. RFP #2671 for Transfer Station Scale Calibration, Maintenance, and On-Call Repair was released on May 21, 2026, and on June 4, 2026, one proposal was received, also by G.T. Michelli Co. LLC.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Funding for the General Services Agreement for installation is included in the Adopted Budget for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 in the Capital Improvement Program in Account #20280000.730100.PZ948 (Transfer Station Improvements).

Funding for the Professional Services Agreement is included in the Adopted Budget for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 in Account #20260410.619800 (Other Contractual Services) for one year. Funding for additional years will be included in future fiscal year budgets.

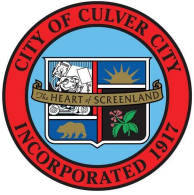

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council adopt a Resolution commemorating the 250th Anniversary (Semiquincentennial) of the founding of the United States of America.

BACKGROUND

On July 4, 2026, the United States will commemorate the 250th anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence and the founding of the nation. The Semiquincentennial marks a significant occasion for communities across the country to reflect upon the nation's history, celebrate its achievements, acknowledge its challenges, and inspire future generations to engage in civic life.

On July 4th, cities will mark a historic milestone in the nation's history. Adoption of the Resolution will affirm the City's commitment to honoring the principles of democracy, liberty, diversity, civic participation, and public service that have shaped the United States since its founding in 1776.

Federal, state, and local governments, educational institutions, nonprofit organizations, and community groups are planning commemorative events and activities recognizing this historic milestone. The anniversary provides an opportunity to honor the individuals and institutions that have contributed to the nation's development while reaffirming the democratic ideals embodied in the Declaration of Independence and the United States Constitution.

DISCUSSION

The proposed Resolution recognizes the significance of the nation's 250-year history and encourages residents to participate in educational, cultural, and civic activities associated with the Semiquincentennial celebration. The Resolution acknowledges the enduring values of freedom, equality, representative government, and civic engagement that continue to guide the nation and its communities.

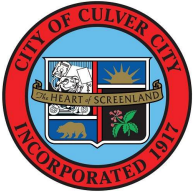

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council (1) adopt a resolution authorizing the City of Culver City to join Public Innovation, Solutions, and Management (PRISM) for the City's general and excess municipal liability insurance coverage effective fiscal year (FY) 2026/2027; and (2) authorize the City Manager to execute all necessary required membership agreements to bind coverage with PRISM and related carriers.

BACKGROUND

As a municipal organization, the City of Culver City is authorized to manage the risks associated with local government operations, including general liability and lawsuits.

Since 2017, the City has maintained stand-alone coverage in the open market and used an insurance broker to purchase and place insurance programs to mitigate large risks that could hinder the City's ability to operate and provide services to our community. The City's current insurance

broker is Alliant Insurance Services, Inc.

As a matter of due diligence, staff conducted an analysis of viable Joint Powers Authorities (JPAs) for California municipal risk and subsequently submitted a variety of insurance applications and conducted a detailed review and analysis of the City's insurance portfolio. Staff's intent was to evaluate not only premium costs, but also key differences in coverage provisions, claims administration and control, membership characteristics, and available resources among four JPAs.

DISCUSSION

City staff reviewed several potential JPAs including:

- Authority for California Cities Excess Liability (ACCEL);
- California Joint Powers Insurance Authority (CJPIA); and
- Public Risk Innovation, Solutions, and Management (PRISM).

Staff reviewed the benefits and key considerations of participating in a JPA. The benefits presented included shared risk, reduced exposure to large losses, access to legal and risk management resources, collectively negotiated coverage terms, and opportunities for member governance and oversight. Considerations included shared liability for losses incurred by other members, the potential for increased contributions or assessments, reduced individual control over coverage, and requirements to provide advance notice to exit the pool.

Staff's recommendation is to pursue membership with PRISM for General and Excess Liability. Joining PRISM will not only strengthen the City's risk management strategy but also provide significantly greater financial protection against large or catastrophic losses through risk sharing, and cost-effective premiums. Coverage Enhancements and Benefits under PRISM include:

- General Liability: Options for Lower deductibles and higher coverage limits at preferred prices.
- Governed by the Board of Directors composed of its members.
- Risk Management and Safety Resources - at no cost to members.
- \$1,000/annual Grant for training, equipment, services, and conferences related to safety and an annual actuarial subsidy of up to \$1,000 available for General Liability.

PRISM is governed by its members. Upon Council approval of membership:

- The City Council will appoint a primary representative on the PRISM Governing Board.
- The City Manager will designate a staff member as the alternate representative.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Staff anticipates that the City will realize approximately 29% in cost savings while maintaining the current level of insurance coverage across all policy areas, with exception of enhanced coverage for Flood/Earthquake and Property insurance.

The Adopted Budget for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 includes sufficient funding to cover \$4,481,291.00 for the insurance premiums in the following accounts:

- Account No. 30922220.650100 (Premium/Claims - Insurance Premiums Liability);
- Account No. 30922220.650200 (Premium/Claims - Insurance Premiums Other); and
- Account No. 30922220.650400 (Premium/Claims - Workers Compensation Insurance Premiums).

These accounts are located in the Human Resources Department section of the budget book under the Premium/Claims expenditures.

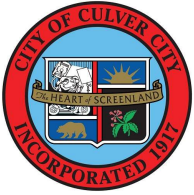

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council approve the recommended Fiscal Year 2026-2027 Insurance Policy Renewals, through Alliant Insurance Services, with a premium of approximately \$4,481,291.00, plus taxes and fees for a one-year period beginning on July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027.

BACKGROUND

The City is self-insured and annually purchases lines of insurance coverage to minimize the adverse effects of accidental losses and claims against the City.

The City is self-insured for major risk programs such as property, liability, excess earthquake, flood liability, general liability, auto, workers' compensation and other lines of insurance. To protect the assets of the City from potential loss, the City purchases various lines of insurance coverage for these risks. To assist in the purchase of various lines of insurance, the City entered into an agreement with Alliant for professional insurance brokerage services.

DISCUSSION

Alliant has marketed the City's insurance program to carriers and has solicited pricing amounting to \$4,481,291.00, which is 29% less costly than the current year while providing the same level of coverage for all policies with the exception of enhanced coverage levels for Flood/Earthquake and Property insurance coverage(s). The following is premium information for Fiscal Year 2025-2026 and renewal insurance premiums for Fiscal Year 2026-2027:

The purchase of insurance is exempt from formal competitive bidding requirements, pursuant to Culver City Municipal Code Sections 3.07.065.A and C.2, provided the purchase is based upon competitive quotations. Alliant's marketing of the City's insurance program to carriers, as discussed above, satisfies this requirement.
