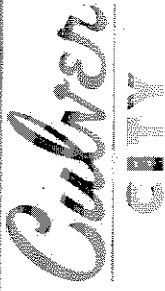

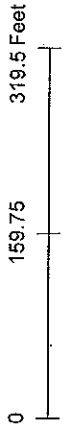

I completely endorse designating the proposed routes as dog pathways. In my experience, most parks that do not allow dogs, do allow them "on-leash" on the paved sidewalks, where they are not bothering the public who are using the recreational part of the parks. I understand why parks do not allow dogs on the grass, for several reasons, including: owner's not always picking up the dog's messes and owners letting the dogs run up to children and adults who may be afraid of dogs. However, if the dogs are properly supervised on the paths (and you may want to include some poop-bag dispensers at the trash cans), it would be a great improvement.
