On January 10, 2024, the Finance Advisory Committee (FAC) approved the transmittal of the following information to the City Council:

2023 FAC Accomplishments

- At the request of City Council, the FAC reviewed the Cannabis Distribution Tax rate and made a recommendation to City Council to reduce the rate from 2% to 0%.
- On December 11, 2023, the FAC received a commendation from the City Council commemorating the FAC's 10-year anniversary and its contributions to the City.
- The FAC filed ongoing status reports with the City Council on a quarterly basis: Measure CC Sales Tax, Measure C Sales Tax, and Real Property Transfer Tax.
- The FAC participated in the Economic Vitality Task Force (EVTF).
- The FAC facilitated the Inaugural Affordable Housing Speaker Series Event held on September 14, 2023.
- The Assets Ad Hoc Subcommittee performed a review of City-owned real estate assets.

• The FAC facilitated the second annual Innovation Awards with nearly tripled submissions from the first year.

2023-2024 FAC Scheduled Activities / Work Plan

- Continue to provide quarterly reports to the City Council on Measure CC proceeds
- 2. Continue to provide quarterly reports to the City Council on Measure C proceeds
- 3. Review implementation of Measure RE and the Real Property Transfer Tax as approved in November 2020
- 4. Review implementation of Measure BL (Business License Tax Measure)
- 5. Continue to monitor the communications strategy of financial information on the City's website
- Review and make recommendations for the annual updates to the longterm financial forecast
- 7. Review and discuss budget expenditure challenges/inefficiencies for the future
- 8. Continue the successful, annual Innovations Awards Program (Government Efficiency Subcommittee) to incentivize/recognize staff for ideas or programs that generate cost-savings, revenue enhancements, or improve municipal efficiency
- 9. Engage in other special projects to review challenges created by budget and revenue impacts resulting from fluctuating economic conditions
- 10. The Structural Revenue Review Ad Hoc Subcommittee (created July 13, 2022) will review current revenue sources in the City, as well as the updated revenue map
- 11. Review the updated User Fee Study
- 12. Analyze assets held by the City to identify and optimize opportunities for revenue generation
- 13. Review revenue and financing opportunities to fund needed infrastructure issues in the City, such as housing and parks

- 14. Review and discuss the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) after publication
- 15. Review success of City Fraud, Waste, and Abuse of City Resources hotline
- 16. Continue to discuss and improve communication with the City Council
- 17. Review parking meter fees and associated issues
