

CITY	Do you have any dedicated pickleball courts?
Belmont	No. Belmont only has 4 courts in town.
Beverly Hills	Yes . Beverly Hills has 12 dedicated Pickleball Courts.
Fountain Valley	Yes. Fountain Valley has 4 dedicated Pickleball Courts.
Gardena	No dedicated pickleball courts.
Hawthorne	No dedicated pickleball courts.
Irvine	Yes. Irvine has 14 dedicated Pickleball Courts.
Laguna Beach	Yes. Laguna Beach has 6 outdoor dedicated pickleball courts, 3 dual striped courts for tennis and Pickleball, and 2 indoor courts with Basketball and Volleyball lines.
Long Beach	Yes. Long Beach has 10 dedicated Pickleball Courts.
Los Angeles	Yes. Los Angeles has 16 dedicated outdoor fee based Pickleball Courts and 4 dedicated Open Play Pickleball Courts.
Manhattan Beach	Manhattan Beach has 7 dedicated Pickleball Courts.
Mission Viejo	Yes. Mission Viejo has 8 dedicated Pickleball Courts and 12 dual striped courts.
Redondo Beach	No dedicated pickleball courts.
San Luis Obispo	Yes, San Luis Obispo has 3 dedicated Pickleball Courts.
Santa Monica	Yes, at Memorial Park and Ocena View Park.
Tustin	Yes. Tustin has 8 courts at Veterans Sports Park and recently added courts at Alleygrove Promenade.
West Hollywood	Yes. West Hollywood has 11 dedicated Pickleball Courts.
Yorba Linda	Yes, in November the Commission approved converting one tennis court to four pickleball courts at a small park location that previously had three tennis courts. Therefore, Yorba Linda now has two tennis courts and four pickleball courts.

CITY	Do you have any shared, dual-striped courts for tennis, paddle tennis, and/or pickleball
Belmont	Yes. Belmont has 1 dual Tennis/Pickleball court. The Tennis nets can be adjusted to Pickleball height.
Beverly Hills	No.
Fountain Valley	Yes. Fountain Valley has 8 dual striped Tennis/Pickleball courts.
Gardena	Yes. Gardena has 3 dual basketball courts that they use for pickleball with portable nets at Gardena Gymnasium.
Hawthorne	Yes. Hawthorne has 10 dual purpose courts.
Irvine	Yes. Irvine has 9 hybrid Tennis/Pickleball courts. Pickleball users must use the tennis net at hybrid court locations.
Laguna Beach	3 courts are dual-lined however, the dual-lined courts or multi-use are 100% pickleball players.
Long Beach	Yes, Long Beach has 26 dual-striped courts.
Los Angeles	Yes. Los Angeles has 8 hybrid outdoor fee based, 10 indoor hybrid fee based & 23 open play outdoor courts.
Manhattan Beach	Yes. Manhattan Beach has 1 tennis dual purpose with 2 Pickleball courts.
Mission Viejo	Yes. Mission Viejo has 4 tennis courts that are dual stripped for tennis / Pickleball with 2 pickleball courts per tennis court.
Redondo Beach	Yes. Redondo Beach has 5 dual usage Basketball /Pickleball.
San Luis Obispo	Yes. San Luis Obispo has a multi-use tennis court that is striped for 4 courts and a multi-use basketball court that is striped for 3 courts.
Santa Monica	Yes. Santa Monica has 16 pickleballs that are co-located on 4 tennis courts.
Tustin	No.
West Hollywood	Yes. West Hollywood has 11 dual -pickleball courts.
Yorba Linda	Yes. Prior to converting the one tennis court to four pickleball courts, we stripped pickleball overlay lines on two of the three and a half outdoor basketball courts. Each basketball court has two pickleball overlay courts with temporary and moveable nets. We also recently installed a new basketball court that has three pickleball overlay lines and temporary nets.

Fountain Valley	<b>Monday through Friday</b> : 8:00 AM -12:00 PM & 4:00 PM-9:00 PM <b>Saturday &amp; Sunday:</b> 8:00 AM- 6:00 PM
Gardena	Pickleball Hours: Monday and Wednesdays from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM
Hawthorne	Courts are open from 9:00 AM to 9:00 PM
Irvine	Courts are open to the public from dawn until 10 PM daily.
Laguna Beach	All of our courts except one are open from 8 AM to dusk.
Long Beach	It depends on location and if they have lights. Parks that have lights are from Dawn through 10:00 pm. No Light from Dawn to Dusk.
Los Angeles	Open play outdoor courts are on a come first, first served (8:00 AM - 9:00 PM)
Manhattan Beach	Saturday - Sunday 8:00 AM-8:00 PM; Monday - Friday 8:00 AM-9:00 PM  <b>Pickleball Drop-In Play</b> Monday and Friday 6:00 PM - 9:00 PM  Saturday 5:00 PM-8:00 PM

CITY	Do you require a reservation to use a court? If so, do you also charge a fee? If so, how much?
Belmont	Belmont has a reservation system. No charge.
Beverly Hills	Yes, you need reservation. <b>Hourly</b> :\$10 Residents/\$14 Non-residents <b>Annual Fee</b> \$: \$13 Residents/\$24 Non-residents
Fountain Valley	Yes, fees are dependent on times Before 6pm: \$ 12 & After 6pm : \$15
Gardena	Courts are used on a first come, first serve basis
Hawthorne	Courts are used on a first come, first serve basis
Irvine	We do not require or allow for reservations, except for 2 dedicated pickleball courts. We charge \$16/hour for residents and \$18/hour for non-residents. These two courts are always booked with paid reservations.
Laguna Beach	We do not take reservations for our outdoor courts. We do allow reservations for our indoor courts.
Long Beach	Courts are used on a first come, first serve basis
Los Angeles	Hourly Rate Daylight is \$4 is Hourly Rate Night : \$6
Manhattan Beach	Monthly: \$10/senior residents, \$15/residents, \$20/non-residents Daily: \$3/residents, \$4/non-residents
Mission Viejo	We have set times for drop in; Set times for reservations (walk up permitted if we have an empty court). Fees \$10 Res / \$15 Non-Res
Redondo Beach	Courts are available on a first-come, first-served basis with designated times for each sport
San Luis Obispo	Courts are used on a first come, first serve basis. Charge for tournaments.
Santa Monica	Resident Fee: \$3.00/ Non-Resident \$5.00
Tustin	Reservations are only required if you would like to guarantee the court/time. If the court is not reserved, it is available on a first come, first served basis. Current Resident Fee: \$8.00/ Non-Resident \$10.00
West Hollywood	Hourly : \$8.00/ Half Hour :\$4.00
Yorba Linda	Not currently, but we will implement some type of reservation or registration system to utilize the courts from 4-8pm Monday through Thursday.

CITY	Do you have any courts near houses, apartments, and or condos? Do they have different hours from courts that are in more open spaces?
Belmont	They are close to residential area.
Beverly Hills	Yes, one of them is located in Roxbury Park and there is a residential area across the street.
Fountain Valley	Fountain Valley has 2 tennis courts in a neighborhood park that are open to the public with no fees or real enforcement of use
Gardena	Yes they are close to a residential area.
Hawthorne	Unable to provide answer.
Irvine	Currently Irvine does not have any pickleball courts that are within a short distance. They do have two hybrid courts that are 190ish feet from a home. That is the closest they have measured.
Laguna Beach	3 pickleball courts at Lang Park do have set hours. Closed Mon: 8 AM-noon, Tue: 8 AM-Dusk, Wed: 8 AM-noon, Thurs: 8AM-dusk, Fri& Sat 9AM -dusk These courts are approximately 20 feet from condos, and this is why we have limited hours.
Long Beach	Yes, Long Beach has dual courts located near residential areas and they are less than 100 ft away.
Los Angeles	Yes, Palisades Recreation Center is 50 feet away from a residential area.
Manhattan Beach	Yes, they have dedicated courts near residential areas 150 ft away
Mission Viejo	Yes, they are on a residential street, but adjacent to a large busy road. Pickleball isn't louder than traffic.
Redondo Beach	Unable to provide answer.
San Luis Obispo	Yes, the closest resident fence line is 200+ feet away.
Santa Monica	Memorial Park is located on a Commercial area, so noise doesn't affect it, but Ocean View park is next to houses.
Tustin	No
West Hollywood	Yes, Plumber Park is next to a residential area
Yorba Linda	Yes, the closest home to these courts is 160 feet away.

CITY	Have you received noise complaints from residents who live near the courts? If so, did you make any changes to your court rules based on the complaint?
Belmont	No complaints from neighbors about noise or parking impact, and Tennis and Pickleball are equally available.
Beverly Hills	<p>A) Yes. At our La Cienega Tennis Center we originally had installed our courts at the ground level, across the street from residential housing. It wasn't a problem prior to the pandemic but became a major issue as pickleball started to really take off in 2021. We ended up working with the homeowners and agreed to relocate the courts to the 2nd story of the facility, and as far away from the residential area as we could. We did not change any of the rules.</p> <p>B. Before we relocated the courts, we engineered a sound study and worked with a vendor to test the noise levels at various points around the courts due to pickleball – and while it was close, we did learn that the noise levels did on occasion raise beyond an acceptable residential level. We were ready to relocate the courts, but wanted to understand the noise the neighbors were complaining about, was valid.</p>
Fountain Valley	No complaints received so far
Gardena	No complaints received so far
Hawthorne	Staff was unsure.
Irvine	No complaints received so far
Laguna Beach	We have only received noise complaints for our Lang Park location. We have not adjusted the rules but the hours.
Long Beach	Yes. They received multiple complaints due to noise and made the Pickleball players used the furthest courts.
Los Angeles	They received an incredible number of complaints that they had to remove a program (classes ) at Palisades Center.
Manhattan Beach	No complaints received so far
Mission Viejo	No because they did a sound test before they converted courts and asked Neighbors.
Redondo Beach	Staff was unsure.

San Luis Obispo	Not yet. At multi-court locations they have been established with the dedicated times since 2018.
Santa Monica	Yes, they have received complaints from residents, but no actions taken yet. They are working on changing rules and hours of operations
Tustin	No complaints received so far
West Hollywood	Yes, they have received multiple complaints, they contacted Tennacity (contractor over racket sports) to create program for specific hours.
Yorba Linda	Yes, noise complaints were received. Due to those complaints, hours have been adjusted. No rule changes are in place yet.



CITY	Have you installed any noise reduction systems? If yes, Did they work? What product did you install?
Belmont	No system installed.
Beverly Hills	No system installed.
Fountain Valley	No system installed.
Gardena	No system installed.
Hawthorne	No system installed.
Irvine	Irvine has not. However, a local HOA called Woodbridge Village Association did install noise absorbent wind screens surrounding a single tennis court converted to four pickleball courts. As a nearby resident, these work surprisingly well.
Laguna Beach	We have installed roughly 20 Accoustibloc panels along the fence the condos face. After our sound study, the decibel level decreased however, we still get the complaints.
Long Beach	Yes, Sommerset park extremely affected by complaints, so they installed a noise reduction system.
Los Angeles	No system installed.
Manhattan Beach	No system installed.
Mission Viejo	Have not needed to at either location because we prepped the site first.
Redondo Beach	No system installed.
San Luis Obispo	No system installed.
Santa Monica	They have wind screens on Ocean View Park and even though it reduces noise you can still hear it.
Tustin	No system installed.
West Hollywood	They do not have any reduction system. Plumber Park will experience a renovation; they expect reduction of sound system be part of the Master Plan.
Yorba Linda	The Commission approved the installation of Acousti-Blox on the pickleball court fencing. It has yet to be installed.

CITY	Do you have any plans to build/create more pickleball or dual-purpose courts in the near future?
Belmont	No, at this time.
Beverly Hills	Technically in a pickleball “pilot program” – and as a result, they haven’t made any significant changes, or seek additional courts, etc.
Fountain Valley	Absolutely, we are looking at converting more dedicated Pickleball Courts and potentially adding 2/3 tennis courts.
Gardena	No, at this time.
Hawthorne	Staff was unsure
Irvine	Yes. Irvine is close to breaking ground on an 8 court pickleball facility, in addition to potentially adding a large number of courts at the Great Park (20+ courts), within a few years.
Laguna Beach	We are currently trying to find a location to move the 3 courts at Lang Park, however, Laguna is built out, and we don't have open space to construct more courts.
Long Beach	Yes, they are planning to add 8 dedicated courts by the end of next year.
Los Angeles	Yes , they will add 4 hybrid courts at Penmar Recreation Center.
Manhattan Beach	Yes, they are planning in creating more dual-purpose courts, they don’t have a specific amount or date, but they know plans are starting to be created next year.
Mission Viejo	We just added 4 more and are considering a dedicated center. Pickleball in Mission Viejo generates over half a million dollars now just from pickleball.
Redondo Beach	Staff was unsure.
San Luis Obispo	Yes, with two new parks being built within new housing developments. One large 12-acre park is planned with 4-8 dedicated pickleball courts pending final design and noise study (to be determined), as well as 2 tennis and 2 basketball and the other park is 8-acres with planned 4 dedicated pickleball courts, one tennis, one basketball. Both park projects are estimated to be completed within 2-3 years.
Santa Monica	The city has no plans yet, but they work along with Santa Monica community college, and they will open 6 dedicated pk courts in the next month.
Tustin	No, at this time.
West Hollywood	No current plans due to lack of space.
Yorba Linda	Currently there is one additional basketball court that will be built this year and is planned to have three overlay pickleball lines.
