CCMC 7.03.525

§ 7.03.525 UNLAWFUL TO PARK AFTER METER TIME HAS EXPIRED.

No operator of any vehicle shall permit said vehicle to remain parked in any parking space during any time that the meter is showing a signal indicating that such space is illegally in use other than such time necessary for the operator to comply with § 7.03.515.

§ 7.03.515 OPERATIONAL PROCEDURE TO BE FOLLOWED.

Except as otherwise provided in this Subchapter, immediately after occupancy of a metered parking space, the vehicle operator shall pay the required fee for use of the metered parking space in accordance with the directions prescribed by the parking meter adjacent to or assigned to the metered parking space, unless the parking meter indicates an unexpired portion remains of the period of time for which payment previously had been deposited.

Senate Bill No. 1388

CHAPTER 70

An act to amend Section 22508 of, and to add Section 22508.5 to, the Vehicle Code, relating to parking.

[Approved by Governor July 10, 2012. Filed Secretary of State July 10, 2012.]

BILL TEXT

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

SEC. 2.

Section 22508.5 is added to the Vehicle Code, to read:

22508.5.

(a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), a vehicle may park, for up to the posted time limit, in any parking space that is subject to an inoperable parking meter or an inoperable parking payment center.

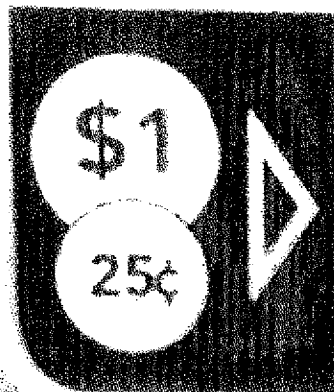
(b) Local authorities may, by ordinance or resolution, prohibit or restrict the parking of vehicles at inoperable parking meters or inoperable parking payment centers. No ordinance or resolution adopted by a local authority pursuant to this section shall become effective until signs or markings giving adequate notice of the restriction or prohibition on parking have been placed at parking locations, parking meters, or parking payment centers.

(c) For purposes of this section:

(1) "Inoperable parking meter" means a meter located next to and designated for an individual parking space, which has become inoperable and cannot accept payment in any form or cannot register that a payment in any form has been made.

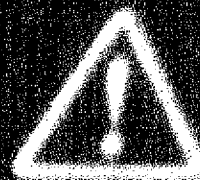
(2) "Inoperable parking payment center" means an electronic parking meter or pay station serving one or more parking spaces that is closest to the space where a person has parked and that cannot accept payment in any form, cannot register that a payment in any form has been made, or cannot issue a receipt that is required to be displayed in a conspicuous location on or in the vehicle.

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ORDINANCE NO. 2012-_____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AMENDING SECTION 7.03.525 OF CHAPTER 7.03 OF TITLE 7 OF THE CULVER CITY MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING PARKING AT EXPIRED OR INOPERABLE METERS

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code section 22508.5 provides that a vehicle may park, for up to the posted time limit, in any parking space that is subject to an inoperable parking meter or inoperable parking payment center, unless the City passes an ordinance or resolution prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles at inoperable parking meters or inoperable parking payment centers; and

WHEREAS, the City of Culver City desires to prohibit the parking of vehicles at inoperable parking meters or inoperable parking payment centers.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY, CALIFORNIA DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Section 7.03.525 of Chapter 7.03 is hereby amended to read as follows (strike-through denotes deletion, underline denotes addition):

\$7.03.525 UNLAWFUL TO PARK AFTER METER TIME HAS EXPIRED OR WHERE METER IS INOPERABLE

(a) No operator of any vehicle shall permit said vehicle to remain parked in any parking space during any time that the meter is showing a signal indicating that the time has expired, ~~such space is illegally in use other than~~ such time necessary for the operator to comply with §7.03.515.

(b) No operator of any vehicle shall park said vehicle in any parking space where there is an inoperable parking meter or that is subject to an inoperable multi-space parking meter or parking payment center.

1 (c) For purposes of this section:

2 (1) "Inoperable parking meter" means a meter located next to and designated
3 for an individual parking space, which has become inoperable and cannot
4 accept payment in any form or cannot register that a payment in any form has
5 been made.

6 (2) "Inoperable multi-space parking meter or parking payment center" means
7 an electronic parking meter or pay station serving one or more parking
8 spaces that is designated for the space where a person has parked and that
9 cannot accept payment in any form, cannot register that a payment in any
10 form has been made, or cannot issue a receipt that is required to be
11 displayed in a conspicuous location on or in the vehicle.

13 **SECTION 2:** Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect
14 any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or
15 liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under
16 any act or Ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 1 of this Ordinance;
17 nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or
18 affected by this Ordinance.

19 **SECTION 3:** Pursuant to Section 619 of the City Charter, this
20 Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption. Pursuant to
21 Section 616 and 621 of the City Charter, prior to the expiration of fifteen (15)
22 days after the adoption, the City Clerk shall cause this Ordinance, or a
23 summary thereof, to be published in the Culver City News and shall post this
24 Ordinance or a summary thereof in at least three (3) places within the City.

25 **SECTION 4:** City Council hereby declares that, if any provision,
26 section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, phrase or word of this Ordinance is
27 rendered or declared invalid or unconstitutional by any final action in a court
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of competent jurisdiction or by reason or any preemptive legislation, then the City Council would have independently adopted the remaining provisions, sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, phrases, or words of this Ordinance, and as such they shall remain in full force and effect.

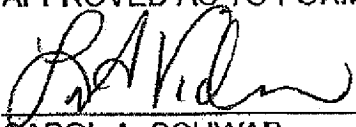
