BACKGROUND

On January 18th, 2025, Firefighter Matthew McCormick and his crew responded to a carbon monoxide alarm at a residential unit on the 3rd floor of an apartment building. Upon arrival, they detected low levels of carbon monoxide but were unable to immediately determine the source of the readings. While many would have considered the situation resolved based on these limited readings, these firefighters exhibited remarkable foresight and professional dedication by deciding to conduct an additional search on the 4th floor.

During their investigation, Firefighter Matthew McCormick and his crew discovered three unconscious victims suffering from severe carbon monoxide poisoning. The environment was already dangerously saturated with the toxic gas, putting the lives of everyone in the building at imminent risk. Despite the lethal conditions, these firefighters demonstrated unparalleled bravery as they carried each victim to safety, ensuring their survival in an atmosphere where the danger was both immediate and life-threatening.
