| Describe the ways your nominee motivates others to serve. | Chitra began planting the seeds of the monthly picnics during the first year of the COVID-19 shutdown and on the heels of the George Floyd murder. Along with several neighbors, Chitra began by organizing "Front Yard Friends"- which was a series of weekly outdoor strolls in which neighbors on a designated block were asked to sit in their front yards. Neighbors from other blocks would come to the designated block for the week during a set time to stroll by the various front yards to meet the residents. The blocks were rotated throughout the summer of 2020 and pr oved to be a powerful way for neighbors to support each other and build community safely during the statewide lockdown. In 2021, when it became safe to gather more widely, Chitra had a vision to create more opportunities for the broader Culver City to engage and build community by simply meeting and talking with each other at monthly picnics. Chitra also strived to make these events intergenerational. Eventually, she was able to enlist a partnership with a teacher and several students from Culver City High. Chitra worked with the youth and trained them on facilitating dialogue circles at the picnics. The youth excelled at this and were even inspired to start a Unity in Diversity Club at CCHS. |
