A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY, CALIFORNIA, (1) RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 2015-R063 (LEVEL 2 WATER SUPPLY SHORTAGE CONDITIONS); AND (2) DECLARING THE EXISTENCE OF LEVEL 1 WATER SUPPLY SHORTAGE CONDITIONS AND IMPLEMENTING MANDATORY CONSERVATION REQUIREMENTS.

WHEREAS, on November 9, 2009, the City Council adopted Chapter 5.03 of the Culver City Municipal Code (CCMC), establishing the Culver City Water Conservation and Water Supply Shortage Program (the "Program"); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Program, the permanent water conservation requirements set forth in CCMC Sections 5.03.030 are effective at all times (collectively, "Permanent Requirements"); and

WHEREAS, the State of California has imposed permanent water regulations (collectively, "State Regulations") for all water users, which prohibit the following:

- 1. Using potable water to irrigate ornamental turf on public street medians;
- 2. Using potable water to irrigate landscapes of new homes & buildings inconsistent with CBSC & DHCD requirements;
- 3. Using outdoor irrigation during and 48 hours following measurable precipitation;
- 4. Using potable water in decorative water features that do not recirculate the water;
- 5. Using hoses with no shutoff nozzles to wash cars;
- 6. Runoff when irrigating with potable water; and
- 7. Using potable water to wash sidewalks and driveways and

WHEREAS, Golden State Water ("GSW") and the Los Angeles
Department of Water and Power "LADWP" have imposed additional water restrictions
for their customers (collectively, "Restrictions"), which have received approval of the

California Water Resources Control Board, which limit outdoor irrigation to a maximum of three days per week; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to CCMC Section 5.03.050, the City Council may, by resolution, declare the existence of Level 1, Level 2 or Level 3 Water Supply Shortage conditions and impose related mandatory conservation requirements; and

WHEREAS, on July 13, 2015 at a duly noticed public meeting, after hearing all testimony and receiving all written comments, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2015-R063, declaring the existence of a Level 2 Water Supply Shortage condition and imposing the related mandatory Level 2 conservation requirements; and

WHEREAS, in response to Executive Order B-37-16 "Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life" signed by Governor Jerry Brown on May 9, 2016 ("Order"); and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2016, at a duly noticed public meeting, after hearing all testimony and receiving all written comments, the City Council: (1) rescinded Resolution No. 2015-R063 (Level 2 Water Supply Shortage conditions); and (2) declared the existence of Level 1 Water Supply Shortage conditions and imposed the related mandatory Level 1 conservation requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE as follows:

- Resolution No. 2015-R063, which declared a Level 2 Water Supply Shortage condition and implemented related mandatory Level 2 conservation requirements, is hereby rescinded.
- 2. Pursuant to CCMC Section 5.03.035.A, the City Council hereby finds that, due to drought and water supply conditions, a water supply shortage exists

and a consumer-demand reduction is necessary to make more efficient use of water and appropriately respond to existing water conditions.

- Pursuant to CCMC Section 5.03.050 and the recitations and findings herein, the City Council hereby declares the existence of Level 1 Water Supply Shortage conditions.
- 4. In addition to the Permanent Requirements, State Regulations, the Order and Restrictions currently in effect, the City Council hereby imposes the additional water conservation requirements set forth in CCMC Sections 5.03.035.B.1 and 5.03.035.B.2 (mandatory Level 1 conservation measures).
- 5. Pursuant to CCMC Section 5.03.050, the new water conservation requirements set forth in Section 4 of this Resolution shall take effect on October 6, 2016.
- 6. Within five days following the adoption of this Resolution, the City Clerk shall cause a copy of this Resolution to be published in a newspaper used for publication of official City notices.
