

MAINTENANCE WORKER I

DEFINITION

Occupants of this entry level classification in the maintenance worker series are in the classified service. The positions assigned to this classification perform routine unskilled manual labor., which does not require previous experience as a Maintenance Worker I to do an effective job. Work is usually performed under immediate supervision. However, work of a routine or repetitive nature may be performed under only general supervision after training. Positions in this classification work in a variety of divisions for the Cityin the Public Works and Parks, Recreation and Community Services Departments.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED

<u>Depending upon assignment, The positions assigned to this classification may receive supervision from a variety of classifications which may include direction from the Maintenance Worker II classification.</u>

, or other position depending upon how the job is scheduled.

ESSENTIAL JOB DUTIES

The following tasks are essential for this position. Incumbents in this classification may not perform all of these tasks, or may perform similar related tasks not listed here.

Positions assigned to the Public Works Department:

- 1. Assists in the installation and repair of sanitary and storm sewer pipe utilizing hand tools such as shovels and power tools such as pavement breakers.
- 1. 2. Assists in repairing asphalt failures by cleaning and filling potholes or cracks with temporary or permanent patches of asphalt using hand tools such as a shovel or rake and power tools such as pavement breakers.
- 2. 3. Assists in sealing cracks in asphalt pavement streets.
- 3. 4. Assists in repairing and replacing concrete sidewalks and curbs including the construction of forms and rodding, tamping and finishing the concrete.
- 4. <u>5. Performs graffiti removal using a variety of equipment such as ladders, pressure washers, paint brushes/rollers, and airless sprayers.</u>
- 5. Assists in the cleanup of fallen tree branches and other tree related emergencies.
- 6. Assists with weed removal in the public right of way including traffic medians, sidewalks, alleyways and bike paths.
- 7. Performs related duties as assigned.

Positions assigned to the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department:

- 1. Assists in turf maintenance in City parks and landscaped areas using lawnmowers, power edgers, and other tools.
- Assists in checking sprinkler heads for proper functioning. Cleans and adjusts heads as necessary. Reports problems to <u>Supervisor</u>. the <u>Senior Irrigation Maintenance Technician</u>.
- 3. 7. Assists in the planting of flowers in planters, medians, and other landscaped areas.
- 4. 8. Assists in controlling the growth of weeds in lawn areas, shrub beds, and flower beds using hand tools and weed eaters.
- 5. 9. Assists in picking up and disposing of trash and debris from roadsides, parks, and other areas.

MINIMUM KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITY

Knowledge of:

- Safety working practices and procedures procedures including personal protective equipment and use of chemicals..pertaining to work.
- Proper use and care of common hand and power tools. such as shovels, pickaxes, and the like.

Skill and Ability to:

- Understand and follow specific verbal and written instructions.
- Operate and learn to operate a variety of power tools.
- Perform heavy and physically demanding work for lengthy and continuous periods of time.
- Get along well with fellow employees. Communicate effectively with the public, fellow employees and supervisors.
- Learn the methods used in performing work tasks accomplished by the maintenance worker classifications.

LICENSE AND CERTIFICATES

Possession of a valid California Class C driver's license.

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

Any combination equivalent to training and experience that could likely provide the required knowledge, skills and abilities would be qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge, skills and abilities would be: some six months experience in the use of common hand and power tools, and performing manual labor for lengthy and continuous periods of time.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS AND WORKING CONDITIONS

- Require the ability to work in and around City parks, streets, medians, sidewalks, alleyways and bike paths.
- Require the mobility to stand, stoop, reach and bend. Require mobility of arms to reach and dexterity of hands to grasp and manipulate small objects.
- Require the ability to stand for long periods.
- Require the ability to walk long distances.
- Perform work which involves the frequent lifting, pushing and/or pulling of objects which may approximate 100 pounds and may occasionally weigh over 100 pounds.
- May be required to work in inclement weather without effective protection from sun, cold and rain.
- May be required to work with harsh and toxic substances.
- May be required to wear protective apparel including goggles, face protectors, aprons, shoes and oxygen breathing apparatus.
- May be required to work within enclosed spaces or at heights above ground level.
- May be required to work around loud noise.
- May be required to work around moving mechanical parts. May be required to work around electrical current.
