
The purpose of this report is to provide the Council and residents a status update on Measure Y revenue activity that occurred in the City. This report captures all Measure Y sales tax collections through the 2017-18 Fiscal Year.

FISCAL YEAR 2018: QUARTER 4 MEASURE Y REVENUE

During the fourth quarter of Fiscal Year 2018, Measure Y sales taxes remained strong with an additional \$2.2 million in revenue generated, which is comparable to collections raised during the same period one year ago. General consumer goods sales comprise the bulk of total transaction sales tax receipts, while construction increased building and markedly over the prior quarter. Fiscal Year 2018 revenues for Measure Y were budgeted at \$9.7 million. Approximately \$9.7 million was collected in total, at 0.2% slightly above budgeted projections.

Cumulatively, a total of \$46.8 million in revenues has been raised since the measure's implementation.

Measure Y funds are budgeted as part of the annual budget approval process by the City Council. Funds received are deposited into the City's General Fund and allocated to sustain general municipal functions.

easure Y is a voter-approved one-half percent transaction and use tax adopted to maintain City of Culver City critical services. With limited exceptions, the transactions and use tax is imposed on the goods and same merchandise as the local sales and use tax. The 10-year measure gained overwhelming approval voter November 2012 and went into effect April 2013 to provide necessary resources to resolve the City's structural deficit issues and continue services existing levels. Measure Y contains a sunset provision, which will result the <u>expiration</u> of the measure on March 31, 2023 if not reauthorized by voters.
