2	A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
3	CULVER CITY, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE CITY'S
4	POLITICAL REFORM ACT, INCORPORATING BY
5	REFERENCE, THE TERMS OF THE FAIR POLITICAL PRACTICES COMMISSION'S MODEL CONFLICT OF
6	INTEREST CODE, AS SET FORTH IN TITLE 2 OF CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS SECTION 18730, AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 2017-R026.
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9	WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act (Government Code §§ 81000, et seq.),
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11	requires every state and local government agency to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of
12	Interest Code; and
13	WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act requires every local government agency to
14	review its Conflict of Interest Code biennially to determine if it is accurate or, alternatively,
15	that the Conflict of Interest Code must be amended; and
16	WHEREAS, it has been determined that the City's current Conflict of Interest
17	Code, as adopted by Resolution No. 2017-R026, needs to be amended due to positions that
18	have been created or eliminated, or a change to a position title; and
19 20	WHEREAS, the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) has adopted a
20	regulation (Title 2 California Code of Regulations § 18730), which may be incorporated by
22	reference, and which may be amended by the FPPC to conform to amendments in the
23	Political Reform Act, after public notice and hearing conducted by the FPPC pursuant to the
24	Administrative Procedure Act, Government Code §§ 11370, et. seq.; and
25	WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that Appendix "A," attached
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27	hereto and incorporated herein, accurately sets forth those designated officials and
28	employees, and their respective categories of reportable financial interests.

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NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City, California, 1 DOES HEREBY RESOLVE as follows: 2

1. The terms of Title 2 California Code of Regulations § 18730, and any amendments thereto, which have been duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC), are hereby incorporated by reference and, together with the attached Appendix "A," which designates City officials and employees and establishes respective financial disclosure categories, shall constitute the City of Culver City Conflict of Interest Code.

2. Future amendments to the terms of Title 2 California Code of Regulations § 18730, which are duly adopted by the FPPC, shall become part of the Culver City Conflict of Interest Code upon the expiration of forty-five (45) days after receipt by the City Council, unless the City Council, by Resolution, decides not to adopt such amendments in whole or in part. The City Council hereby reserves the right not to adopt any provisions not within the jurisdiction of the FPPC pursuant to Government Code § 81000, et seq.

3. Designated employees and elected and appointed officials identified in 17 18 Appendix "A" shall file Statements of Economic Interests (Form 700 Statements) with the City 19 Clerk, to whom the City Council hereby delegates the authority to carry out the duties of filing officer. The Form 700 Statements of designated employees shall be retained as official records by the City Clerk and shall be made available for public inspection and reproduction. in accordance with Government Code § 81008.

4 Pursuant to Government Code §§ 87200 et seg., upon receipt of Form 24 25 700 Statements completed by City Council Members, Planning Commissioners, the City 26 Manager, the City Attorney and the Chief Financial Officer/City Treasurer, the City Clerk shall make and retain a copy and forward the original of these Form 700 Statements to the FPPC.

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GENERAL PROVISIONS

When a designated employee is required to disclose investments and sources of income, he/she need only disclose investments in business entities and sources of income, which do business in the jurisdiction, plan to do business in the jurisdiction or have done business in the jurisdiction, within the past two (2) years. In addition to other activities, a business entity is doing business within the jurisdiction if it owns real property within the jurisdiction. When a designated employee is required to disclose interest in real property, he/she need only disclose real property, which is located in whole or in part within not more than two (2) miles outside the boundaries of the jurisdiction or within (2) miles of any land owned or used by the local government agency.

Designated employees shall disclose their financial interests pursuant to the appropriate disclosure category designated for each position.
