
The purpose of this report is to provide the Council and residents a status update on Measure Y revenue activity that occurred in the City. This report captures Measure Y sales tax collections through the second quarter of the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year.



## FISCAL YEAR 2019: **QUARTER 2 MEASURE Y REVENUE**

Second quarter Measure Y collections added \$2.7 million to City revenue. Yearto-date Measure Y revenue tracked \$0.4 million, over seven percent higher than collections in the prior year. Through the first half of the fiscal year, Measure Y sales tax collections totaled \$5.3 million, or 54.8 percent of total budgeted Measure Y revenue.

General Consumer Goods, the largest source of transaction sales tax receipts, increased modestly by 0.3 percent over the prior holiday sales period. Gains in

Building & Construction also attributed to exceeding prior year receipts, when adjusted for accounting issues.

Cumulatively, a total of \$52.2 million in revenues has been raised since the measure's implementation.

Measure Y funds are budgeted as part of the annual budget approval process by the City Council. Funds received are deposited into the City's General Fund and allocated to sustain general municipal functions.

Measure Y Sales Tax Status Report XX:

easure Y is a voter-approved one-half percent transaction and use tax adopted to maintain City of Culver City critical services. With limited exceptions, the transactions and use tax is imposed on the goods and same merchandise as the local sales and use tax. The 10-year measure gained overwhelming voter approval November 2012 and went into effect April 2013 to provide necessary resources to resolve the City's structural deficit issues and continue services existing levels. Measure Y contains a sunset provision, which will result the expiration of the measure on March 31, 2023 if not reauthorized by voters.
