## ORDINANCE NO. 2019-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AMENDING CULVER CITY MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 3.02.010, "CITY MANAGER," OF CHAPTER 3.02, AND CHAPTER 3.03, PERTAINING TO CITY COMMISSIONS AND AGENCIES, CREATING AN EQUITY AND HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION AND DISCONTINUING THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, the City of Culver City ("City") first created a Human Relations Commission in 1969, which in 1978 was merged with the Parks and Recreation Commission to form the Human Services and Parks Commission (now "Parks, Recreation and Community Services (PRCS) Commission"). The PRCS Commission retained oversight related to human relations activities, in addition to its other responsibilities pertaining to public recreation, parks, recreation/community center facilities, open space and tree programs; and

WHEREAS, on November 12, 2018, the City Council received a request from a Culver City community work group ("Work Group") to consider forming a stand-alone Human Relations Committee to encourage and improve intergroup relations; and

WHEREAS, on January 28, 2019, the City Council discussed the concept of forming a Human Relations Commission and directed the City Council Ad Hoc Equity Subcommittee ("Subcommittee") to further explore the creation of such commission, including the potential resources that would be needed; and

WHEREAS, City staff and the Subcommittee conducted a thorough research and study of other Southern California Human Relations Commissions' duties and responsibilities in light of the Work Group's proposal; reviewed and evaluated the duties and responsibilities of current City commissions, committees and boards, to avoid duplication of efforts, thereby ensuring that staff and fiscal resources are utilized efficiently; and analyzed whether these other bodies remain relevant and necessary to City governance; and

**WHEREAS**, the City is committed to improving intergroup relations regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, gender, age, disability or immigration status; and

WHEREAS, the City promotes and celebrates diversity and inclusion in all its programs and services available to all City residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, the Subcommittee recommends that the City Council approve the creation of an Equity and Human Relations Commission to be operative effective July 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Subcommittee further recommends that the City Council discontinue the Civil Service Commission effective June 30, 2020, and reassign to the City Manager or his/her designee the responsibility for the supervision and administration of all City departments; thereby, avoiding duplicative efforts, and decreasing fiscal costs and staff resources associated with disciplinary appeals and grievances by contracting with third party hearing officers.

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City, California, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Section 3.02.010 of Chapter 3.02 of the Culver City Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows (<u>underline</u> denotes addition, <u>strikethrough</u> denotes deletion):

## § 3.02.010 CITY MANAGER.

- A. Appointment; compensation.
- 1. The City Manager shall be appointed by the City Council solely on the basis of his executive and administrative qualifications and ability to serve in the unclassified service under the supervision of the City Council.
- 2. The City Manager shall receive such compensation as the City Council shall from time to time determine and fix by resolution.
- B. *Duties and powers*. The City Manager shall have the following duties and powers:
- 1. Recommendations to City Council. To conduct studies and to make recommendations to the City Council concerning all functions of City government following analysis thereof; to recommend ordinances for adoption by the City Council, subject to the prior approval of the City Attorney as to the form thereof;

15	There shall be a Civil Service Commission, Cultural Affairs Commission,

	appointed by the City Council, with the exception of the Equity and Human Relations  Commission, which shall consist of nine (9) members. Commissioners shall be residents of
18	the City who are lawfully registered voters of the City, none of whom shall hold any paid
19	office or employment in the City Government. Applicants for appointment to any Commission seat must have been lawfully registered voters of the City for the thirty (30)
20	days immediately preceding the filing of their application. Minors, age 16 or older, are
21	eligible to apply with parental consent. No person may serve on more than one (1)
	Commission at the same time. Compensation of Commissioners, if any, may be established by resolution of the City Council.
