### ORDINANCE NO. 2020-\_\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CULVER CITY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AMENDING CULVER CITY MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 3.03, PERTAINING TO CITY COMMISSIONS AND AGENCIES TO ADD EQUITY POLICY LANGUAGE, AND TO ALLOW APPOINTMENT OF NON-REGISTERED VOTERS AND MINORS AGE 16 AND OLDER.

WHEREAS, on January 28, 2019, the City Council directed the City Council Ad Hoc Equity Subcommittee ("Subcommittee") to review and evaluate the duties and responsibilities of current City commissions, committees and boards, to avoid duplication of efforts, thereby ensuring that staff and fiscal resources are utilized efficiently; and analyze whether these other bodies remain relevant and necessary to City governance; and

WHEREAS, the City is committed to improving intergroup relations regardless of race, religion, gender, gender identity, sex, sexual orientation, age, disability, immigration status, citizenship, color, ethnicity, or national origin, ancestry, gender, gender identity, gender expression, socioeconomic status, income or other protected categories or personal characteristics; and

WHEREAS, the City promotes and celebrates diversity and inclusion in all its programs and services available to all City residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, the City Council Ad Hoc Equity Subcommittee ("Subcommittee") has recommended the City Council adopt a resolution forming an Equity and Human Relations Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, after review of the current City Commissions, the Subcommittee further recommends that the City Council amend the Culver City Municipal Code (CCMC) to include equity and inclusiveness language as it pertains to all Commissions, and to modify the duties of some of the Commissions to avoid overlap with the proposed Equity and Human Relations Advisory Committee.

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City, California,

DOES HEREBY ORDAIN as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The General Provisions subchapter of the Table of Contents of Chapter 3.03 "Commissions and Agencies" of the Culver City Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows: (underline denotes addition, strikethrough denotes deletion):

#### **General Provisions**

3.03.005	Creation; composition; eligibility; compensation
3.03.010	Terms of members
3.03.015	Term limits
3.03.020	Removal; forfeiture of membership
3.03.025	Meetings; meeting place; quorum; minutes
3.03.030	Compliance with applicable laws
3.03.035	City Council retains jurisdiction

**SECTION 2:** The following Sections of Subchapter 3.03.000, General Provisions, of Chapter 3.03 of the Culver City Municipal Code are hereby amended or added (<u>underline denotes addition</u>, strikethrough denotes deletion):

## § 3.03.005 CREATION; COMPOSITION; ELIGIBILITY; COMPENSATION.

There shall be a Civil Service Commission, Cultural Affairs Commission, Parks, Recreation, and Community Services Commission, and Planning Commission, each consisting of five (5) members to be appointed by the City Council. Commissioners shall be residents of the City-who are lawfully registered voters of the City, none of whom shall hold any paid office or employment in the City Government. Applicants for appointment to any Commission seat must have been lawfully registered voters of the City for the thirty (30) days immediately preceding the filing of their application. Minors, age 16 or older, are eligible to apply with parental or legal guardian consent. No person may serve on more than one (1) Commission at the same time. Compensation of Commissioners, if any, may be established by resolution of the City Council.

#### § 3.03.040 POLICY.

It shall be the policy of the City Council that each Commission shall ensure that its programs, policies and activities provide equal access and opportunities to all persons.

**SECTION 3:** Subchapter 3.03.200, Cultural Affairs Commission, of Chapter 3.03 of the Culver City Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows (<u>underline</u> denotes addition, <u>strikethrough</u> denotes deletion):

#### **CULTURAL AFFAIRS COMMISSION**

#### § 3.03.200 POWERS AND DUTIES.

The Cultural Affairs Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

- A. Act in an advisory capacity to the City Council on matters pertaining to the enrichment of the community through fine arts, visual arts, performing arts, arts education, historic preservation and cultural issues;
- B. Serve as an advocate for <u>equity, diversity and inclusion in fer cultural</u> activities and programs within the City;
- C. Implement the City's Public Art Program, and encourage the integration of cultural affairs into the social and economic fabric of the City to improve the quality of life for City residents; and
- D. Perform such other duties, not inconsistent with the City Charter or this Code, as maybe prescribed by ordinance, resolution, City Council policy or other City Council action.

**SECTION 4:** Subchapter 3.03.300, Parks, Recreation and Community Services Commission, of Chapter 3.03 of the Culver City Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows (<u>underline</u> denotes addition, <u>strikethrough</u> denotes deletion):

# PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMISSION § 3.03.300 POWERS AND DUTIES.

The Parks, Recreation, and Community Services Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

- A. Act in an advisory capacity to the City Council and City Manager on matters pertaining to public recreation, parks, recreation/community center facilities, open space and tree programs, where such trees are located in parks and open space, playgrounds, and music and entertainment as may from time to time be performed in the City's parks:
- B. At the direction of the City Council or the City Manager, assist staff assigned to review the requirements of the City for facilities relating to the functions set forth in division A., and to make recommendations related to the adoption and updating of City master plans relating to parks, recreation, and open space;

1	C. At the direction of the City Council or the City Manager, recommend
2	programs and plans designed to promote the full acceptance of all citizens in all aspects of community life, without regard to race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, age or national
	origin.
3	<u>DC.</u> At the direction of the City Council or the City Manager, recommend and support program policies relating to various community service functions of the City,
4	including, but not limited to, programs for youth, teens, seniors, and people with special
5	needs;
6	program and project recommendations by applying realistic expectations of budgetary and staffing resources, environmental sustainability, neighborhood compatibility, and other
7	relevant factors; and FE. Perform such other duties, not inconsistent with the City Charter or this
8	Code, as may be prescribed by ordinance, resolution, City Council policy or other City
9	Council action.
10	SECTION 5: The City Council hereby declares that, if any provision, section,
11	subsection, paragraph, sentence, phrase or word of this Ordinance is rendered or declared
12	invalid or unconstitutional by any final action in a court of competent jurisdiction or by
13	reason or any preemptive legislation, then the City Council would have independently
14	adopted the remaining provisions, sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, phrases,
15	or words of this Ordinance, and as such they shall remain in full force and effect.
16	SECTION 6: Pursuant to Section 619 of the City Charter, this Ordinance shall
17	take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption. Pursuant to Section 616 and 621 of the City
18	Charter, prior to the expiration of fifteen (15) days after the adoption, the City Clerk shall
19	cause this Ordinance, or a summary thereof, to be published in the Culver City News and
20	shall post this Ordinance or a summary thereof in at least three places within the City.
