

GPAC Meeting #13

Dear GPAC Members,

On Thursday, February 11, 2021, from 7 – 9 PM, the City of Culver City will hold its 13th GPAC meeting. At this meeting, we will focus on parks, recreation, and open space.

The purposes for the meeting include the following:

- Provide an overview of the **GPAC process** to date.
- Provide a summary of the first round of **Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meetings**, held in December 2020.
- Provide a quick overview of parks, recreation, and open spaces in Culver City.
- Discuss main issues and opportunities related to parks, recreation, and open spaces facing Culver City through 2045.
- **Brainstorm** on issues, vision, goals, and strategies related to the above topics that can be included in the General Plan.

The memo provides background information and poses some questions for you to consider before the meeting.

Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Overview

Parks, recreation, and open spaces are critical for improving health and wellbeing, beautifying communities, connecting people to nature, and providing opportunities for social interaction. The benefits of convenient access to public outdoor space, especially in an urban setting, have become increasingly apparent during the COVID-19 pandemic. As Culver City grows and changes through the 2045 General Plan horizon, we are confronted with the challenging task of identifying creative solutions to ensure residents, employees, and visitors have equitable access to high-quality parks, recreational facilities, and open spaces. The City also faces the challenge of offering recreational programming—such as preschools, senior services, and youth activities—that meet the needs of the community. Parks, recreation, and open space also intersect with other General Plan elements and topics, including arts, public safety, and sustainability.

The General Plan needs to address several issues and opportunities, as documented in the <u>Parks, Public Facilities</u>, and <u>Public Services Existing Conditions Report</u> and <u>summary</u> <u>video</u>. However, some challenges to improving the parks, recreation, and open space system include limited funding for programming and capital improvements, limited availability of developable land, and others.

The input GPAC Members provide during the meeting's discussion will help direct GPU team on potential General Plan policies related to parks, recreation, and open spaces. The team from Raimi + Associates will lead a discussion based on findings derived from existing conditions analyses, conversations with City staff, and results from community engagement to date.

- What types of **amenities** (e.g. dog parks, lighting, meeting rooms) do you anticipate will be most needed in the City's parks and recreational system throughout the 2045 General Plan horizon?
- What types of **programming** (e.g. preschools, senior services) do you anticipate will be most needed in the City's parks and recreational system throughout the 2045 General Plan horizon?
- What actions should the General Plan prioritize to **improve amenities and programming?**
- What types of **partnerships** should the City prioritize in the General Plan vision, goals, and strategies to support equitable access to the benefits of these, amenities, and programming?
