Item A-1

Approval of Measure CC and C Sales Tax Status Reports for Transmittal to City Council

Punit Chokshi, Senior Management Analyst, provided a summary of the material of record for the Measure CC sales tax status report.

Discussion ensued between staff and Committee Members regarding comparisons with the previous year; projected improvements over the next few quarters; new businesses coming into the City; budget estimates for sales tax; Amazon fulfillment; online sales; changes to the agreement; cities with distribution centers; changes to the Amazon business model; Transaction Use Tax (TUT) vs. sales tax; the decision to be made by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA); the Bradley-Burns portion of the tax; reporting lag time; estimates; and true-up payments.

Punit Chokshi, Senior Management Analyst, provided a summary of the material of record for Measure C sales tax status report.

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Item A-2

Discussion Regarding FAC Recommendations to the City Council for the Fiscal Year 2021/2022

Onyx Jones, Chief Finance Officer, clarified that this was the opportunity for the Committee to bring up anything that they want to see considered for the budget.

Discussion ensued between staff and Committee Members regarding the opportunity for additional discussion at the March meeting; identifying revenue sources; accountability; budget allocation or reallocations; return on investment; ways to optimize revenue without taking it out of businesses or residents; and consideration by the Fact Finding Subcommittee.

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Item A-3

Receive an Update on the Culver City Economic Recovery Task Force

Member Lachoff reported that the meeting of the Economic Recovery Task Force had been postponed and that he would provide a report at the next FAC meeting; noted that the Economic Development Subcommittee was considering reconfiguring the Commercial Tenant Eviction Moratorium; discussed the Buy Culver Promotions; and creation of a Spring/Summer Awakening Campaign as people are able to move about more freely to increase business activity.

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Item A-4

Receive Reports from Current Subcommittees

Vice Chair Menthe reported that the Bylaws Subcommittee would be bringing proposed language forward at the next meeting.

Chair Lachman reported on the Awards Subcommittee noting that they were awaiting information from the Civil Service Commission.

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Item A-5

Discussion of March Agenda

Chair Lachman reported that Member Lachoff had provided valuable information to the City Council at their last meeting; discussed City Council consideration of an extended stay hotel in Culver City; Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) taxes; and direction from the City Council that the FAC consider options for a new classification of zoning, impacts of losses of hotel revenue and how revenue could be offset.

Discussion ensued between staff and Committee Members regarding adding the task from the City Council to the work plan; investigation of the issue by the Deputy City Attorney; a suggestion to look at other means of collecting the revenue; franchise or in lieu fees; the budget; zoning; value capture; linkage fees; and informational presentations to the FAC.
