I will be presenting to Amanake (Nake) Vaea, the Public Works Department/ Engineering Division, Employee of the Year award. Amanake's position is Senior Public Works Inspector and he has worked for the Public Works Department/Engineering Division since 2017. He has demonstrated over the course of this calendar year the successful inspection of multiple complex development projects such as Ivy Station, Apple site, 8888 Washington Bl., and Culver Studios.
