

1 RESOLUTION NO. 2021-R_____

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3 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
4 CULVER CITY, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING
5 APPLICATION(S) FOR PROPOSITION 68 PER CAPITA
6 GRANT FUNDS.

7 WHEREAS, the State Department of Parks and Recreation has been
8 delegated the responsibility by the Legislature of the State of California for the
9 administration of the Per Capita Grant Program, setting up necessary procedures
10 governing application(s); and

11 WHEREAS, said procedures established by the State Department of Parks
12 and Recreation require the grantee's governing body to certify by resolution the approval of
13 project application(s) before submission of said applications to the State; and

14 WHEREAS, the grantee will enter into a contract(s) with the State of
15 California to complete project(s).

16 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Culver City DOES
17 HEREBY RESOLVE as follows:

18 1. Approves the filing of project application(s) by the City of Culver City
19 ("Grantee") for Per Capita program grant project(s); and

20 2. Certifies that Grantee has or will have available, prior to
21 commencement of project work utilizing Per Capita funding, sufficient funds to complete the
22 project(s); and

23 3. Certifies that Grantee has or will have sufficient funds to operate and
24 maintain the project(s); and

25 4. Certifies that all projects proposed will be consistent with the park and
26 recreation element of the City of Culver City general or recreation plan [Public Resources
27 Code (PRC) §80063(a)]; and
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1 5. Certifies that these funds will be used to supplement, not supplant,
2 local revenues in existence as of June 5, 2018 (PRC §80062(d)); and

3 6. Certifies that Grantee will comply with the provisions of §1771.5 of the
4 State Labor Code, and

5 7. To the extent practicable, as identified in the “Presidential
6 Memorandum--Promoting Diversity and Inclusion in Our National Parks, National Forests,
7 and Other Public Lands and Waters,” dated January 12, 2017, the City of Culver City will
8 consider a range of actions that include, but are not limited to, the following (PRC
9 §80001(b)(8)(A-G)):

10 (A) Conducting active outreach to diverse populations, particularly
11 minority, low- income, and disabled populations and tribal communities, to
12 increase awareness within those communities and the public generally about
13 specific programs and opportunities.

14 (B) Mentoring new environmental, outdoor recreation, and
15 conservation leaders to increase diverse representation across these areas.

16 (C) Creating new partnerships with state, local, tribal, private, and
17 nonprofit organizations to expand access for diverse populations.

18 (D) Identifying and implementing improvements to existing
19 programs to increase visitation and access by diverse populations,
20 particularly minority, low-income, and disabled populations and tribal
21 communities.

22 (E) Expanding the use of multilingual and culturally appropriate
23 materials in public communications and educational strategies, including
24 through social media strategies, as appropriate, that target diverse
25 populations.

26 (F) Developing or expanding coordinated efforts to promote youth
27 engagement and empowerment, including fostering new partnerships with
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diversity-serving and youth-serving organizations, urban areas, and programs.

(G) Identifying possible staff liaisons to diverse populations.

8. Agrees that to the extent practicable, the project(s) will provide workforce education and training, contractor and job opportunities for disadvantaged communities (PRC §80001(b)(5)).

9. Certifies that Grantee shall not reduce the amount of funding otherwise available to be spent on parks or other projects eligible for funds under this division in its jurisdiction. A one-time allocation of other funding that has been expended for parks or other projects, but which is not available on an ongoing basis, shall not be considered when calculating a recipient’s annual expenditures. (PRC §80062(d)).

10. Certifies that Grantee has reviewed, understands, and agrees to the General Provisions contained in the contract shown in the Procedural Guide.


11. Delegates the authority to the City Manager of the City of Culver City, or designee, to conduct all negotiations, sign and submit all documents, including, but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, and payment requests, which may be necessary for the completion of the grant scope(s).

12. Agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and guidelines.
