

Virtual Community Meeting to Discuss a Temporary Redesign Proposed for the Intersection of Ince Boulevard and Lucerne Avenue.

WHAT:

The Public Works Department received community concerns reported with regards to operational and safety conditions at the intersection of Lucerne Avenue/Ince Boulevard especially regarding pedestrians crossing of the wide northerly intersection leg on Lucerne Avenue. In response, the Mobility and Traffic Engineering Division would like to present in this meeting a proposed concept for a temporary redesign of the intersection.

The temporary redesign can be implemented in a timely manner, and will seek to demonstrate temporary improvements that enhance traffic safety and operational conditions. Changes are mainly focused at the northwesterly corner to better align the intersection and provide additional refuge for pedestrians crossing. The demonstration period will give us the opportunity to assess the temporary redesign and obtain additional community input, which in turn will serve to improve the concept demonstrated and reflected in the future final design and construction.

To create the temporary concept redesign that will be in place during the demonstration period, the City proposes to use pavement markings, signs, and temporary traffic control devices such as delineators. The concept temporary redesign is expected to enhance safety conditions of pedestrians and all users of the intersection.

You are invited to a virtual meeting to learn about the temporary concept redesign, timeline, provide feedback on the proposed concept, and ask questions prior to the temporary implementation. Your input is desired, welcomed, and will inform the temporary concept intersection redesign. Additionally, your continued input during the demonstration period will help inform the final design and subsequent construction of the redesigned intersection.
