Item A-1

Receive an Update on the Culver City Economic Recovery Task Force

Member Jones reported on the Economic Recovery Task Force meeting on May 5 where discussion included the planned lifting of restrictions on June 15; Hero Pay for Health Care Workers; parklet guidelines; extending Temporary Use Permits (TUPs) to allow businesses the ability to make up revenue for when they were forced to close; MOVE Culver City; retention, recovery, resilience; increased traffic; and summer activations to attract business back to the City.

Chair Lachman discussed a meeting with Creative Economy businesses and several members of the ERTF to discuss support of Creative Economy jobs during the recovery.

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Item A-2

(1) Create an Ad Hoc Subcommittee for the Work Plan Item Transmitted from City Council Regarding the Financial Impacts of the Recently Established "Extended Stay Hotel" as a Category of Hotel/Motel Land; and (2) Appoint Members to Such Ad Hoc Subcommittee

Chair Lachman introduced the item.

Discussion ensued between staff and Committee Members regarding goals in establishing the ad hoc subcommittee; the need for City Attorney review of the permissibility associated with establishing such fees; coordination in the outcome of the review; the timeline; the origin of the conversation; corporate housing; hotels in the City that have agreements for extended stays; the modification for airlines; Transient Occupancy Taxes (TOT); state guidelines; recapturing revenue; clarification that stays over 30 days are not charged TOT and a refund is required if the taxes were charged; and finding ways to offset lost revenue for hotels that seek to engage in corporate housing.
