Minutes of the February 16, 2021 CC-WLAC Liaison Committee Meeting

MOVED BY MEMBER LIMBAUGH, SECONDED BY MEMBER O'BRIEN AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, THAT THE CITY OF CULVER CITY/WEST LOS ANGELES COLLEGE LIAISON COMMITTEE APPROVE MINUTES FOR THE MEETING OF FEBRUARY 16, 2021 (ABSENT MEMBER LONG-COFFEE).

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Action Items

Item A-1

Selection of Presiding Officer

Jeremy Bocchino, City Clerk, noted that past practice has been to have a Council Member serve as Presiding Officer and she discussed responsibilities.

Discussion ensued between staff and Committee Members resulted in agreement that Member Puza serve as Presiding Officer.

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Item A-2

Update and Discussion of the 10100 Jefferson West LA College Construction Project

James Limbaugh, Ph.D., President, WLAC, provided an update on the 10100 Jefferson West LA College Construction Project; discussed the selection process for the developer; the filing and withdrawal of a complaint by Hackman Capital; negotiations between the Community College District and the developer, Hudson; jurisdiction of the land; project concept; county and City jurisdiction; work with the City; and the neighbors.

Discussion ensued between staff and Committee Members regarding retail and restaurant; easements; the soundstages; tenanting; the food desert; prop management; the Creativity Studies Lab; and use of facilities.

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Item A-3

Update on Jefferson/La Cienega Building Construction

James Limbaugh, Ph.D., President, WLAC, indicated that the Jefferson/La Cienega building construction was not under their jurisdiction.

Jeremy Bocchino, City Clerk, indicated that the item had been on the agenda two years ago.

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Item A-4

Discussion of Food Insecurity Partnership

James Limbaugh, Ph.D., President, WLAC, discussed initial conversations about the Food Insecurity Partnership; the basic needs program; temporary housing; renovation and new building projects; sponsorship by the WLAC foundation; the partnership with the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank; the percentage of students connectivity; who students still online; student recruitment; housing; supporting their families; increased dual enrollment with Culver City High School; challenges; fundamental differences in post-pandemic college; and identification of programs that provide a market advantage.

Discussion ensued between staff and Committee Members regarding online students; Project Homekey; ways to collaborate to assist unhoused students; the agreement with the Regional Food Bank; career training; encouraging people to attend WLAC rather than Santa Monica College; changing attitudes; student housing; proximity to the Oil Field; clarification on who housing would be provided for; the inability to provide subsidized housing; allowing for a competitive edge; the need to provide student services; private funding; county land; county funding; opinionated neighbors; and previous discussion of efforts to raise money to procure more food, discussions between Amazon

and WLAC to enhance community partnerships, training for belowthe-line workers, and partnerships with trade unions.

James Limbaugh, Ph.D., President, WLAC, discussed things that achievements; last meeting; since the happened demographics; workforce development; rigor of the programs; internships; collaboration with the trade unions; recognition of the importance of the programs by other institutions; application of course credits to other schools; obligation to help students; money put into community colleges; the effects of climate change on marginalized communities; helping educate communities about climate change; California Center for Climate Change Education; support from the state to make WLAC a national change education; bringing together climate representatives from the community colleges; and transformation of the campus.

Discussion ensued between staff and Committee Members regarding agreement to send invitations to Council Members to an upcoming event; academic development for the climate change program; location of WLAC; employees who are interested in getting the program beyond certification; interest in students; plans for new facilities; costs for improvements; sustainable elements to the projects; amenities; landscaping; design of the building with students in mind; ease of flow; taking future needs into consideration; providing the feel of a rural, wooded campus; being welcoming to the community; age of the buildings being torn down; clarification that parking lots were surface level; students who are getting tired of taking online classes; students who travel to the school from all over Los Angeles; unknowns with regard to the future; use of swing space in preparation for construction; appreciation for the passage of county measures that funded infrastructure upgrades; the growing dental program; use of sustainable modular buildings; the pandemic; and encouragement to attend the fireworks on the $4^{\rm th}$ of July and the Car Show hosted by WLAC.

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Items from Members

Discussion ensued between staff and Committee Members regarding pathways for students to be employed by Hudson through internship programs for students; the Circulator; finding a more direct route for students to get from the Metro to campus;

ridership levels; the need to align service hours with class hours; on demand service; and renewal of the Sheriff's contract.

Jeremy Bocchino, City Clerk reported that no requests to speak had been received.
