2022 Summer Camps ran from June 13 through August 12 (9 weeks).

J4K Day Camp- Veteran's Memorial Park

- o 100 participants a week
- Each week was themed
 - Examples include "Welcome to Hollywood", "Animal Kingdom", "Imagination Exploration", and "Superhero" along with others
- Partnered with the Culver City Pool for swimming on Tuesdays for 1hour and 30 minutes

J4K Sports Camp- Lindberg Park

- o 60 participants a week
- Each week was themed
 - Learned the basics and competed in tournaments of "Flag Football", "Basketball", "Soccer", "Volleyball", "Camp Games" and more
- Partnered with the Culver City Pool for swimming on Fridays for 1 hour and 30 minutes

J4K Jr. Camp- El Marino Park

- o 30 participants a week
- Each week was themed
 - Examples include "Pirate Adventure", "Out of this World", "Very Hungry Caterpillar", and "Colors of the Rainbow" along with others
- Camp staff ranged from brand new, to have worked in a camp setting for several years
 - Majority of staff were new or had one year of Summer Camp experience
- Positive feedback from parents regarding 2022 wrap-up video
 - $_{\odot}$ "Thank you! My child had a lot of fun and was looking forward to going into camp every day!"
 - "This is so cool! So sad that Dylan and Ryan didn't get to finish out the summer. See you next year!"
 - "Great video Jake and Team and thank you for a wonderful summer with Hiroshi!"
