RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Parks, Recreation and Community Services (PRCS) Commission (1) adopt motions appointing Commissioners as liaisons to various outside Associations and City Committees; (2) [if desired] consider formation/dissolution of certain PRCS Commission Ad Hoc Subcommittees, including the formation of the "Commissioner Summit" Ad Hoc Subcommittee; and, (3) [if desired] adopt motions appointing Commissioners to the newly formed/remaining ad hoc subcommittees.

BACKGROUND

At the first regular meeting in July, the PRCS Commission traditionally appoints Members to represent the Commission on various outside Associations and on City Committees. These appointments are presented this evening for the Commission's consideration.

Over the past several years, as the Commission has considered its appointments to PRCS Commission Ad Hoc Subcommittees, it has been mindful of the requirements of the Ralph M. Brown Act (Brown Act) and the important differences between a "Standing Committee" and an "Ad Hoc Subcommittee." In summary, Standing Committees are required to comply with the provisions of the Brown Act (including public notification and public participation).

Ad Hoc Subcommittees are not subject to those requirements. As provided for in the Brown Act, a standing committee has a continuing subject matter jurisdiction or a meeting schedule fixed by charter, ordinance, resolution, or formal action of a legislative body. Whereas, in general an "ad hoc" subcommittee serves only a limited or single purpose, it is not perpetual and is dissolved when the specific task is completed.
