### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council consider adoption of a resolution to support state legislation to end child marriage (Attachment 1).

### BACKGROUND/ DISCUSSION

On April 19, 2021, the City Council directed staff to bring back a Resolution in support of ending Child Marriage, based on, and adapted from the sample resolution provided by California Coalition to End Child Marriage. The adoption of the Resolution adopts the recitals in the Resolution and states the following actions:

1. The City Council hereby calls on the California State Legislature to introduce and pass legislation to "End Child Marriage Under 18, No Exceptions"; and
2. The City Council hereby calls upon other California municipalities to consider adopting resolutions showing their commitment to end Child Marriage; and
3. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager and authorized city staff to announce
